This year marks the 100th anniversary of the building of the railroad depot in Bronte!

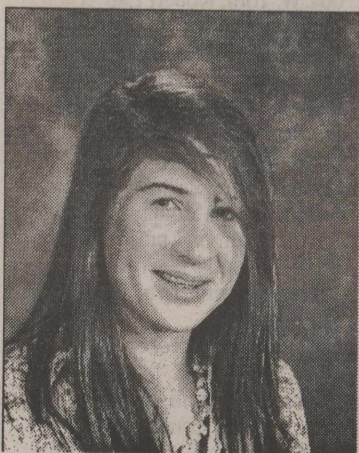

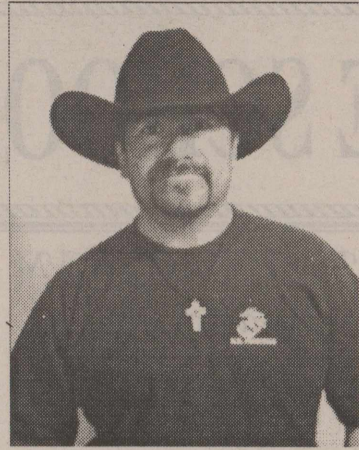
the Average Crop Revenue Election (ACRE) Program is June 1, 2011.

In September 2010, the Robert Lee City Council, along with the City of Bronte and Coke County Water Supply, entered into a contract with Jacob and Martin to prepare a feasibility study for future water supplies, available water resources and financial resources. The Water Study, comprised of several options and availability of ground water sources, projected cost and financing data. The report included conclusions and recommendations based upon the data compiled. This report will be further reviewed by the City Council and staff for comments prior to final acceptance.

Mayor Jacobs reported that drillers have started the ground water project on the Water Valley divide for potential development of an additional water supply

source for the City of Robert Lee. Plans are to do three test wells. The City Council will be updated on their progress each month.

The City Council considered a request from Ricky and Reba Green, 224 Ross Street, to close the undeveloped portion of Ross Street from 2nd to 3rd Street. Mr. and Mrs. Green presented a survey, prepared by SKG Engineering, which showed a portion of their property conflicting with the above mentioned undeveloped portion of Ross Street. A lot owned by Stanley Adams also conflicts with this portion of Ross Street. Following discussion, Troy Wimberley moved that the council approve the closing of this undeveloped portion of Ross Street with any utility easements granted. The motion included a provision that any and all costs involved would be the responsibility of these adjacent land owners, Mr. and Mrs. Green and Stanley Adams. Consideration was given to the fact that Stanley Adams might or might not be

interested in acquiring the additional footage. The motion was seconded by Sid Burns and the motion carried. Notification will be made to Stanley Adams.

Also considered as requested by Mr. and Mrs. Green was a 30' right-of-way easement on 2nd Street and Ross Street to allow for fences that extend the right-of-way on 2nd Street. Following discussion, no

action was taken.

Darin Clawson, president of Mountain Creek Golf Course, presented a request for variance from the recently implemented outdoor water restriction plan. Mountain Creek Golf

Course has one green, one T box, and the Club House on city water. This accounts for approximately one-ninth of the course. The remaining course is watered with effluent water from the city's wastewater plan.

