Football season begins tonight for local teams

Football season in Bronte, Robert Lee and Blackwell officially begins tonight with the Bronte Longhorns taking on the Junction Eagles in Junction at 7:30 pm. The Robert Lee Steers take on the Eden Bulldogs in Robert Lee at 7:30 pm and the Blackwell Hornets face the Westbrook Wildcats at home at 8:00 pm.

With the beginning of football season, the annual "Football Sponsor" pages are beginning with this issue of the Observer/Enterprise.

I had a chance to visit with the head coaches of each of these teams on Monday to get their take on the upcoming season.

The fans in Robert Lee can head into the season cheering for their Steers who are ranked 3rd in the state right now in 6-Man Division II.

Coach Avants was very pleased with the Steers' performance in the preseason scrimmages. "We dominated Westbrook, tied May and almost beat Rankin who beat us 64-0 in last year's scrimmage. These were a good measuring stick."

He considers their strengths to be the depth in their bench with 25 kids on the team who have lots of experience. They are returning every starter on both sides of the ball.

When asked about possible weaknesses, the only thing which might be considered a weakness is a couple of new students who are trying to learn the system. So far, there are no injuries.

Looking ahead to their district opponents, Avants said that Blackwell should be

good - good coach and good numbers of players. "Panther Creek always fields a quality team. "We're taking one game at a time. Our goal is to win district and then win in the play-offs." Hopefully, this is Robert Lee's year. The Steers have not won a play-off game since 1994.

The Blackwell Hornets have a new head coach in Clint Lowry. During our conversation, he felt like their scrimmages went well and that his kids were picking stuff up pretty quick.

The Hornets have 3 seniors, 7 juniors, 7 sophomores, and 4 freshman on their team this year so depth will not be a problem. They will even play a JV schedule. With all of this experience and no current injuries, Blackwell should have a nice season start.

Coach Lowry targeted the Robert Lee Steers as the toughest team in their district, but he has a lot of confidence in his players. "I'm honored to be working with these kids. They work hard and try to do everything we ask of them."

Bronte Head Coach Kevin Burns said "Our expectations are still the same. We want to defend our back to back district championships and we feel that our pre-district schedule will prepare us for district competition."

The Longhorns have had great teams the last few years, but depth is now an issue with only 22 students on the team. Coach Burns felt that the scrimmages gave them a chance to evaluate the players through competition.

Although their team numbers are smaller, they are

returning four of their starting offensive line. They still have a lot of quickness on the defense. The lack of depth though means the players have to each learn 3 or 4 positions each.

"Our district is going to be a dogfight," stated Coach Burns, "Eldorado, Miles, and Christoval all have a bunch of kids returning and so does TLCA."

Dove season set to open Saturday

It's time once again for area hunters to try their luck with the gray ghosts of the shooting world. Saturday morning, September 1, 2012, will mark the beginning of a new dove season in Coke County and throughout the Northern and Central zones of Texas. The Northern dove hunting zone is basically the area above Interstate 20, with the Central zone being bordered on the north by Interstate 20 and on the southern end by Interstate 10. The South zone is below Interstate 10, and their season does not open until September 21.

As to our outlook for this year's season, I am predicting a pretty strong beginning of the season, at least, in spite of our continued drought during the latter part of the summer. I have seen as many as 200 whitewings in a group around the house, as well as a large number of collared

doves almost every day. What I haven't seen is many mourning dove except for those few local birds that stay here year round.

I think that like last year, there will be some hunting opportunities at the very beginning of the season. Once those birds get some hunting pressure, they'll be off to a safe zone, where they don't get shot at so much. Who's to say when or if we'll be getting any northern mourning doves migrating through the county? With the dry conditions, it looks pretty iffy right now, anyway.

There will always be some opportunities around tanks and water sources late in the afternoons (if we have any standing water left). And, there should be a good supply of dove around grain fields, if you are lucky enough to have access to any of these feeding areas.

The season will run from September 1 through October 24, 2012, with an additional late season from December 22 through January 6, 2013. Daily bag limit is 15 mourning, white-winged, and white-tipped doves in the aggregate, to include not more than 2 whitetips. Possession limit is twice the daily bag limit.

Legal shooting hours are from one-half hour before sunrise to sunset. Don't forget to plug those autoloaders

and pump shotguns, as dove are considered migratory birds, and plugs must be in place so that the firearm can hold no more than three shells.

A new hunting license will be required to hunt this fall, along with a \$7.00 migratory game bird stamp if you will be hunting dove or waterfowl, plus another \$7.00 stamp if you will be hunting upland game birds, which includes quail, turkey, and pheasant. If you will be hunting waterfowl, you will also need to purchase a \$17 migratory game bird stamp endorsement (duck stamp).

