Rainwater Harvesting

An unused resource is getting more attention as lakes go dry, water tables drop and as society strives to conserve our natural resources. We are forced to take inventory of the resources we have, the ones we use and the ones that go unused. Harvesting the rainwater off of roof tops is a practice that many people today have lost. On average, you can collect 0.6 gallons of water per square foot in a one-inch rainfall event. For example, if you have a barn on your place that is 30 by 50 feet - giving the total roof surface area of 1,500 square feet; in a one inch rainfall event, you would be able to collect 900 gallons of water.

To be able to collect the rainwater, you will need to install a rainwater collection system on your building. This comes with a price that varies on a few factors. Does the building already have gutters on it and what kind of tank you will use.


Let's say the building does not have gutters on it. The cost of installing gutters will be \$3.00-4.50 per foot of gutter. For a building 50' long, you will need 100 foot of gutter costing approximately \$3.75 per foot for a total of \$375 for the gutters.

Once your gutters are set up, the only other main cost is the collection tank. This can cost \$0.50-\$1.00 per

gallon of storage depending on the size of the tank. Since a 1 inch rainfall event will give us 900 gallons, let's plan for a multiple inch rainfall event by buying a 3,000 gal tank at approximately \$1,500. Using these figures, the estimated cost of the system is \$1,875, depending on the amount of pvc pipe needed to plumb the system in. The water this system collects at this point can be useful to water the landscaping, livestock or if you want to go farther, it is possible to add additional filtration and drink rainwater when available. However; it will greatly increase the cost of the system.

the POA is to be used to handle real estate matters, it must be recorded in the county where the land is located.

Another important concept when considering a Power of Attorney is if the Principal wants the POA to remain in force if the Principal becomes mentally incompetent because of an accident or illness. These are called "Durable". A General POA or a Limited POA can be "Durable" and they remain effective or can be triggered into effect after a doctor certifies that the "Principal" is mentally incapacitated. A POA that becomes effective only upon the mental incapacity of the Principal is also called a "Springing" POA.

The Principal may terminate a POA at any time that they are competent to manage their own legal affairs. To terminate a POA the Principal should notify any and destroy the original and any copies of the POA, and that may have been relying

Agent to conduct business on behalf of the Principal that the POA has been revoked.

A POA also terminates upon the death of the Principal. In other words, when the Principal dies so does the POA and any authority of the Agent is revoked. The Agent is no longer authorized to act on behalf of what would now be the estate of the Principle.

One important point to remember - a Power of Attorney is only as good as someone's willingness to accept or honor it. Any third party presented with the Power of Attorney has the right to tell the Agent they will not accept or honor the POA.
