Coke County Attorney Nancy Arthur, 40 votes;

- Commissioner Precinct 1 Troy Gene Montgomery, 10 votes;
- Commissioner Precinct 3 Gaylon Pitcock, 16 votes;

Precinct 1 Constable Marshall Millican, 23 votes;

Democratic County Chairman Robert Houck, 37 votes.
Coke County Republican voters agreed for the most part with other voters in Texas on the state and national races.
Mitt Romney in his race for the Republican Presidential nomination garnered 402 votes in Coke County included in the 993,086 votes statewide.
David Dewhurt in his race for the US Senate seat held by Kay Bailey Hutchinson garnered 348 votes in Coke County included in the 622,420 votes statewide. This put him at only $44.60 \%$ of the vote statewide and forcing a runoff election with Ted Cruz. Cruz received 89 votes in the county and 477,750 votes statewide for an overall percentage of 34.23 .
Current US Representative for District 11 Mike Conaway garnered 379 votes in Coke County included in the 48,570 votes in the district. Closest challenger Chris Younts garnered $26.42 \%$ of the vote in the county ( 140 votes) compared to $18.70 \%(12,913$ votes) in the district.
Texas State Senator Bob Duncan easily overcame challenger E.M. Garza in Coke County, 390-53, and also in District 28 with over $85 \%$ of the votes cast.
In the hotly contested race for 51st Judicial District Attorney, Allison Palmer received 254 votes in Coke County. Challengers Andrew Graves and Nathan Butler received 101 and 96 respectively. It appears at presstime that she received over $50 \%$ of the vote overall in this district and a runoff election will not be necessary.
There were five propositions on the Republican ballot.

- Proposition 1 - School Choice, For 421 - Against 88, Statewide For 84.56\% Against $15.43 \%$;
- Proposition 2 - Repeal Obamacare, For 504, Against 21, Statewide For $92.85 \%$ Against 7.14\%;
- Proposition 3 - Public Prayer, For 511 - Against 29, Statewide For 91.30\% Against 8.69\%;
- Proposition 4 - Balanced Budget/Controlling Government Growth, For 500 - Against 12, Statewide For $94.00 \%$ - Against 5.99;

Proposition 5 Redistricting, For 375 Against 85, Statewide For $75: 58 \%$ - Against $24.41 \%$. Just as the Democratic

Primary in Coke County posted low numbers, so did the Democratic Primary across the state.
President Obama posted 24 votes in Coke County and claimed $88.21 \% \quad(517,540$ votes) of the vote statewide.

Democratic challengers for Sen. Hutchinson's seat will face a runoff with no clear winner in the county or statewide. Paul Sadler garnered 12 votes in the county to Grady Yarbrough's 11. Statewide, Paul Sadler posted $35.12 \%$, Grady Yarbrough posted $25.82 \%$, Addie Allen posted $22.90 \%$ and Sean Hubbard posted $16.14 \%$.
The Democrats had three propositions on their ballot.

- Proposition 1 - In-state high school graduate eligible for tuition/legal status, For 34 - Against 14, Statewide For 84.95\% - Against $15.04 \%$;

Proposition 2
Legislature fund colleges with affordable tuition and fees, For 35 - Against 11 Statewide For 92.60\% Against 7.39\%;

- Proposition 3 - Vote to legalize casino gambling with all funds for education, For 29 Against 19, Statewide For 73.70\% - Against $26.29 \%$.
