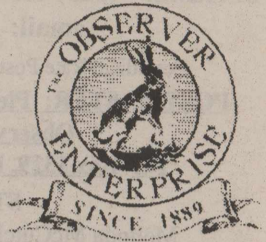

A review of business activities of the Post Office at this location revealed that the office workload has declined. This reduced workload suggests the maintenance of an independent Post Office here may no longer be warranted.

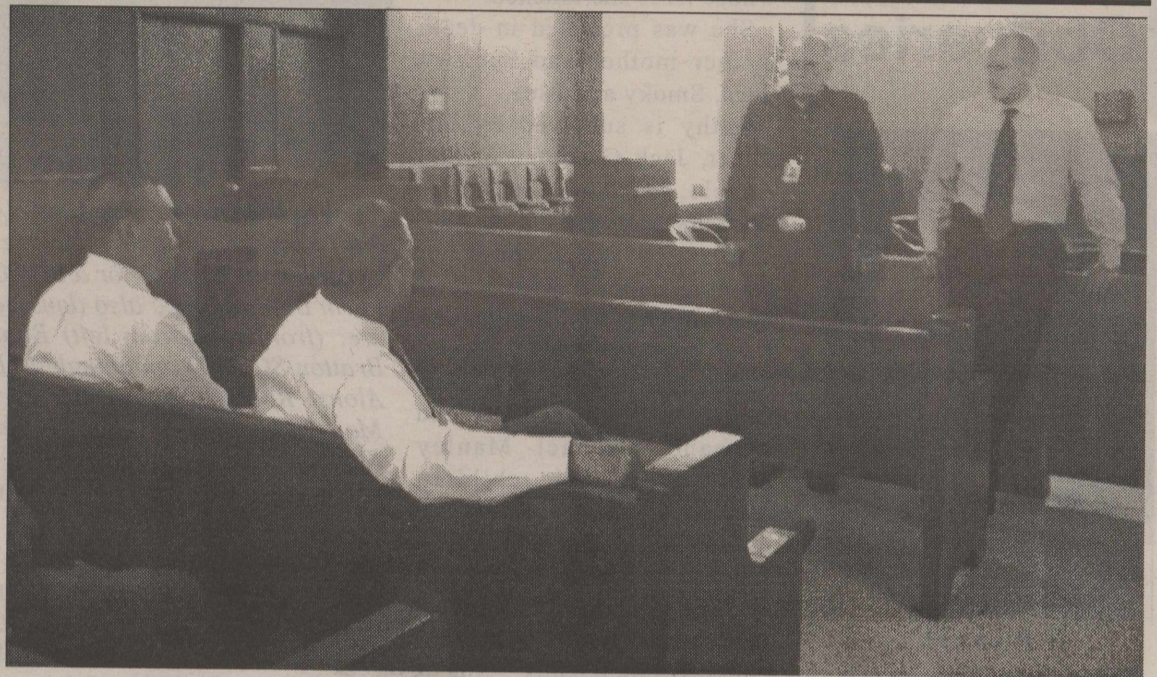

You can contact your Agriscience teacher or the Coke County Extension office to place your tag order. The tag order is due by Monday October 3rd, 2011, to the validation chairman (Jeff Brisbin).

Swine validation will be held in November and will be set by the county stock show board of directors.

