The course is approximately 60 classroom hours and will be held in Bronte. Classes will be two evenings per week and two full Saturdays with completion scheduled for March 15.



Also present were Roger Alexander, Administrator, and Janie Munoz, Business Office Mgr. There were no visitors. Roger Alexander gave the invocation. The minutes from the previous meeting were approved, and absent members were excused from the December meeting.
