Disaster Assistance available for small businesses

Small, non-farm businesses in all 254 Texas counties and neighboring counties in adjoining states may now apply for low-interest disaster loans from the U. S. Small Business Administration (SBA).

"These disaster loans offset economic losses because of reduced revenues caused by drought, excessive heat, high winds and wildfires that began January 1, 2011, in Texas," announced Alfred E. Judd, Director of SBA's Disaster Field Operations Center-West.

"SBA eligibility covers both the economic impacts on businesses dependent on farmers and ranchers that

have suffered agricultural production losses caused by the disaster and businesses directly impacted by the disaster," Judd said.

Small, non-farm businesses, small agricultural cooperatives and most private, non-profit organizations of any size may qualify for Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDL) of up to \$2 million to help meet financial obligations and operating expenses which could have been met had the disaster not occurred.

"Eligibility for these loans is based on the financial impact of the disaster only and not on any actual property damage. These loans have an interest rate of 4% for businesses and 3% for private, non-profit organizations, a maximum term of 30 years, and are available to small businesses and most

The Robert Lee City Council met in regular session on July 18, 2011. Mayor John Jacobs presided. Members present were Janie Munoz, Richard Johnson, Sid Burns, Tommy Roach and Jeanette Meeks. City Staff present were Kay Torres and E. R. Roberts.

The bills to be paid and the minutes of the June 13, 2011, Regular City Council and the Emergency Session on June 17, 2011, were approved.

The Animal Control Officer gave his report for the month

of June, 2011. The report was accepted.

The Code Enforcement Officer gave his report for the month of June, 2011. The report was accepted.

Mayor Jacobs reported that a meeting was held with the U.C.R.A., City of Bronte, City of Robert Lee, and State Representative Darby to discuss these entities' Oak Creek water rights.

The transmission line from Robert Lee to Bronte was discussed. The project is estimated at \$1.2 million dollars. The City of Bronte has agreed to sell treated water to Robert Lee. Bronte has agreed to provide up to 250,000 gallons of treated water per day.

Preliminary negotiations with the City of Bronte for the purchase of treated water will be based on operation and maintenance cost plus 10% per thousand gallons of water. Additional cost may be a pro-rata of any improvements to Bronte's plant and/or storage to provide the minimum daily demand of 250,000 gallons per day.

Financing of this project was discussed. Mayor Jacobs reported that a teleconference

will be held Tuesday, July 19, with the Texas Water Development Board to discuss options available to the City. Additionally, the U.C.R.A. has offered a loan to the City and it will be considered, providing that the Water Development Board gives an assurance of loan forgiveness with this project.

The Council reviewed cost submitted by the City Engineer firm to expedite the development and submittal of the plans for the proposed transmission line. Engineer Firm submitted a total cost for engineer services for this project at \$148,000 plus any services by the resident project representative. The City Engineer was authorized to proceed to expedite the development and submittal of the plans as related to the transmission line.

Further restrictions to the outdoor watering were discussed. In accordance with the city's drought contingency plan, Stage 3 has been implemented, restricting any outdoor watering. The Water Superintendent reported that the daily demand has dropped from 250,000-275,000 to presently 200,000 gallons per

day. At this time, the council determined to hold-off on the pro-rata stage and to continue to monitor the daily demand another month.

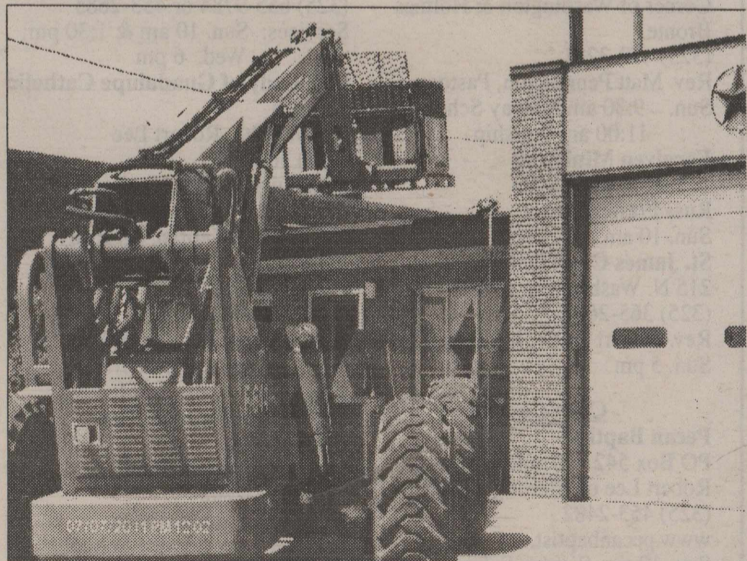
The Mayor read a letter from a concerned resident requesting an ordinance that would enforce property owners to clear property that was overgrown with trees and heavy brush. The Council will consult with the City Attorney.