Notice of the Availability of an Environmental Assessment

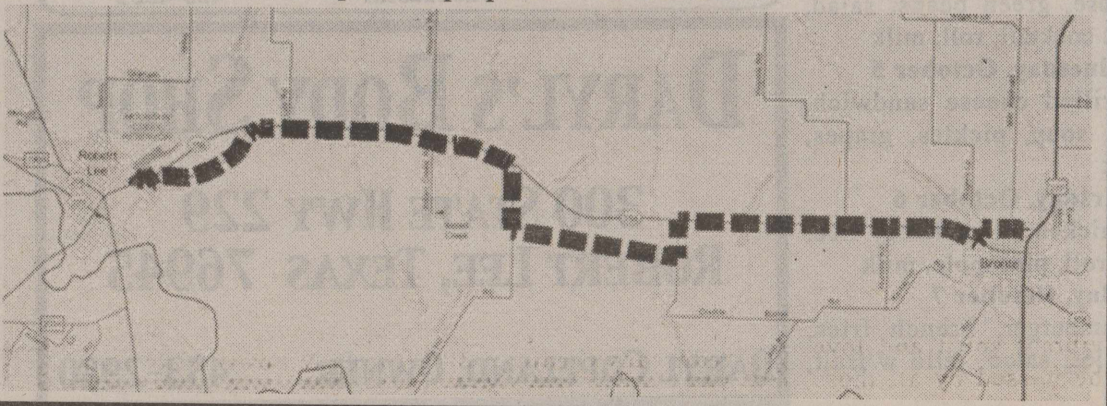
The USDA, Rural Utilities Service has received an application for financial assistance from the City of Robert Lee, Texas. As required by the National Environmental Policy Act and agency regulations, the Rural Utilities Service has prepared an Environmental Assessment that evaluated the potential environmental effects and consequences of the proposal. This notice announces the availability of the Environmental Assessment for public review and comment.

The proposal consists of the installation of approximately 12 miles of water transmission line; booster pump station and related appurtenances between the Cities of Robert Lee and Bronte, Texas. The proposal does not anticipate any adverse environmental effects. The alternatives considered to the proposal included: new well fields and transmission lines to San Angelo.

Copies of the Environmental Assessment are available for review at the USDA Service Center, 201 East 11th St, Ozona, Texas (325-392-2301) and the City of Robert Lee, 6 East 7th St, Robert Lee, Texas (325-453-2831). Any person interested in commenting on this proposal should submit comments to the address above by Monday, October 31, 2011.

A public hearing will be held at 6:00 PM, Tuesday, November 1, 2011 at the Robert Lee City Hall to discuss the environmental assessment and address any comments received. Those needing assistance at the public hearing are requested to contact the City of Robert Lee at 325-453-2831, 72 hours prior to the meeting so appropriate arrangements can be made.

Robert Lee Cross County teams results

On Saturday, September 10th, the Robert Lee Cross Country teams ran at the State School Park in Carlsbad.

For the Varsity girls, Lubbock Roe finished 108th in a time of 19:32. Bianca Huapilla was 127th at 22:13. Zachary Sanchez ran 3 miles for the Steers finishing 33rd out of 115 runners in a time of 19:41. Our Junior High girls, Randi Coppedge, Carlee Roach, and Julissa Terraza competed against 269 girls to finish 242nd, 138th, and 114th, respectively. Trace Oleksiuk was 57th and Jesus Landeros was 19th in the field of 175 Junior High boys, running times of 15:55 and 14:18.

On Saturday, September 17th, Robert Lee Junior and High School competed in the ASU Stampede in San Angelo. Zachary Sanchez ran the 5K in 19:55 and placed 24th-that's 3.1 miles. Carlee Roach finished 31st in a field of 295 girls with a time of 11:10. Yulissa Terraza placed 118th in 2:28, and Rani Coppedge was 261st with a time of 2:39. Jesus Landeros placed 4th and Trace Oleksiuk was 58th out of 196 Junior High boys with a time of 9:48 and 2:39 respectively.

The junior high teams ran .5 miles instead of their usual 2. Results for the

On Thursday, September 22, the Robert Lee Varsity Cross Country runners competed in Miles. Lubbock Roe and Bianca Huapilla finished 76th and 89th with times of 16:33 and 18:03. Zachary Sanchez finished strong in 7th place with a time of 17:01. The next meet will be for both Junior High and High School at Irion County on Saturday, October 1.