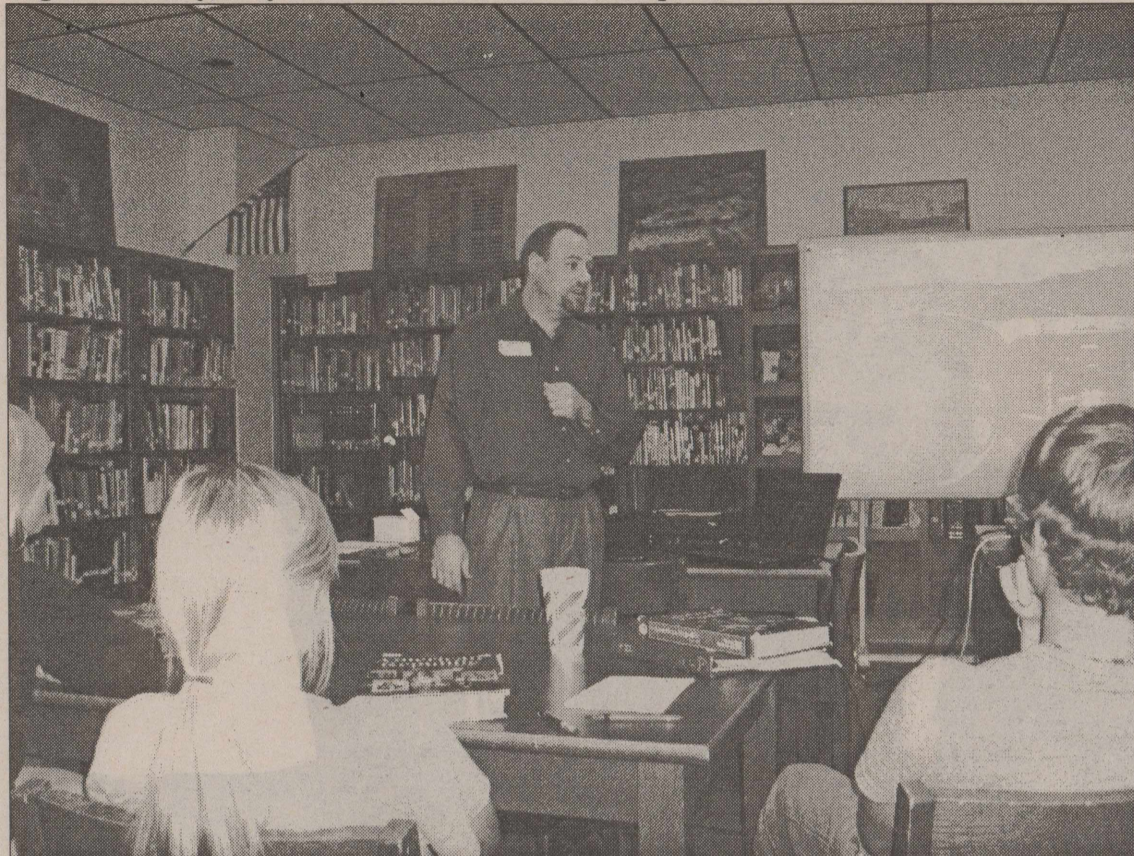

**Lincoln Tech School Presentation!** Max Spangler from Lincoln Technical College spoke to junior and senior students at Bronte High School about the vocational program opportunities offered at the school. Mr. Spangler talked to students about the importance of continuing their education after high school whether they go to a university, enroll in a vocational program or join the military to receive an education or training. He also recommended the students do career research. Mr. Spangler and the students practiced working on a budget so that the students could see how much money it takes to pay bills and live.

**Bronte ISD Gifted and Talented Program Update**

The Bronte Elementary Gifted and Talented Program has been working on a Texas Performance Standards Project. The TPSP is a state-wide standards and assessment system you can use to capture the high levels of achievement of gifted/talented students. The goal of the TPSP is for students to create work that reflects the professional quality that the Texas State Plan for the Education of Gifted/Talented Students requires. Student projects are TEKS-based and focus on the core content areas of English language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies with interdisciplinary connections.

The 6th Grade Gifted and Talented class is working on a budget project to solve a "real-life" school issue. Students were hypothetically given one million dollars to use to solve the school issue and they chose to build a new middle school annex for

6th, 7th, and 8th graders. In preparation for the project, the class held meetings with Mr. Richey, Mr. Bedford, and Ms. Poehls to discuss the pros and cons of adding a middle school. The class also met with architects from CADCO who taught them how to figure costs to build the fantasy annex. Like architects, students drew the new building to scale, and the new area had to meet all American Disability Act standards, making the facility handicapped accessible. Sixth graders then completed a tri-fold display to show details of their research. The tri-folds show expenses of buildings, furnishings, etc. The project was presented to Bronte ISD administration and school board members on Tuesday, May 17 at the monthly board meeting.

