> He and Troy Wimberley formed a partnership in 1981 and established Salt Creek Beefmasters. These cattle were the pride of his life. It truly upset him to reduce the size of the herd from over 100 registered cows down to 29 mother cows. The reduction was due to the drought and the recent fires.






