Events include barrel racing, pole bending, straight-away barrel racing, flag racing, and more.

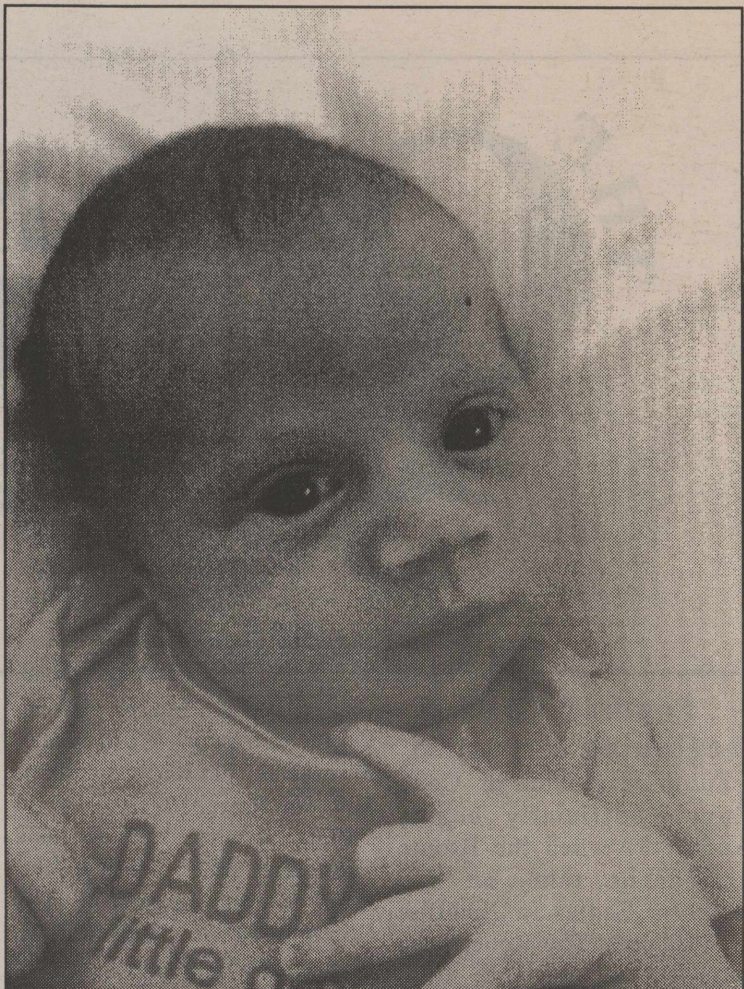
Children who don't ride are welcome to participate in the boot scramble and the stick horse race.

BHS Class of 2014 Fun Run slated

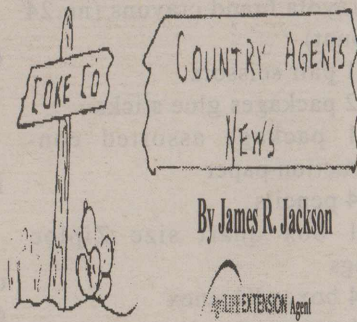

As we leave summer behind and move into fall and the hunting seasons are growing near, land managers begin to think what they could have done different to manage the wildlife populations to improve chances of having that trophy hunt this year. In many cases, now is the time to start the management practices to move your operation towards an intensive management practice.

As Dr. Dale Rollins says "the key to wildlife management is know your plants and knowing how to manipulate them". An easy way to manipulate the plants is known as discing, by dragging the disc through the land you are causing a soil disturbance and are moving the land from grassland to increasing the forb production. The three main species of wildlife that we all love here in Coke County are the deer, turkey and quail. All benefit from a small area of increased forb production.

For example when you increase forb production you also increase insect abundance in that area. The quail and turkey consume insects as a large part of their diet when they are available, which is due to the increased protein content of the insects. When you increase forb production you also increase the amount of seed producing plants. This provides more food for the quail, dove and turkey when the insects are not available.

The discing benefits the deer by increasing forb production in a small area of the pasture. Even though the deer do not consume insects or seeds they benefit by consuming the forbs. As a general rule the forbs are higher in protein content than the grass. And the deer will prefer to browse on the more nutritious plants that will be growing in the disc area.

The species of forbs that come up in a disc area can be determined by the time of year that you disc. For example when you disturb the soil in October you receive a mix-

ture of forbs that contain ragweed, sunflower and other various forbs when you disc in December you receive more of a monoculture of sunflowers. If your goal of wildlife management is to increase seed and insect production for quail, turkey and dove then December will be the best time to cause the soil disturbance. If you want to focus more on multispecies management you can benefit from causing a disturbance in October.

USDA Seeks Applications for Grants To Help Agricultural Producers Bring Increased Value to Their Products

Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack today invited agricultural producers to apply for grants to increase the value of their products.

"Producers can greatly enhance the bottom line of their businesses and improve their economic prospects when they improve the value of their products, thus expanding their markets and customer base," Vilsack said. "The Value Added Producer Grant program (VAPG) has a proven track record of doing just that and I am pleased to announce that we are inviting producers to apply for these grants by the deadline. The funds in this program enable America's farmers, ranchers and rural business owners to find ways to expand their product offerings, revenue streams and create more economic opportunity by bringing additional value to what they already produce."