The vacant position of employee Justin Brickey was considered. Justin resigned from his position to pursue his education through his GI bill. Superintendent Roberts reported that TCEQ requires the City to maintain two licensed operators and Robert Lee will continue to pursue licensing with the present employees. The Council determined that the position would remain vacant for the present time.

Also discussed was the Fire Marshall position that was held by Justin Brickey. Superintendent E.R. Roberts, agreed to accept the appointment.

The current landfill capacity was discussed for consid-

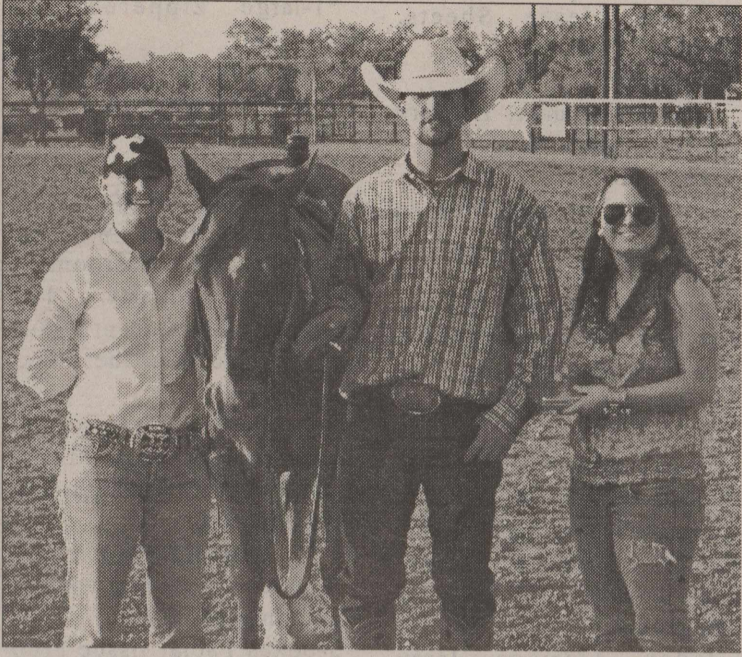

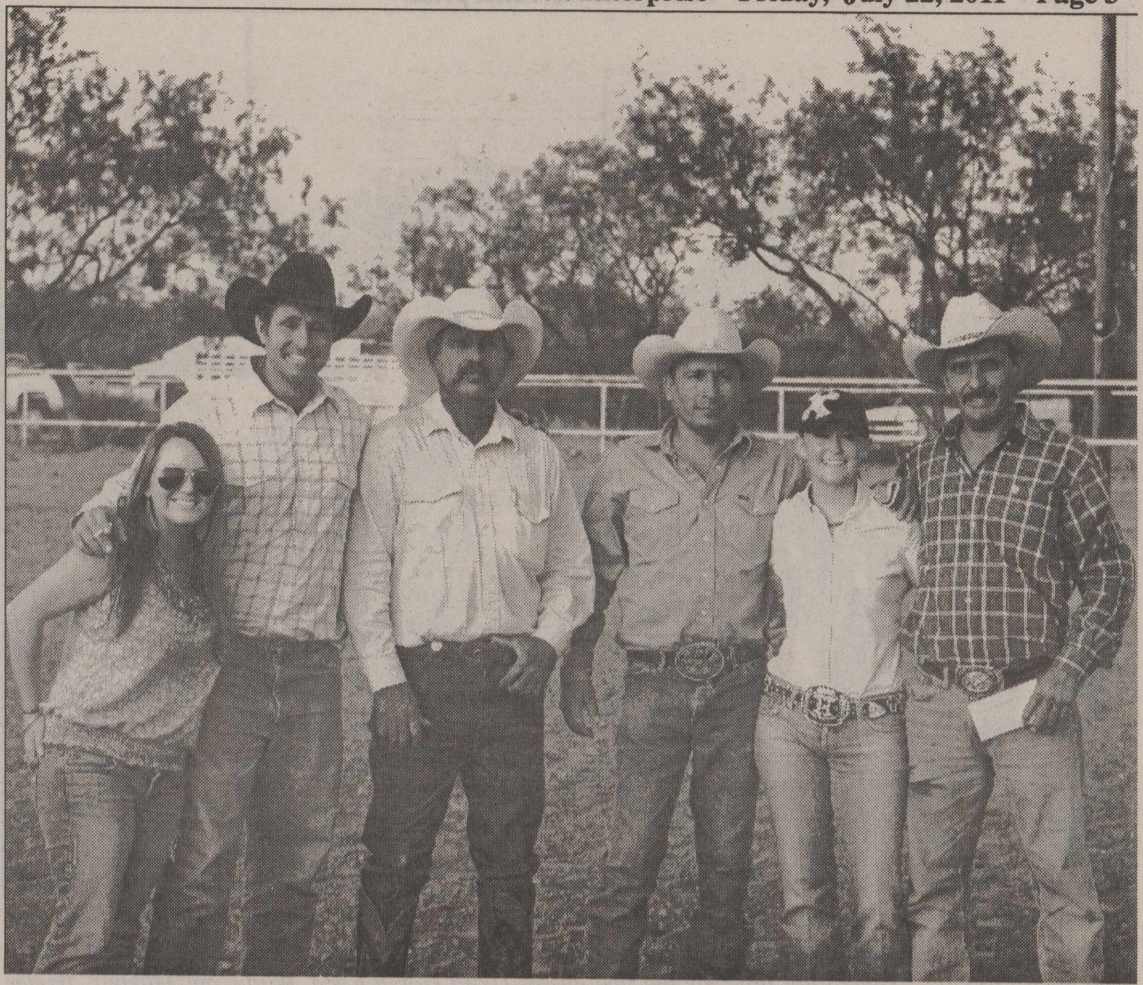
(Continued from page 1) private, non-profits without the financial ability to offset the adverse impact without hardship," Judd said.

