Early voting begins May 2 in Bronte School Board election

Early voting for the May 14 local entities elections will begin Monday, May 2, and continue through Tuesday, May 10, 2011.

Only the Bronte Independent School District actually has to hold the election. The other local entities had no contested races and therefore ordered their elections cancelled.

There are two three-year Board of Trustee terms on the ballot for the Bronte Independent School District. Currently, these offices are held by Paul Williams and David McWright. Mr. Williams and Mr. McWright have filed for re-election. T. J. McCullough, Ray Barnett and Andra Arrott have also filed for places on the ballot.

Robert Lee Independent School District has cancelled their election because there are no opposed races. There were two three-year Board of Trustee terms and one unexpired two-year term available. Jeffie Roberts and Irma Torres filed for re-election and Tracy Allen filed for the unexpired term.

Bronte City Council has also cancelled its election. There were two two-year city council member terms available. Currently, these offices are held by Misty Bedford and Paula McWright who have

both filed for re-election.

There were three two-year city council member terms available for the City of Robert Lee. These offices are held by Janie Munoz, Gary Payne and Troy Wimberly. Janie Munoz filed for re-election and Jeanette Meeks and Tommy Roach also filed.

There were two two-year Board of Director terms on the ballot for the West Coke County Hospital District. Currently, these offices are held by Mary Bessent and Dessie Kendall. Both incumbents filed for re-election.

There were two two-year Board of Director terms on the ballot for the East Coke County Hospital District. Currently, these offices are held by Doris Sims and Alonzo Robbins. Both incumbents filed for re-election.

Private Applicator's Pesticide Licensing Training set April 29 in Coke County

Texas AgriLife Extension Service of Coke County will be holding a Private Pesticide Applicator's License training on Friday April 29, 2011, at 1 pm. The training will be held at the Rec Hall of the county show barn in Robert Lee. There will be a \$50 per person fee for the training.

This year's issue honoring the RLHS Class of 2011 will be May 20, with the issue honoring the BHS Class of 2011 set for May 27.

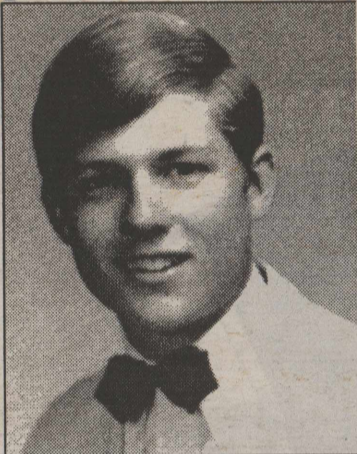

Coke County Relay for Life set for April 29 at RLHS

Coke County walkers go around the clock in the battle against cancer during the American Cancer Society Relay For Life. This celebration of life brings together numerous groups and individuals concerned about cancer in a unified effort to fight back.

Teams of enthusiastic citizens will gather at the Robert Lee track field for an overnight relay from 7:00 pm on April 29th until 7:00 am on April 30th that celebrates anyone who has battled cancer, remembers loved ones lost and empowers all to fight back against the disease.

Relay For Life is a unique fundraising event that allows participants from all walks of life — including patients, medical support staff, corporations, civic organizations, faith-based groups and community volunteers — to join together to fight cancer. "Many of the participants will be people who have been dealt with cancer themselves. 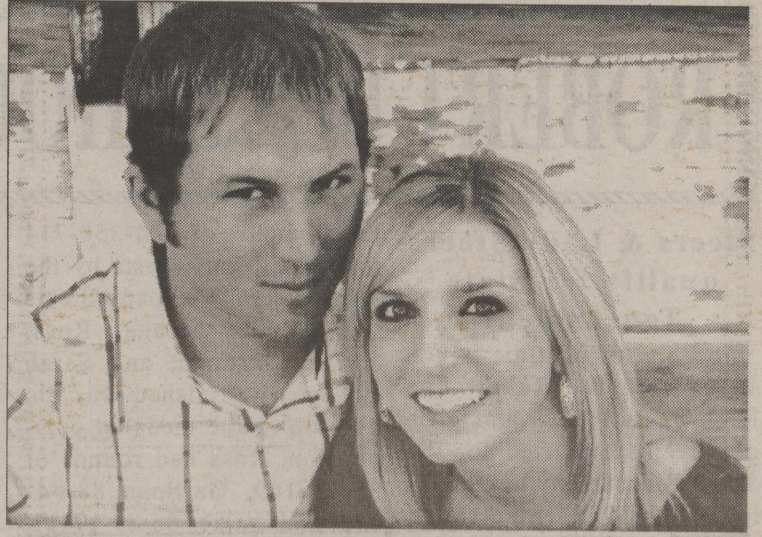

Steers & Lady Steers qualify for State Tournament

For the first time since 1997, both the Robert Lee High School boys and girls golf teams qualified for the State Tournament by finishing 1st and 2nd, respectfully, at the Region II 1-A Tournament held at Shady Oaks Golf Course in Baird Monday and Tuesday, April 18 and 19.