Other G/T classes have also used the Texas Performance Standards Project as a basis for their curriculum. Fourth and Fifth graders studied "Math Around Town" in which they determined which restaurants have the least

expensive menu items, how to calculate the cost of painting a restaurant per square foot, and how to explore different occupations. First, Second, and Third graders studied symmetry in nature. Their project consisted of research and posters of symmetrical objects they discovered in nature.

The Oath of Office was administered to the newly elected Board Members. Realignment of Officers is as follows: Paul Williams, President; Ericka Knight, Vice President; and Doug Tounget, Secretary.

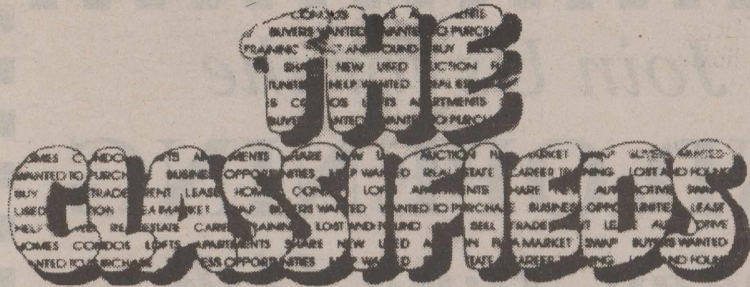

 WHEREAS, the Commissioners' Court of Coke County, on this the 12th day of May, 2011 has determined that Coke County, has been affected by recent wildland fires and continues to be threatened by high or extreme wildland fire hazard. This threat is caused by abundant fuel and extreme dry and windy conditions across the State of Texas and in Coke County, and;  
 WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Coke County have determined that extraordinary measures must be taken to alleviate the suffering of people and to protect or rehabilitate property;  
 NOW THEREFORE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN THE COKE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS' COURT BY SECTION 418.108 AND 418.014 OF THE TEXAS GOVERNMENT CODE, THE COURT DOES HEREBY PROCLAIM THE EXISTENCE OF SUCH DISASTER AND DIRECT THAT ALL NECESSARY MEASURES BOTH PUBLIC AND PRIVATE AS AUTHORIZED BY THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF TEXAS BE IMPLEMENTED TO MEET THAT DISASTER:

1. That a local state of disaster is hereby proclaimed for Coke County pursuant to Section 418.108 (a) of the Texas Government Code.
2. Pursuant to Section 418.108 (b) of the Government Code, this Declaration of a local state of disaster shall continue for so long as such conditions exist with the exception granted to fireworks under Section 418.108 (i) of the Government Code unless ratified and extended by the Governor of the State of Texas.

disaster shall be given the prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the County Clerk of Coke County.  
 4. Pursuant to Section 418.108 (d) of the Government Code, this Declaration of a local state of disaster activates the Coke County Emergency Management Plan.  
 5. The purpose of this order is the mitigation of the hazard posed by wildfires by curtailing the practice of outdoor burning, which purpose is to be taken into account in any enforcement action based upon this order.

 (a) Upon notification of suspected outdoor burning, the fire department assigned to the location of the fire shall respond to the scene and take immediate measures to contain and/or extinguish the fire.  
 (b) As soon as possible, a duly-commissioned peace officer shall be sent to the scene to investigate the nature of the fire.  
 (c) If in the opinion of the officer at the scene and/or

the Fire Chief, the goal of the order can be attained by informing the responsible party about the prohibitions established by this order, the officer may, at his discretion, notify the party about the provisions of this order and request compliance with it. In such instances, an entry of the notification shall be made into the dispatchers log containing the time, date, and place of the warning, and the name of the person receiving the warning.  
 (4) At the discretion of the peace officer and/or Fire Chief, subsequent or flagrant violations of this order may be prosecuted in accordance with the statutes and procedures governing misdemeanors.  
 BE IT ALSO ORDERED that this order may be enforced by any duly-commissioned peace officer and that the venue for prosecution of this order will be the Justice of the Peace Court, Coke County, Texas.

The City Council discussed enforcement issues regarding violations of the outdoor watering restrictions. Mayor Jacobs addressed the recently implemented restrictions, stating that a copy of these restrictions was mailed out with the water bills at the end of April. Consumption reports from meter reading were still high and will be reviewed again following May meter readings. The code officer stated that he had been monitoring the outdoor watering at different times and will continue to monitor the situation. The Council will review consumption and demand reports at the next meeting and take further action if necessary.