"Investing in the creative ideas of innovative Texans will result in a positive step towards rural economic and community development," said Paco Valentin, Texas Rural Development State Director. "We are pleased to offer this opportunity to rural entrepreneurs and producers whose endeavors will increase the value of agricultural commodities and therefore promote job creation in their communities."

Applicants have until October 15, 2012 to apply. Vilsack emphasized that far too many producers are missing out on significant economic opportunities when their products are enhanced further away from the farm. "When our producers keep their value-added activities closer to the farm, it not only improves their bottom line; it strengthens our rural econ-

omy and strengthens our rural communities."

USDA Rural Development is making up to \$14 million in grants available for projects that help farmers and ranchers produce bio-based products from agricultural commodities. The grants, which are competitively awarded, are available for planning activities or for working capital expenses, but not for both. The maximum grant amount is \$100,000 for planning grants and \$300,000 for working capital grants. Generating new products, creating and expanding marketing opportunities and increasing producer income are the goals of the VAPG program.

Businesses of all sizes are encouraged to apply, but priority will be given to operators of small and medium-sized farms or ranches that are structured as family farms, beginning farmers or ranchers, or those owned by socially-disadvantaged farmers or ranchers. Grants are available for projects up to 36 months in duration.

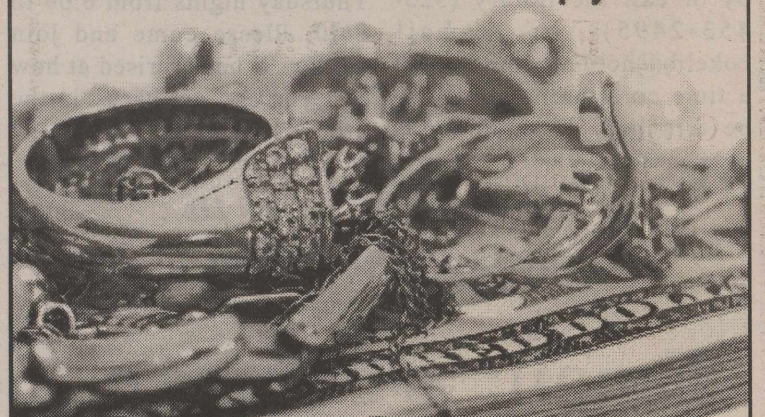

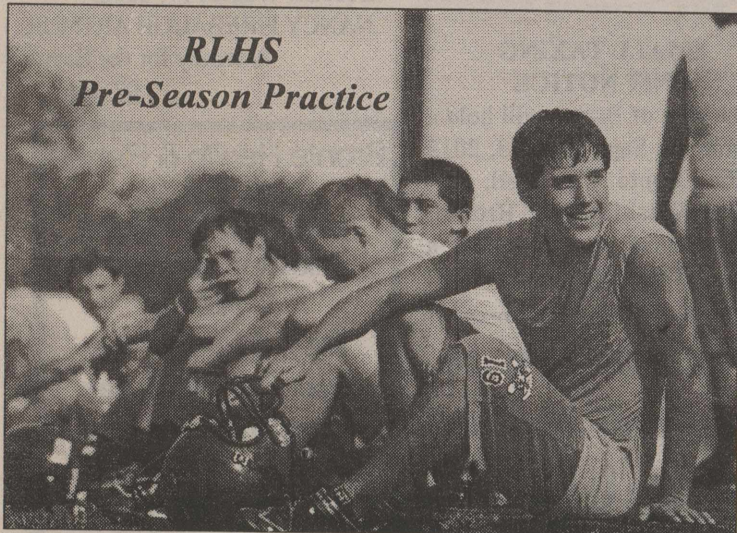

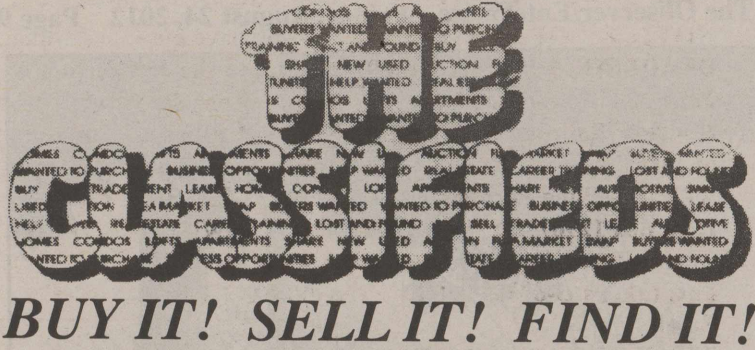

Your benefit letter from the Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC) is your documentation for free meals. If you have not already received a letter from your school stating that your household is eligible for free meals, you may take your HHSC benefit letter to your child nutrition office to be certified for free meals. - 3. 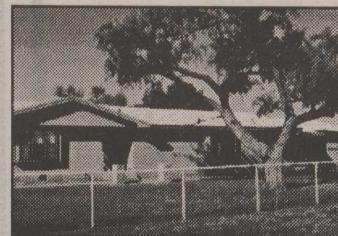
