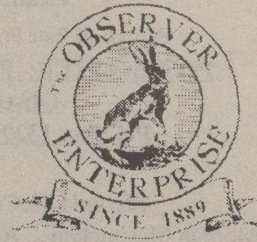

Alta Bell was born June 3, 1922, in Robert Lee to Alta and Alley Bilbo. Her parents were both natives of Coke County.

The Rev Jane Vaughan, pastor, began the church service

by announcing Alta Bell's celebration and the church family sang "Happy Birthday" to the honoree. They also sang the song for Maci Knight, Alta Bell's great-granddaughter, who was born on June 3 just ten years ago.

Grandson Nicholas Kay was in charge of cooking and serving the luncheon. Assisting were Mark Kay, Judy Kay, Jan Hungate, Bobby Hungate, Kayce Hungate, Tom Boren, Larissa Kay, Kaylyn Kay, and Maci Knight.

The menu included beef

brisket, beans, slaw, peach cobbler, and birthday cake.

Alta Bell graduated from Robert Lee High School in 1939. She graduated from Sul Ross State College in 1943 and taught business subjects at Ballinger High School for one year. She returned to Sul Ross in Alpine to work in the business office. Alta Bell Bilbo and Lamar Kay were married on August 24, 1947 in the First United Methodist Church in Robert Lee. The next August she received her Master's degree and Lamar received his Bachelor degree. Lamar was employed by the Soil Conservation Service.

After living in Childress, Lubbock, and Van Horn, he was transferred back to Alpine. Alta Bell went back to Sul Ross and became an accounting professor. She later established the Vocational Office Education program at Alpine High School. She retired May, 1982.

Alta Bell is in active member of the Alpine Methodist Church. She continues to serve on the board, attend UMW, and teaches the Sunday school lesson when it is her turn. She is also an active member of the Big Bend Retired Teachers Association and Delta Kappa Gamma.