Best of luck in your dove hunting endeavors this fall. Make a mental note to make safety your main concern as you take to the hunting fields this fall.

The landfill accepts ONLY brush, shrubs, and tree limbs. Residents are reminded that the landfill will be permanently closed on October 27, 2012.

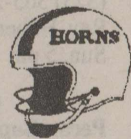

Your Coke County Tea Party met this past Friday. We were honored to have two special guests: Russ Duerstine, a professional political consultant; and our County Treasurer, Hal Spain. Some of our group was absent; they saw the movie "OBAMA 2016" in San Angelo. We recommend this movie as an eye-opener for everyone.

We learned so much at this meeting. First, we were introduced to potential tax increases across our county. Then information was provided about other tax increases including a new tax for OBAMACARE on home sales, starting in 2013 of 3.8%. That TAXMAGEDDON will mean the loss of the Bush Era Tax Cuts - raising all our taxes including the lowest from 10% to 15%. The "Marriage Penalty" is back. Couples filing jointly will have a higher tax rate than individuals. Capital gains taxes go from 15% to 20%. The Death Tax will now be collected on estates of \$1 million or more. It had previously only been collected on estates valued \$5 million and over. The Death Tax is especially bad if your property is valued at \$1 million or more - most beneficiaries cannot afford to pay the taxes.

We then reviewed the 2010 CENSUS results. There were 3,301 residents, a loss of more than 200 from the 2000 CENSUS. Two other statistics stood out. Our county has 1,220 persons who are aged 55 and up. 22.4% of our population are aged 18 and below, and they live in poverty. A lively discussion occurred over the CENSUS figures and the possibility of raising taxes.

Mr. Duerstine provided much needed training to the group. He told us our most important Texas race was for the Texas Third Court of Appeals. This court handles all appealed state lawsuits. The candidates who are supported by Tea Parties are: David Puryear, Bob Pemberton, Jeff Rose and Scott Field. It is important to have conservatives on this court, since this court's decisions are rarely sent to the Supreme Court. Then Mr. Duerstine trained us on "Where can we best help" to elect conservatives. He provided sample questions to ask, how we can participate locally and nationally. We agreed to work first in our county to gain experience, then to take our experiences and work in the swing states.

Mr. Spain briefed us on where our tax money is spent. Our county has a budget of approximately \$1.9 million. Approximately \$1.6 million are for personnel costs. This is salaries, FICA, healthcare, insurance etc. This is a double-edged sword. While this figure appears huge, some of our salaries are far below neighboring counties. Our costs are mainly financed by property taxes, about \$1,646,000 with the remaining coming from county fees. So you can see, there are no easy solutions.

We encourage all conservatives in Coke County to come out and work with us. Our next meeting will be in approximately two weeks. Look for the announcement in the *Observer/Enterprise*.

Coke County Comment

The importance of Coke County in the Texas Third Court of Appeals election.

If you think that your vote in Coke County can't make a huge difference in elections, then read this and know that the Coke County voters can have leverage far beyond the voters in Houston, Dallas, or San Antonio.

The Texas Third Court of Appeals sits in Travis County. Coke County is part of the 24 county district that elects judges for the Texas Third Court of Appeals. Along with Coke and Travis counties, Bastrop, Bell, Blanco, Burnet, Caldwell, Comal, Concho, Fayette, Hays, Irion, Lampasas, Lee, Llano, McCulloch, Milam, Mills, Runnels, San Saba, Schleicher, Sterling, Tom Green, and Williamson counties make up the judicial district.

Travis County includes the City of Austin and is the most liberal County in the district and the state. The 23 rural counties' voting power combined is just about equal to Travis County. Therefore in elections, the decisions are almost always about 50/50 liberal - conservative.

What makes the election of conservative judges to Third Court of Appeals so important is that all lawsuits filed on behalf of the state of Texas or against the state of Texas are filed in Travis County. If a lawsuit is appealed, which almost all are, the appeal is made to the Texas Third Court of Appeals. Only 10% of the lawsuits that appear before the Texas Third Court of Appeals go on to the Supreme Court. Therefore 90% of lawsuits involving the state of Texas are decided in the Texas Third Court of Appeals.

Consider a hypothetical scenario. If the EPA files a lawsuit against the state of Texas, it will go to Third Court of Appeals. If the Liberals have control of the court, then any lawsuit involving EPA and the State of Texas would be decided in favor of the EPA. In this case, it really wouldn't matter what kind of good legislation came out of the Texas legislature because it would be struck down by the Texas Third Court of Appeals.

Actually, this scenario might not be so hypothetical. The EPA is currently planning to put several central

Texas salamanders on the endangered species list in order to halt economic development along the I-35 corridor, one of the most prosperous areas in the United States. If and when this happens, state and federal lawsuits will abound. We cannot afford to become victims of the Environmental Protection Agency as did the state of California when the EPA made the Delta smelt a protected species and impoverished one of the most productive farming areas in the entire world.

