

# **Obituaries**



Fikes

Weldon Farrell Fikes, 93, one of the Greatest Generation, passed from this country that he loved into the one he lived for all his life on Thursday, September 29, 2011, at the Robert Lee Care Center. The family received friends Wes/Farrell Jean's home, 4801 FM 2034, (Water Valley Hwy.) The memorial service was Tuesday, October 4, 2011, at 1 pm at the Robert Lee Baptist Church. Visitation with the family immediately followed the service in the RLBC fellowship hall. Burial was at the Robert Lee Cemetery. Services were under the direction of Shaffer Funeral Home.

Born January 28, 1918, on the Fikes home place five miles north of Robert Lee, Coke County, Texas, Weldon was the middle child of Will and Birdie Markham Fikes. He was raised on the home place along with his older brother, Henson, and younger sister, Lorene, all who preceded him in death.

Weldon was a student at Robert Lee ISD from 1924 through graduation in 1936 where he was active in football, basketball, and track. He worked for a period of time to be able to attend Texas Tech for a year. However, the start of World War II changed the lives of many Americans, including his.

He was called into military service on Sunday, December 7, 1941, by the Coke County Draft Board, after the bombing of Pearl Harbor. Three days later, Weldon was inducted into the U.S. Army at Ft. Sill, Oklahoma. He received training at Camp Roberts,

California, Camp San Luis Obispo, California, Camp Young in the Mojave Desert with General George Patton, and amphibious training at Fort Ord, California, and the Catalina Islands. In March 1943, the 17th and 32nd Regiments of the 7th Division sailed from the San Francisco pier to the Aleutian Islands off the Alaska Peninsula. They were issued Artic equipment and given the assignment to take Attu Island back from the Japanese. operation was to have taken three days. However, because of a late spring storm, fog, and frostbite, it took three weeks to secure the island. The next two years he saw service in various areas in Alaska. Weldon was discharged from the U.S. Army at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, on October 29, 1945, after serving four years.

Weldon and Bryce Stewart were married September 18, 1945, and shared 49 years together prior to Bryce's death on November 2, 1994. Their lives were enriched with the addition of their three daughters, Elaine, Farrell Jean, and Marion whom they raised with love, compassion and a healthy dose of realistic guidance.

Weldon's life and Robert Lee Baptist Church walked hand in hand most of his ninety-three years. In 1933, at the age of thirteen, he became a Christian and a member of Robert Lee Baptist Church. There he was ordained a deacon on May 17, 1946, and enjoyed serving alongside his church family in numerous capacities for many years.

Weldon was a good steward of the land in his farming and ranching occupation. Hunting was a life-long joy to him. He served as County and District Clerk of Coke County from 1950-1955. In 1956, he became Coke County's first Auditor, retiring in 1982.

On April 4, 1996, Weldon and Virginia Black, long-time acquaintance and former Howard County Auditor, were married in San Angelo, Texas. After living in Robert Lee for several years, Weldon and Ginny moved to San Angelo in 2004. They enjoyed their Baptist Memorial neighbors on West Street and their Immanuel Baptist Church family before health issues necessitated a move back to Robert Lee in

# **Notice of the Availability** of an Environmental Assessment


The USDA, Rural Utilities Service has received an application for financial assistance from the City of Robert Lee, Texas. As required by the National Environmental Policy Act and agency regulations, the Rural Utilities Service has prepared an Environmental Assessment that evaluated the potential environmental effects and consequences of the proposal. This notice announces the availability of the Environmental Assessment for public review and comment.

The proposal consists of the installation of approximately 12 miles of water transmission line; booster pump station and related appurtenances between the Cities of Robert Lee and Bronte, Texas. The proposal does not anticipate any adverse environmental effects. The alternatives considered to the proposal included: new well fields and transmission lines to San Angelo.

Copies of the Environmental Assessment are available for review at the USDA Service Center, 201 East 11th St, Ozona, Texas (325-392-2301) and the City of Robert Lee, 6 East 7th St, Robert Lee, Texas (325-453-2831). For further information contact Randy Verner, USDA Area Specialist at 325-392-2301. Any person interested in commenting on this proposal should submit comments to the address above by Monday, October 31, 2011.

A public hearing will be held at 6:00 PM, Tuesday, November 1, 2011 at the Robert Lee City Hall to discuss the environmental assessment and address any comments received. Those needing assistance at the public hearing are requested to contact the City of Robert Lee at 325-453-2831, 72 hours prior to the meeting so appropriate arrangements can be made.

yards from passes by Ethan Andrews, had 2 tackles and 1 assist.



### Over \$63,000 in scholarships awarded to BHS grads

At the September 21, 2011 meeting of the Blackwell Consolidated Educational Foundation, the board of directors approved \$63, 378.70 in scholarships for Blackwell graduates.