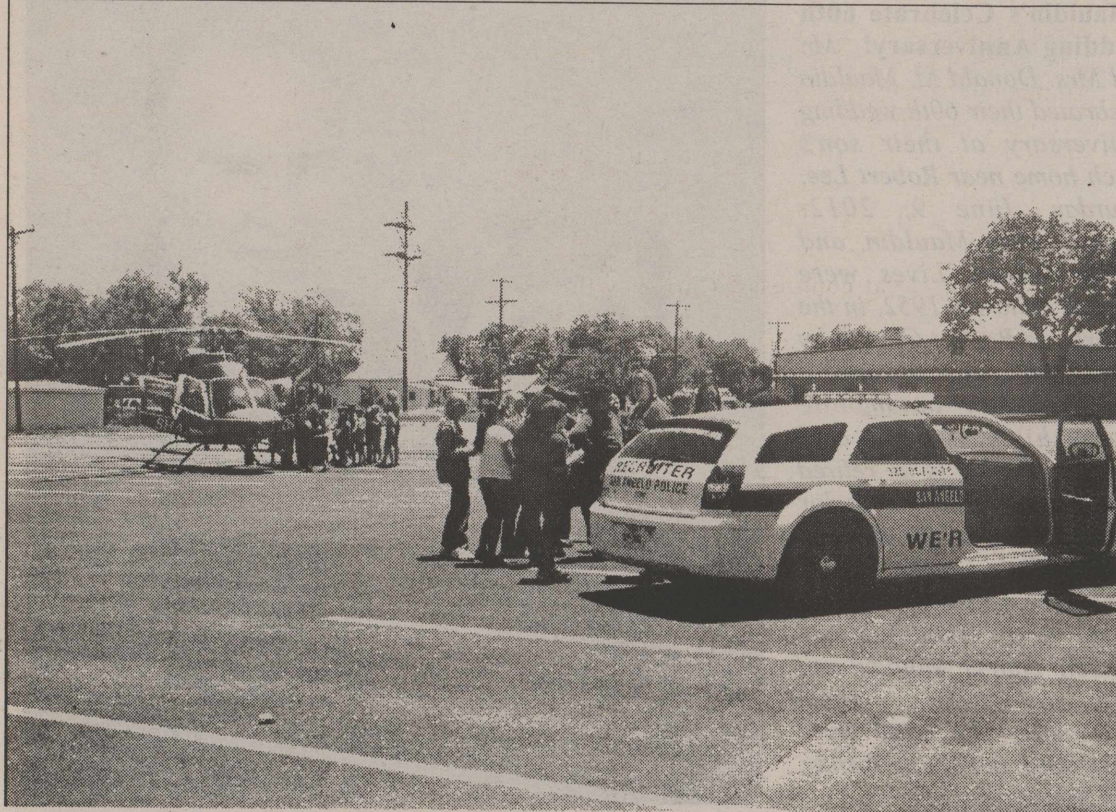

**Career Fair!** Bronte High School recently hosted their 9th Annual Career Fair. The students began their day with a special program presented by the Permian Basin Area Health Foundation. The program featured the different types of careers associated with a crime scene investigation and students were able to learn about some of the techniques involved in solving crimes. After the presentation, the students gathered in the auditorium to listen to motivational speaker, Kerri Mikulik, she spoke about setting goals and plans for the future. 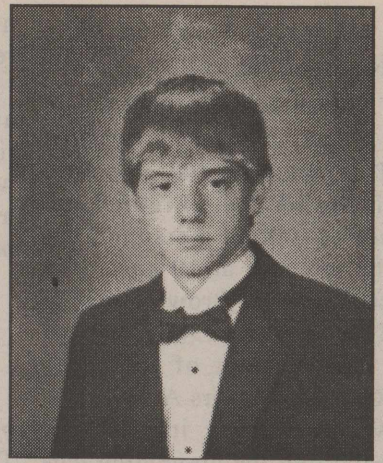
Emily is majoring in Business Administration with