Coke County voters, November will be the time for you to go to the polls and wield your power. This year, there are four seats on the Texas Third Court of Appeals up for election. Three of those seats are held by solid constitutional minded conservatives. The fourth seat will be decided between Scott Field, a constitutional conservative who is running against Diane Henson, a complete leftist and supporter of Atty. Gen. Eric Holder. We cannot afford to let any anti-constitutional statist be seated on the Texas Third Court of Appeals. When you vote this November, vote for those who will uphold the United States Constitution and the Texas Constitution. Cast your vote for David Puryear, Bob Pemberton, Jeff Rose, and most importantly Scott Field.

My name is Ed Blackburn. I'm one of the newest strangers to these parts, although I visited here more than frequently since I was a child. I grew up in Houston, worked 30 years in the farm and ranch brokerage and appraisal business in and around the Dallas/Fort Worth area, as well as writing for the media and doing a stint

as the New Media (Internet) Director for KTVT (CBS) in Fort Worth.

But I had had enough of the Big City so I moved to San Angelo in late 2007, living 50% of my time in Angelo and the balance at my ranch south of Robert Lee.

Another "but" ... as much as I like San Angelo, last month I decided to move to my ranch and become a citizen of Coke County...just registered as a voter the other day. Enough about me.

The folks in Robert Lee have graciously greeted and embraced me in typical West Texas style, for which I'm deeply appreciative, and I hope to contribute whatever I can to the community.

More than that, Kay Hurst and Marshall Millican invited me to participate in an exciting new organization called "Vision With A Purpose (VP)," a concerned group of Robert Lee citizens who are determined to breathe fresh air into a community wounded by drought, water problems and wildfire.

I have attended several of the VP meetings and have been extremely impressed by the "get high behind" attitude of its members. The ideas floated by its members from both a short term and long term perspective are inspiring and efforts are already in the works to implement some of those ideas.

Mary Bessent recently wrote in the *Observer Enterprise*, "...through the workings of all the groups in Robert Lee who love this community, I see that the best is yet to come." How true.

As a newbie, I'm humbled by having been given the opportunity to become involved. That said, I would encourage everyone to become more involved. "Vision With A Purpose" is a good place to start.

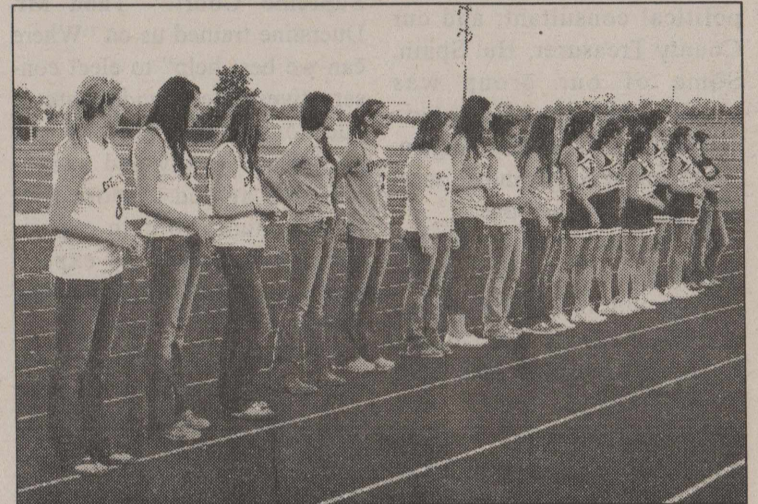
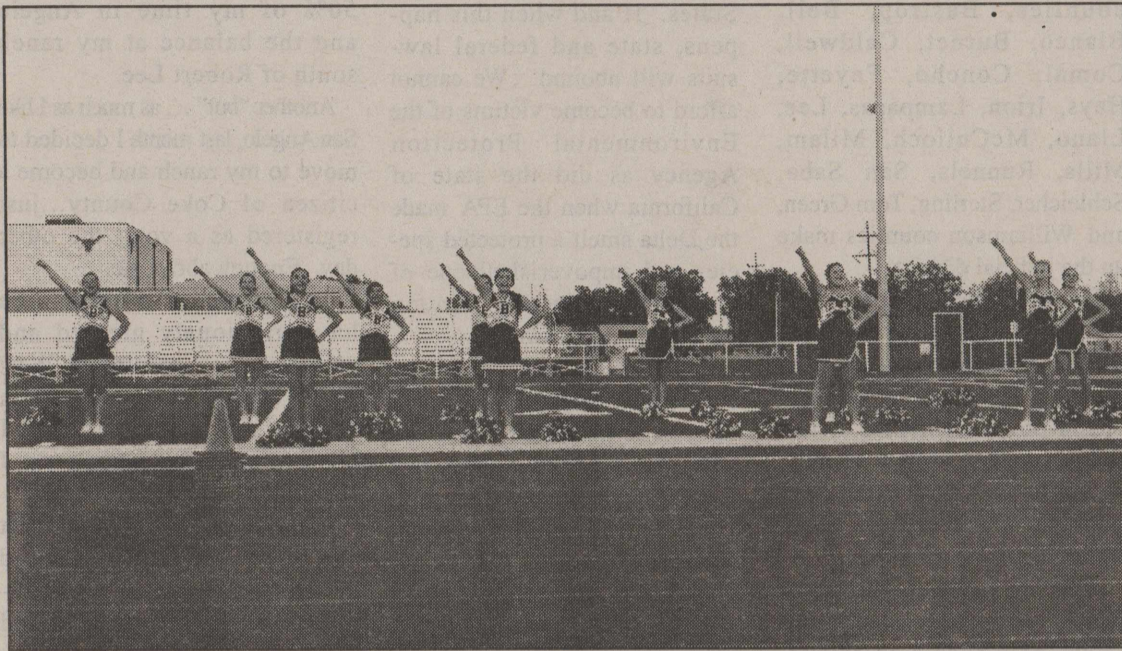