Ron Dickey, Animal Control Officer, presented his April report. Following discussion, Richard Johnson moved for approval, seconded by Troy Wimberley. The motion carried.

Marshall Millican, Code Enforcement Officer, presented his April report. Following a review of this report and questions regarding the availability and accessibility of the Municipal Judge, Janie Munoz moved to approve the report. The motion was seconded by Troy Wimberley and carried. Janie Munoz requested an agenda item be added to the June meeting to discuss the Municipal Judge

position regarding the availability and accessibility of the current municipal judge, George Brickey.

Mayor Jacobs reported an onsite visit of the water treatment plant on April 14 by Teresa Rogers and Jack Schultz of the TCEQ mCPE compliance team. The team discussed the proposed strategy in response to the three year extension request specifically regarding the disinfectant protocol and clarifier trough repair. TCEQ proposed to extend the CAP deadline for installing the disinfectant equipment to meet the September 29, 2011, enforcement order requirements, to consider the CAP closed if all other requirements are met by September with the exception of the clarifier trough repair, and to return to compliance the historical violations associated with the surface water treatment rule if all other requirements are met by September. The group discussed the option to use chlorine dioxide as a disinfectant to reduce disinfection byproducts and meet CAP requirements by September 2011, as well as to begin to meet the requirements of the existing Agreed Order. Also discussed was the use of granular activated carbon filtration media.

Mr. Fred Teagarden, UCRA, provided an update on the status of the lake and on the pending activities related to funding a well production to provide an additional water source to the City. Mayor Jacobs stated that reluctantly an agreement was made on behalf of the city of the proposed strategy mentioned above.

The Council considered a declaration to forgo the competitive bidding procedures under Chapter 252 of the Local Government Code to purchase disinfection equipment and contracts which are necessary to preserve or protect the public health or safety of the city's residents as ordered by TCEQ in the Mandatory Compliance Action Plan. This declaration is necessary to acquire the equipment and contract necessary to meet the TCEQ proposed CAP strategy and deadlines of the disinfectant protocol. Following discussion, Gary Payne moved to approve the declaration. The motion was seconded by Troy Wimberley and the motion carried.

Mayor Jacobs stated that a Lease Purchase Agreement with

Siemens Company for a chlorine dioxide generator, maintenance, and chemicals will be required in order to meet mCPE CAP compliance with the disinfectant protocol. It was noted that the company had not had sufficient time to prepare this agreement. Troy Wimberley moved that, due to the time constraints, authorization be granted to Mayor Jacobs to execute a Lease Purchase Agreement with Siemens Company. The motion was seconded by Janie Munoz. The motion carried.

Water Treatment Plant operator Justin Brickey was not present at the meeting due to illness. The City Secretary reported on the remaining corrective action items of the CAP. The lagoon project is in progress. Comments were received regarding the regulatory compliance plan previously submitted. Comments will be incorporated into the plan. The SCADA system has been installed and operators trained. Monthly reports are being submitted as required.

Mayor Jacobs reported on the Wildcat Fire, April 11 through May 2, 2011. The Robert Lee Volunteer Fire Department repairs and fuel has been estimated at \$4,000. It is unclear if all the bills have been presented. A Forest Service truck is completely down and will be returned to the Forest Service. The department will look at other avenues in which to replace this truck. Donations received to date are approximately \$35,815.00. Mayor Jacobs read a debriefing from the Fire Department. There were approximately 996.7 firefighter hours and 254 hours from the Mayor, City Secretary, and City Superintendent. Major Jacobs stated that he did not have an estimated report regarding the amount of water provided by the City during this fire. He said that City Attorney Nancy Arthur was looking over the contract with CRMWD to see if the City had any rights to require CRMWD to stop pumping from Lake Spence. State Representative Drew Darby's office is aware of the critical water supply issues.

1. Mayor's Report
  - a. The 2009 TCDP filter rehab project will be closed out. Project is complete.
  - b. The Water Association Meeting/Fish Fry is scheduled for May 19 in the school cafeteria.