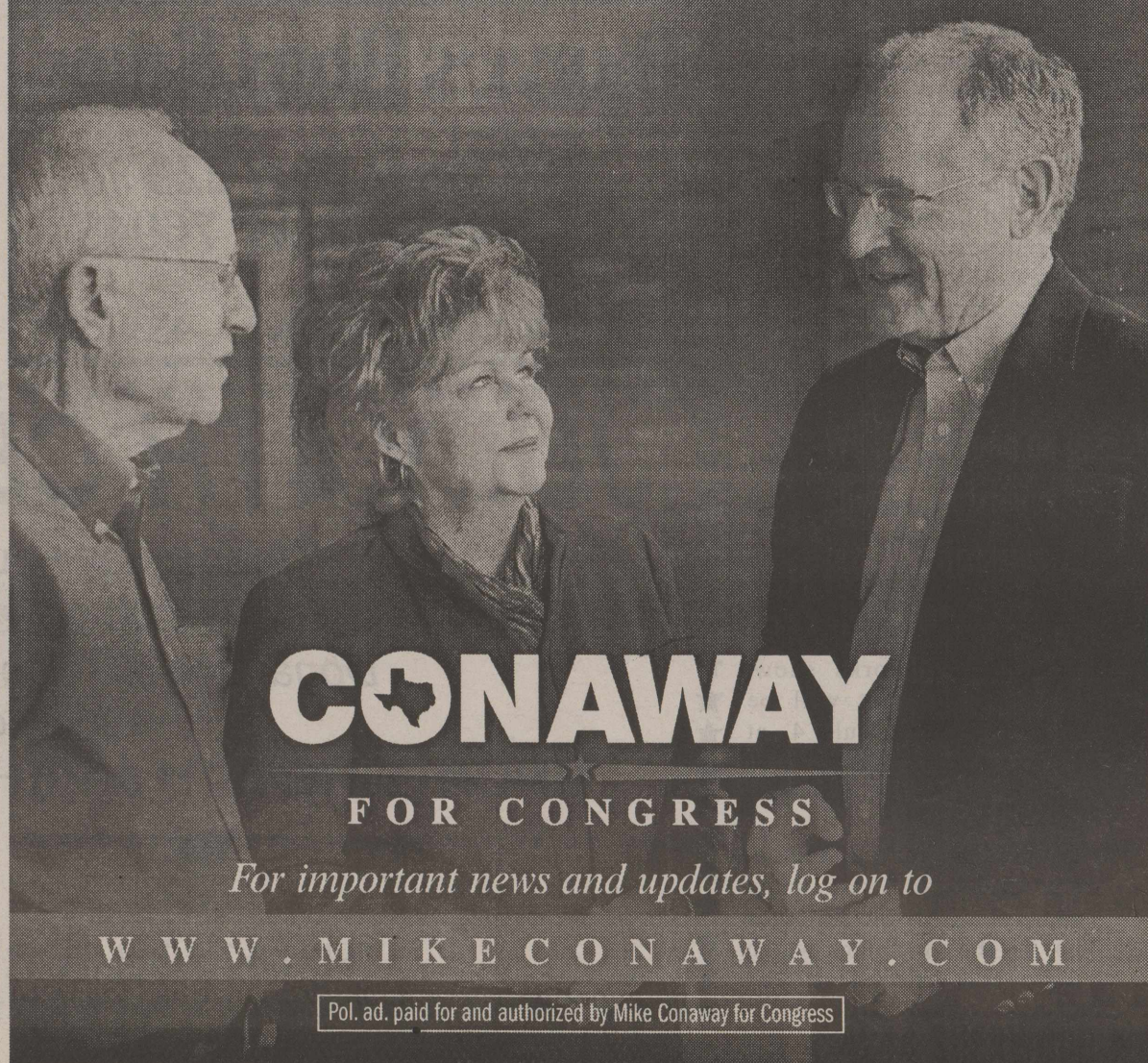

### COUNTRY AGENTS NEWS

AgriLIFE EXTENSION Agent

Being your county extension agent I feel that part of my job is to make known the opportunities that exist in the Texas 4-H program. 4-H offers the traditional opportunities such as stock shows, food show, photography contest and the fashion show, which are some of the traditional well know 4-H programs; however, there are many non-traditional programs/opportunities that Texas 4-H offers today that I feel have the possibility to change a young person's life.

Texas 4-H program offers numerous natural resource educational events that allow you to gain insight about the issues that society faces today regarding natural resources, learn better stewardship of our natural resources and gain insight about careers in the natural resource field. A few of the projects that 4-H offers is plant ID and range evaluation/judging these projects

are put on as contests where the counties form a team that represents the county at the district level and the winners advance to the state contest at Texas 4-H round-up. The newest 4-H natural resource project is known as the WHEP program (Wildlife Habitat Evaluation Program). This program is designed to educate youth where they can develop a wildlife management plan, while developing life skills such as critical thinking, public speaking and problem solving skills. These concepts are thought by the way of contests that are held at the district and state levels. Any of the 4-H natural resource projects would be beneficial to youth desiring a career in any natural resource field.

One 4-H program that deserves special attention is Texas 4-H Congress, this event is held biennial on the even-numbered years at the Texas Capital in Austin, Texas. The objective of this

event is to educate 4-H'ers on the state's political system. Each 4-H member that attends plays the role of a senator, representative, press corps or lobbyist for the duration of the mock congress. Each 4-H attendee is required to submit a bill prior to arriving at congress that will be debated in committee and will go through the congressional system throughout the week of congress. This 4-H event offers a fun interactive way to educate 4-H'ers about the state's political system and would be beneficial to a 4-H member desiring a career in any type of public service.

A program that is a strong

The Observer/Enterprise tradition in Coke County is the Shooting Sports program. This program had a great run last year competing at the 4-H shooting sports extravaganza at the Texas 4-H Center in Brownwood, Texas. Currently this program is on a summer break; however, they will be shooting again in the fall. Some of the many benefits of this program are learning gun safety, critical thinking, and self defense.

A program that every 4-H member can receive a benefit from is the Consumer Decision Making contest. In this project county 4-H

teams compete in judging items that are used on a daily basis from cell phone plans to vehicles. The 4-H members are given a scenario where they must judge a class of items to determine what product best fits the individual's needs that are listed in the scenario. 4-H members that participate in this project learn skills that would be a benefit in going into the sales and marketing industry while also learning how to get the best reward for the least amount.

These are a small sample of the projects that are possible in 4-H, whatever your interest is there is a 4-H project for it.

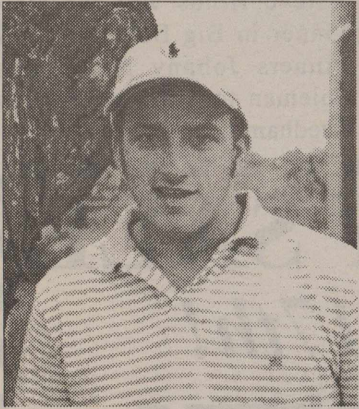

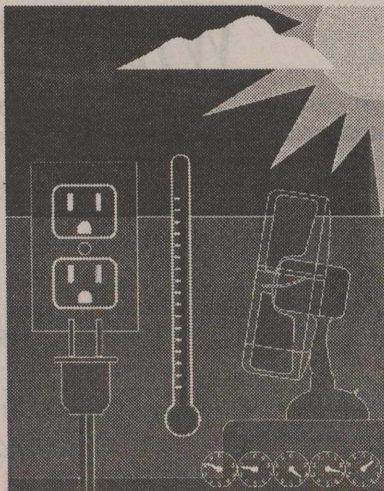

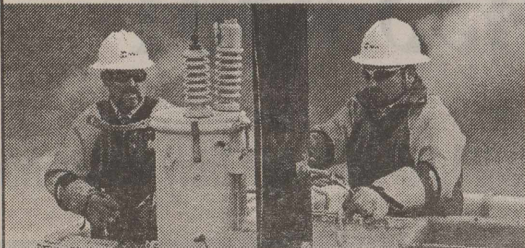