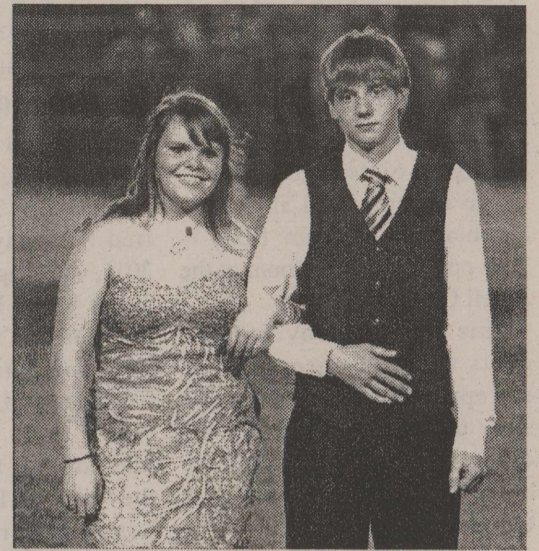

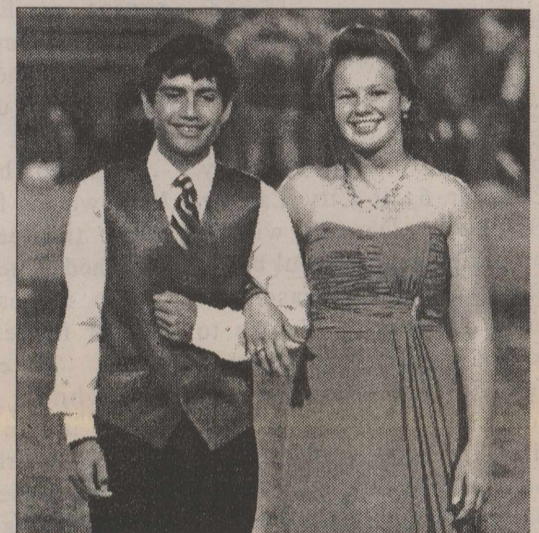

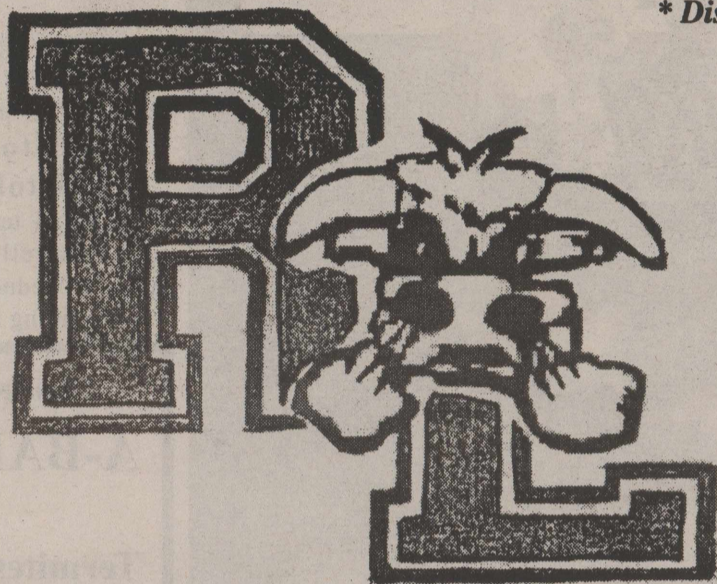

Over \$63,000 in scholarships awarded to BHS grads

At the September 21, 2011 meeting of the Blackwell Consolidated Educational Foundation, the board of directors approved \$63,378.70 in scholarships for Blackwell graduates.

Students, including transfers, who graduate from Blackwell High School can earn up to \$3,000 per year of attendance for trade school, two-year, and/or four-year university study.

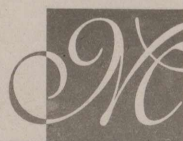

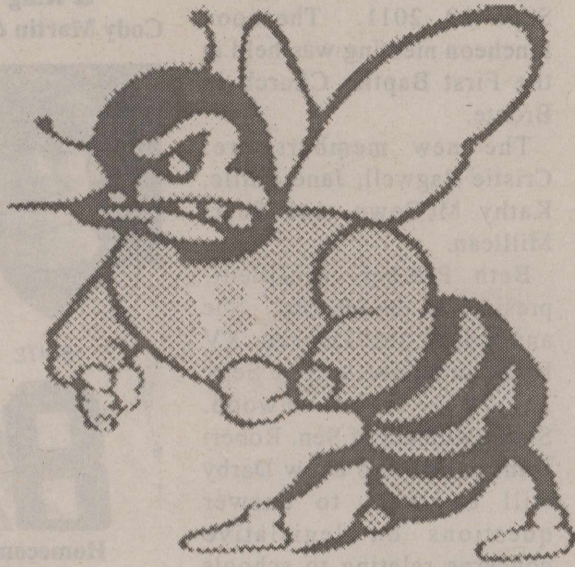