- c. Fred Teagarden, UCRA, provided outstanding assistance with the Standard Operating Procedures as required under the TCEQ mCPE compliance action plan. The plan has been submitted for comment to TCEQ.

- d. Linda Barrera completed the online Basic Water course and passed the D Water License exam. Dan Cantrell completed the Basic Wastewater Course at the Abilene Regional School and tested for his D Wastewater License. Justin Brickey completed the customer service inspection course at the Abilene Regional School and tested for his CSI license.

**2. City Secretary Report**

- a. The Spring City-wide Cleanup on April 15-16th was a huge success. Two roll-offs of metal material and three roll-offs of mixed material were collected. The estimated payment from Acme Iron for the metal material is \$500.

- b. The Annual City Appreciation Dinner is slated for May 12 at 6 pm at Zentner's Steakhouse in San Angelo.

- c. An Oath of Office Ceremony will be held May 20 at 9 am at City Hall for installation of the elected officers - Janie Munoz, Tommy Roach and Jeanette Meeks.

**3. Superintendent Report**

- a. Report on work orders completed and ongoing activity at all utility departments. Contractors have finished with filter rehab project. City-wide cleanup was a success. Superintendent attended a drought seminar in Austin. The department tapped a 6" line on 12th Street and Washington Street to resolve low pressure problems. Currently, he is gathering door prizes for the TWUA meeting. He had a phone conference with Steve Dennis, Engineer, and TCEQ team about the chlorine dioxide generator for the disinfectant protocol.

- b. He reported on upcoming items, finished old work order, cleaning of backwash lagoons, cleaning drying beds at the WWTP.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 10:30 pm.

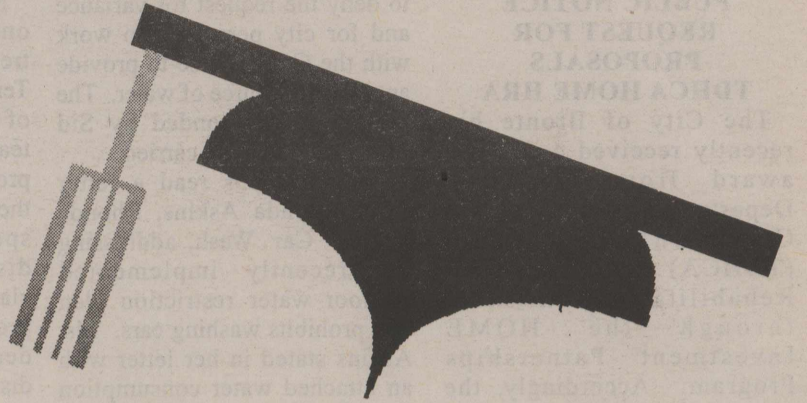
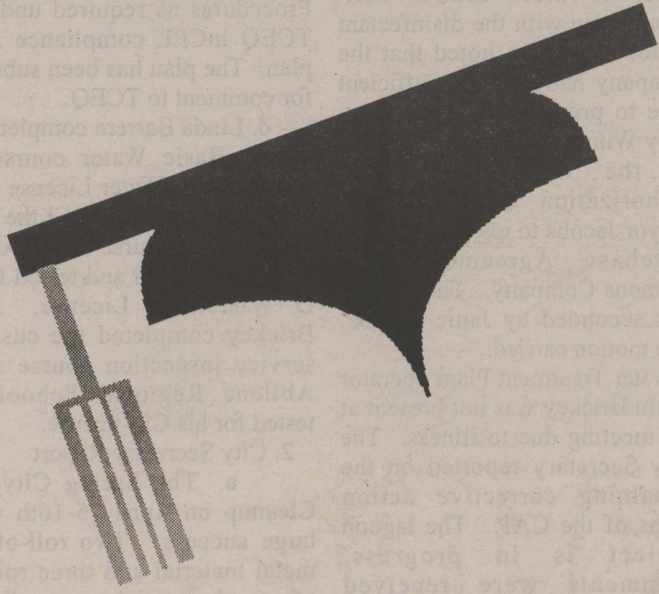
