It is always heart wrenching news when we hear of a house fire in which precious lives were lost. Many of us associate these fires with cold weather when we have fireplaces or gas stoves heating our homes. This is not always the case though, as problems with wiring, candles, cook stoves and numerous other things can start a fire at any time.

The Bronte EMS, in conjunction with the Concho Valley RAC TSA-K, will be handing out smoke/carbon monoxide detectors again this year in hopes of preventing loss of lives to any of our area residents. It has been shown that having smoke detectors can give an early warning in the event a fire does break out. The detectors will be distributed at the Senior Citizen Building, 613 E Oliver Street, in Bronte on Wednesday, April 18, beginning at 12:30 pm. ## Coke County will hold Democratic Party County

### Convention April 21

The Coke County Democratic Party Convention will be held on April 21, 2012, at 10 am at the church hall next door to Our Lady of Guadalupe Catholic Church at 601 W. 10th in Robert Lee.

The convention will be open to any qualified voter who registered to vote at least 30 days prior to the convention and who signs an oath of affiliation with the Democratic Party.

please be sure to bring your voter registration card for identification. Because of the changes to the election schedule, the Texas Convention and Delegate Selection process this year will skip precinct conventions and begin at County/Senatorial District conventions. This forum will also be used to conduct other party business such as electing precinct chairs for a County Executive Committee and adopting resolutions for the state party platform.

"We encourage all Democrats of Coke County to attend the Democratic Convention and make their voice heard," said Bob Houck, Coke County Democratic Party Chair. "Individuals who want to represent our area as delegates to the Texas Democratic Party State Convention should attend."

The delegates and alternates elected at the County/Senate District Convention then go to the State Convention. The State Convention will be held on June 7, 8 and 9 in Houston, Texas. Delegates and alternates elected at the State Convention will go to the Democratic National Convention in Charlotte, North Carolina which will be held September 3-6, 2012.

"As one of the largest and most diverse delegations in the country, the Texas Democratic Party will make certain that all voices of our broad constituency are heard

at our National Convention," said TDP Chair Boyd Richie.

## Coke County will hold Republican Party County Convention April 21

Coke County Republican Chairman David Kitten has announced that the 2012 Coke County Republican Convention will be held Saturday, April 21, 2012, in the Commissioners Courtroom at the Coke County Courthouse starting at 10 am.

The Coke County Republican Convention is held in even-numbered election years, as part of the statewide and national Republican convention process. The purposes of the convention are to choose delegates and alternates to the Republican Party of Texas (RPT) State Convention, currently scheduled for June 7-9 in Fort Worth, and to consider resolutions or statements on policy issues to send to the State Convention for eventual inclusion in the state and national Party platform.

As a result of the substantial changes in the election calendar in 2012, the Coke County Republican Party will not be conducting precinct conventions on the evening of the May 29 Primary Election and will be incorporating all Party business into the county convention on April 21. All attendees have the right to seek to become a state delegate and to bring

forth resolutions for consideration by the convention. The convention will be open to any registered voter who signs an oath of affiliation identifying himself or herself as a Republican.

In making the announcement, County Chairman Kitten said, "Although the timing of this year's convention schedule has changed for Coke County Republicans, we are more enthusiastic than ever about coming together for this important event. On behalf of our County Party, I invite all interested Coke County Republicans to join us on Saturday, April 21, in the County Commissioners Courtroom to participate in discussions and decisions that will carry forward to our State Republican Convention and beyond. I also wish to emphasize that this convention is not to be confused with the Coke County Conservative Convocation that will be held on April 12 at the County Park in Robert Lee."

These propositions will appear only on the Republican primary ballot. They are intended to give State and National officials an indication of the will of the people.

**School Choice:**

The state should fund education by allowing dollars to follow the child instead of the bureaucracy, through a program which allows parents the freedom to choose their child's school, public or private, while also saving sig-

nificant taxpayer dollars.

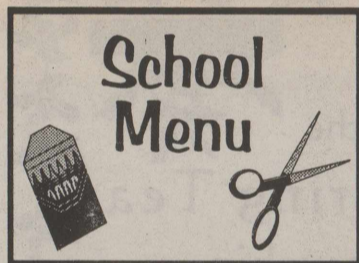
## Longhorns place first at District track meet

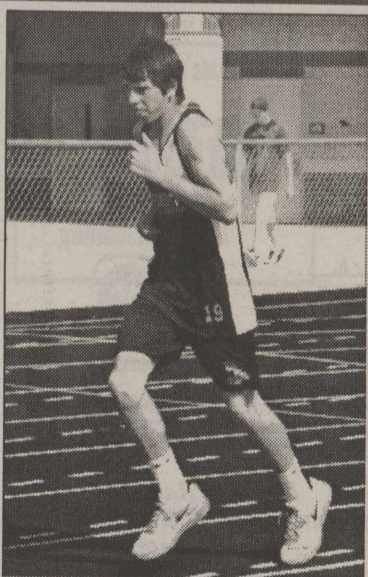