Businesses primarily engaged in farming or ranching are not eligible for SBA disaster assistance. Agricultural enterprises should contact the Farm Services Agency (FSA) about the U. S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) assistance made available by the

Secretary's declaration. However, in drought disasters nurseries are eligible for SBA disaster assistance.

Applicants may also apply online using the Electronic Loan Application (ELA) via SBA's secure Web site at <https://disasterloan.sba.gov/ela>.

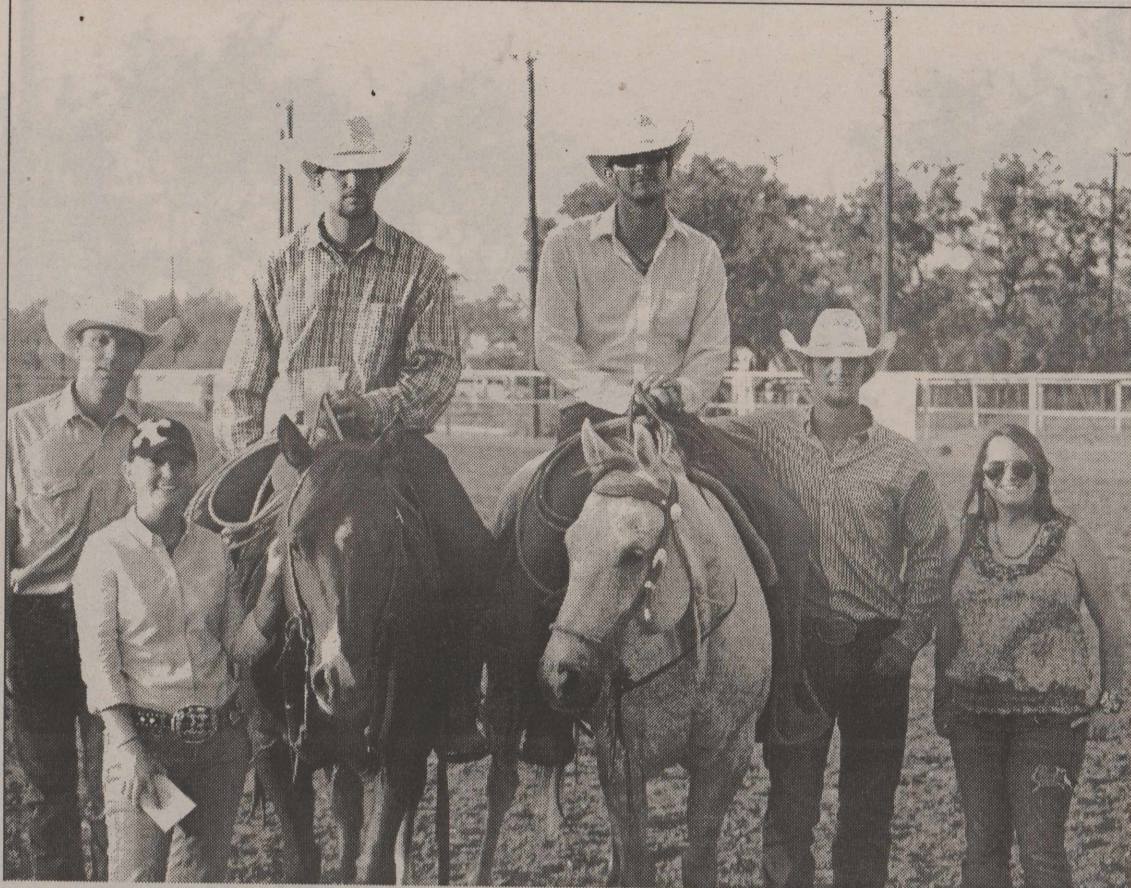

She is vice president of the Coke County Public Facility Corporation, secretary and past president of the Robert Lee School Board, a board member and former chair of Coke County Historical Commission, maintenance director and past president and treasurer of Hayrick Lodge Cemetery Association, treasurer of the Coke County 4-H Clubs, treasurer of Robert Lee Baptist Church, Worthy Matron of Robert Lee - Bronte Eastern Star Chapter No. 187 also a former State Trustee of the Grand Chapter of Texas Eastern Star, and a former board member of West Coke County Community Development. Roberts' first appointment to the UCRA came from Gov. George W. Bush in 1996 and has been reappointed every six years. Roberts is currently serving as Chairperson of the board. The UCRA board is responsible for managing the waters of the Upper Colorado River and its tributaries. UCRA has no connections to Colorado River Municipal Water District (CRMWD). The by-laws state that there will be three directors from Coke County. Those currently serving with Mrs. Roberts are William "Pistol" Hood of Robert Lee and Martin Lee of Bronte.

