

Other totals included Bryan Swecker with 76, Andra Arrott with 76, Kerry Lee with 65 and Blain McGinnis with 22.

The Robert Lee ISD bond election was held to decide whether or not voters in the Robert Lee Independent School District are in favor or opposed to the proposed issuance of bonds to finance the \$1,500,000 for school improvements. There were 170 votes cast for the proposition and 86 votes against it.

All the items listed below should be stored in a safe deposit box and/or fireproof storage for the home.

- · Birth, Marriage and Death Certificates
- · Adoption and Custody
- Citizenship and Naturalization Papers
- · Separation and Divorce Paperwork
- Settlement Agreements
- · Military Documents Diplomas
- Transcripts · Audit Records
- · Insurance Records
- · IRA Contributions

- · Real Estate Records. Such as Real property deeds, title papers, abstracts, mortgage & lien documents, tax assessment notices, purchase contracts and records of capital improvements. Be sure to include any rental properties.

· Social Security Card -In the past, we were told to carry our card with us, but the SSA now advises that the card not be carried with us, unless we are using it to show an employer or for other specific identification purposes.

Store in fireproof home storage.

· Advance Directives (living will/durable power-of-attorney for health care). Should be placed in fireproof storage in the home or safety deposit box. Copies should be held by your agents

· Insurance policies and records of claims fireproof storage in home, with list of policies in safety deposit box.

· Inventory of household goods and appraisals store in safety deposit box with copy in home file. Update once a year.

· Inventory of valuable papers - home file and keep copy with trusted friend. Update annually.

USDA Seeks Applications for Grants to Improve the Quality of Rural Housing


Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack announced today that applications for grants are being accepted to help low- and very-low-income rural residents repair their homes.

"These grants help limitedincome rural homeowners make necessary repairs and improvements for safer, healthier and more energy-efficient dwellings," Vilsack said. "I strongly encourage all eligible organizations to apply for this funding."

"The costs associated with maintaining a home are a challenge for many rural homeowners," said Paco Valentin, USDA Rural Development State "USDA Rural Director. vide housing rehabilitation funding to help rural Texans meet and improve their housing needs, a critical component to the long term sustainability of our communities."

USDA Rural Development is offering Housing Preservation Grants to intermediaries such as town or county governments, public agencies, federally recognized Indian Tribes, and nonprofit and faith-based organizations. The grants are then distributed to qualified homeowners or owners of multi-family rental properties or cooperative dwellings who rent to low- and very-low-income residents. USDA does not provide funding directly to homeowners under this program.
