

4. Pursuant to Section 418.108 (d) of the Government Code, this Declaration of a local state of disaster activates the Coke County Emergency Management Plan.

5. The purpose of this order is the mitigation of the hazard posed by wildfires by curtailing the practice of outdoor burning, which purpose is to be taken into account in any enforcement action based upon this order.

BE IT THEREFORE ORDERED that the following emergency regulations are hereby established for all unincorporated areas of Coke County, Texas for the duration of the declaration; (1) Actions Prohibited:

(a) All outdoor burning of any combustible material is prohibited. A person violates this order if he burns any combustible material or orders such burning by others.

(b) The sale and use of all fireworks.

(2) Actions Allowed

(a) Any propane cooking, and outdoor cooking fires as long as they are under the supervision and control of an authorized Volunteer Fire Department.

(3) Enforcement:

(a) Upon notification of suspected outdoor burning, the fire department assigned to the location of the fire shall respond to the scene and take immediate measures to contain and/or extinguish the fire.

(b) As soon as possible, a duly-commissioned peace officer shall be sent to the scene to investigate the nature of the fire.

(c) If in the opinion of officer at the scene and/or

the Fire Chief, the goal of the order can be attained by informing the responsible party about the

prohibitions established by this order, the officer may, at his discretion, notify the party about the provisions of this order and request compliance with it. In such instances, an entry of the notification shall be made into the dispatchers log containing the time, date, and place of the warning, and the name of the person receiving the warning.

(4) At the discretion of the peace officer and/or Fire Chief, subsequent or flagrant violations of this order may be prosecuted in accordance with the statues and procedures governing misdemeanors.

BE IT ALSO ORDERED that this order may be enforced by any dulycommissioned peace officer and that the venue for prosecution of this order will be the Justice of the Peace Court, Coke County, Texas.

This Declaration and Order shall take effect immediately from and after its issuance and continue until the conditions requiring this declaration and order are over, with the exception granted to fireworks under Section 418.108 (i) of the Government Code unless ratified and extended by the Governor of the State of Texas.

TCEQ proposed to extend the CAP deadline for installing the disinfectant equipment to meet the September 29, 2011, enforcement order requirements, to consider the CAP closed if all other requirements are met by September with the exception of the clarifier trough repair, and to return to compliance the historical violations associated with the surface water treatment rule if all other requirements are met by September. The group discussed the option to use chlorine dioxide as a disinfectant to reduce disinfection byproducts and meet CAP requirements by September 2011, as well as to begin to meet the requirements of the existing Agreed Order. Also discussed was the use of granular activated carbon

filtration media. Mr. Fred Teagarden, UCRA, provided an update on the status of the lake and on the pending activities related to funding a well production to provide an additional water source to the City. Mayor Jacobs stated that reluctantly an agreement was made on behalf of the city of the proposed strategy mentioned above.

The Council considered a declaration to forgo the competitive bidding procedures under Chapter 252 of the Local Government Code to purchase disinfection equipment and contracts which are necessary to preserve or protect the public health or safety of the city's residents as ordered by TCEQ in the Mandatory Compliance Action Plan. This declaration is necessary to acquire the equipment and contract necessary to meet the TCEQ proposed CAP strategy and deadlines of the disinfectant protocol. Following discussion, Gary Payne moved to approve the declaration. The motion was seconded by Troy Wimberley and the motion carried.