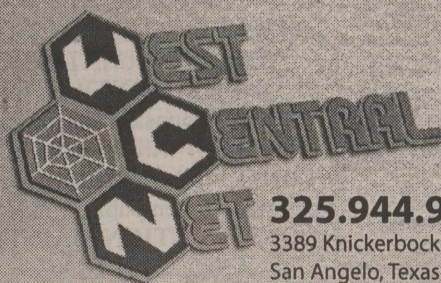

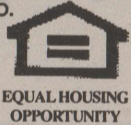

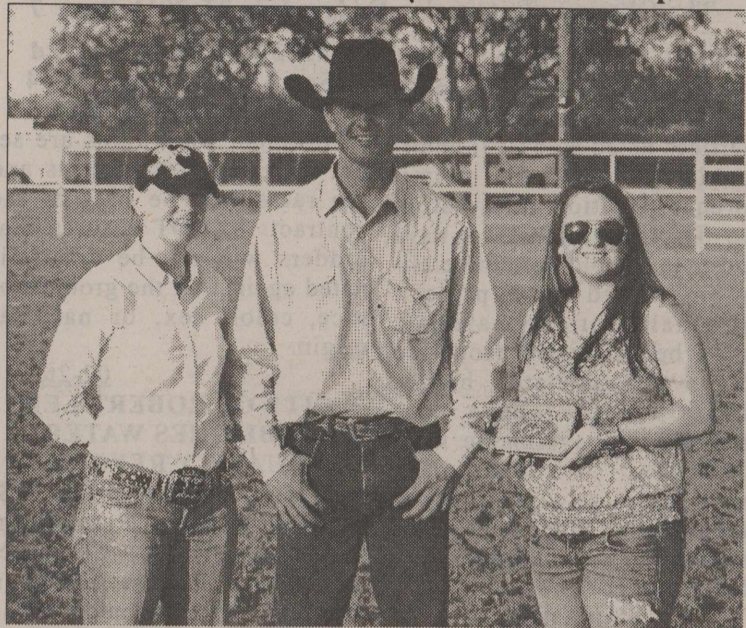

MCL COLIFORM VIOLATION (TCR 22)

The City of Robert Lee Public Water Supply/ PWS ID0410002 water system collected (2) water samples during June, 2011, that contained coliform bacteria. This water system is required to submit a minimum of three routine water samples each month for

bacteriological analysis. Three routine samples were coliform-found and seven repeat sample were coliform-found for the month and year indicated above.

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) sets drinking water standards in Texas and has determined that the presence of total coliform is a possible health concern. Coliforms are bacteria that are naturally present in the environment and are used as an indicator that other, potentially harmful, bacteria may be present. Coliforms were found in more samples than allowed and this was a warning of potential problems.

For water systems analyzing at least 40 sample per month, no more than five (5) percent of the monthly samples may be positive for total coliform. For systems analyzing fewer than 40 samples per month, no more than one (1) sample per month may be positive for total coliform.