The State Tournament will be held in Austin May 9-10 at Morris Williams Golf Course. The Steers will return as the three-time defending 1-A State Champions. The Lady Steers will be making their first appearance at the State Tourney since 2007, when the team finished 4th.

The Steers won their 4th Regional title in a row, by firing team rounds of 308-304 for a 612 total. The Steers were led by seniors Logan Philley, Haden Dillard, and Josh Tennison. Philley won the medalist competition with rounds of 69-67, 3 under par at the par 70 Shady Oaks course. Dillard finished 4th amongst individuals with rounds of 74-72-146 and Tennison finished with 80-83-163. Dawson Brisbin and Justin Gartman rounded out the Steers scoring with rounds of 85-82-167 and 92-88-180, respectfully. Team (field of 16) results were: 1. Robert Lee 612; 2. Seymour 640; and 3. Olney 643.

The Lady Steers finished second, behind defending state champion Baird, with

team rounds of 364-350-714 total, all season bests by the Lady Steers. The Lady Steers were led by Meagan Ross, Jordan Gartman, and Sarah Walker who finished 4th, 5th, and 6th in the medalist competition. Ross had rounds of 85-84-169, Gartman 88-84-172, and Walker 86-89-174. It was all three ladies' best rounds of the season. To round out the Lady Steers scoring were Mandy Mendoza's 105-93-198 and Kacee Roberts 107-111-218. Team results (field of 16): 1. Baird 672; 2. Robert Lee 714; and 3. Garden City 768.

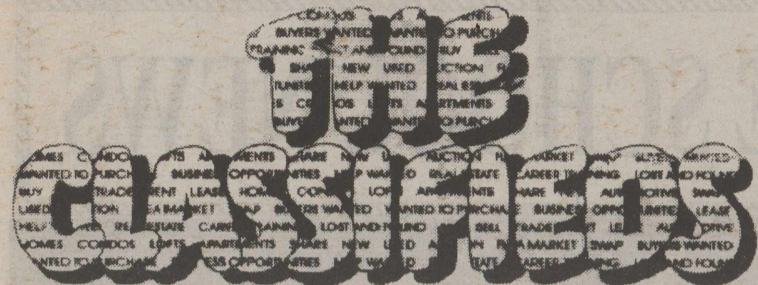

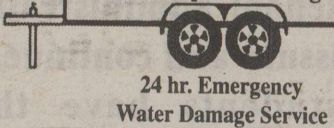

By about 9:00 PM all of the residents had been transferred to Ballinger Health and Rehab, Runnels County Health and Rehab or Bronte Health and Rehab. These are the same facilities that helped us 3 years ago.

With the continued high winds on Sunday and Monday morning the Care Center felt the residents were safer where they were. About noon on

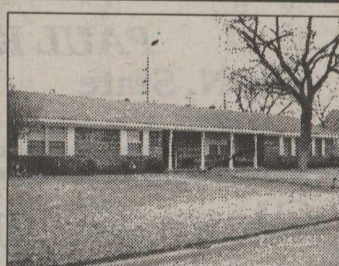

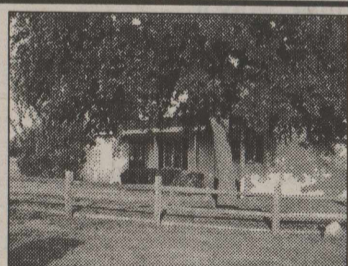

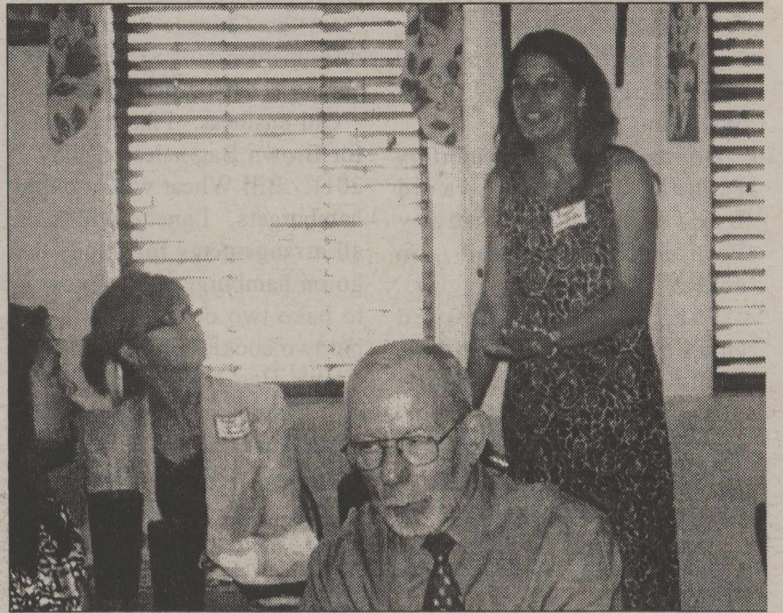
