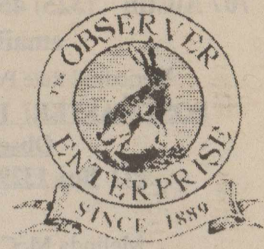

Account set up for Thorn Family

A bank account has been set up at First National Bank of Sterling City in Bronte for Cory Thorn.

The funds will help defray the medical expenses being incurred following his accident on Highway 277 south of Bronte last Tuesday, March 6.

Originally taken to Shannon Medical Center in San Angelo, Thorn was transferred to Parkland in Dallas and has already undergone several surgeries.

Wild Horse & Burro Adoption Heading to San Angelo March 22-24

The U.S. Bureau of Land Management (BLM) will hold a wild horse and burro adoption in San Angelo, Texas, March 22-24, 2012.

The three-day event at the San Angelo Stock Show & Rodeo—Spur Arena will feature over 50 spectacular animals. These are adult and yearling horses and burros that once roamed free on public lands in the West. The BLM periodically removes excess animals from the range in order to maintain healthy herds and to protect other rangeland resources. The adoption program is essential for achieving these important management goals.

Adoption begins with a competitive bid Thursday March 22, at 2 pm. First-come-first-served adoptions follow until 6 pm, then again Friday, March 23, from 8 am to 6 pm, and Saturday, March 24, from 8 am to noon.

Application approval is required and can be done on site. To qualify to adopt, one must be at least 18 years old with no record of animal abuse. Adopters must have a minimum of 400 square feet of corral space per animal, with free access to food, water and shelter. A six-foot corral fence is required for adult horses and five feet for yearlings. All animals must be loaded in covered stock-type trailers with swing gates and sturdy walls and floors.

BLM staff will be on hand to assist with the short application process, answer any questions and load horses.

The standard adoption fee is \$125, as set by law. Bidding will start at that amount.

BLM pays a one-time \$500 care-and-feeding allowance to adopters of horses at least four years old. The allowance is paid in full after one year when adopters receive official ownership title for their horse(s). All standard adoption conditions and fees apply. A limited number of eligible horses will be available. Younger horses, burros and trained animals are not eligible for this incentive.

Wild horses and burros — iconic symbols of America's western heritage — are renowned for their strength, endurance, agility and intelligence, characteristics bred into them in the wild that make them ideal for work or recreation. Since 1973, the BLM has placed more than 225,000 of these "living legends" in approved homes across the country.

ORDINANCE AMENDING

ORDINANCE #365

ANIMAL ORDINANCE
Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Bronte, Texas, as follows to-wit:

Section 5 of Ordinance #365 is hereby amended to add the following:

(f) It is unlawful for an owner or keeper to restrain a dog by means of a tether. A tether is defined as a chain, rope, cable, lease, or other similar device used to attach an animal to a stationary object or trolley system. The only time a dog may be tethered is if the owner is physically present outside with the dog, or it's being restrained for veterinary treatment, grooming, training, or law enforcement activity.

Dogs are still required to be on a leash when not confined to the property by a fence.

(g) Dogs confined outdoors must be in a fenced yard or other pen or structure that is capable of preventing the dogs escape; has at least 150 square feet of space per adult dog; and provides the dog access to the inside of a building, dog house or other type of shelter.

It if further ordained that said amendment shall take effect on May 15, 2012.

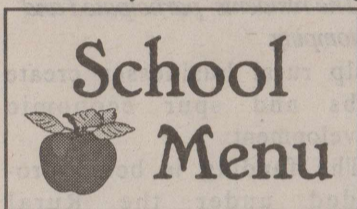
Artist to speak at WTRC benefit

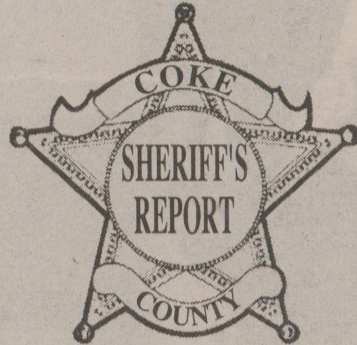

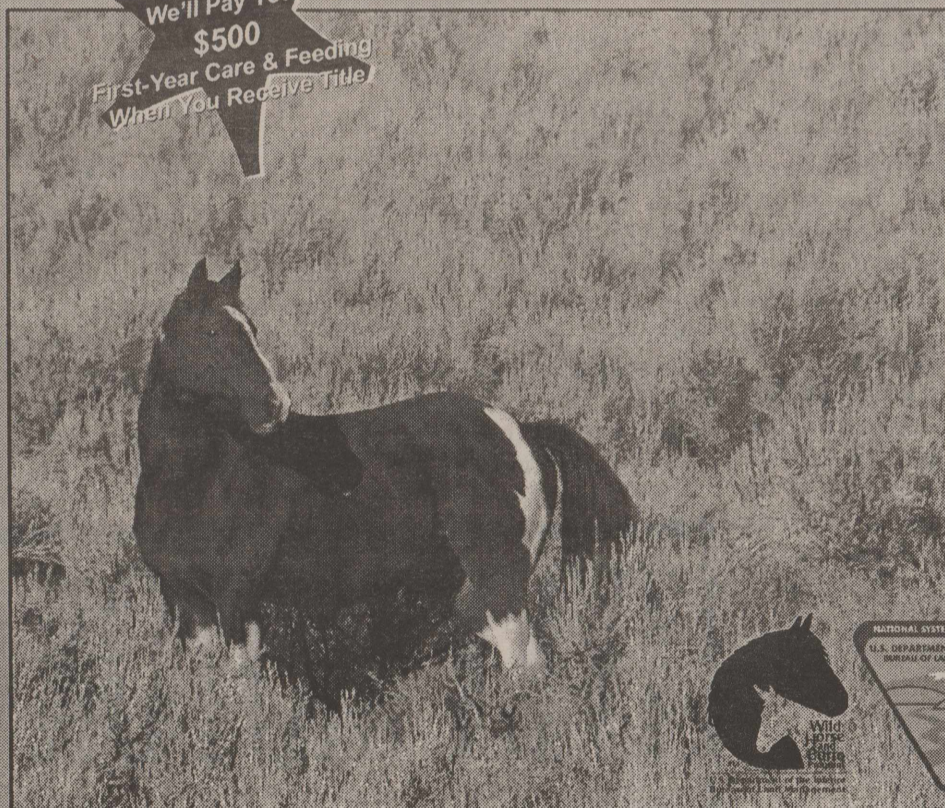