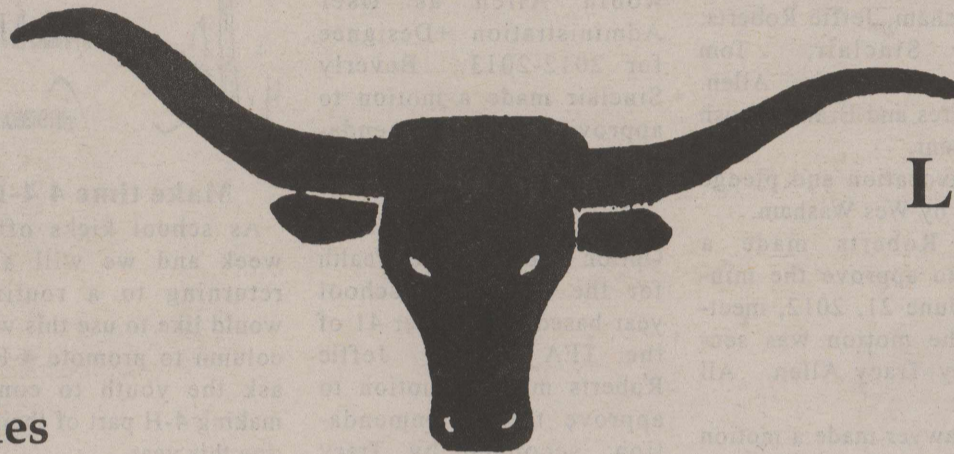

RLISD Open House set for September 10

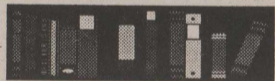

2012-2013 Insurance was discussed.

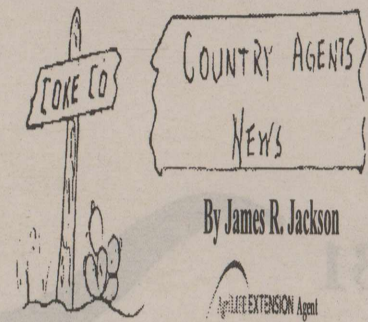

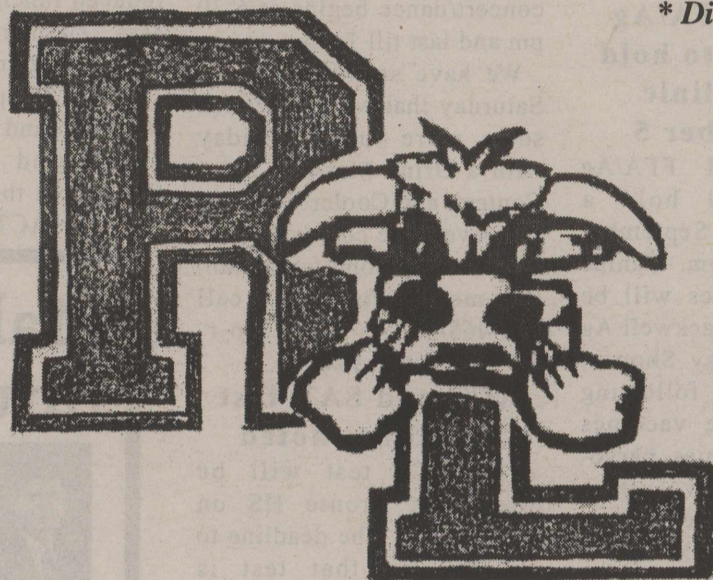

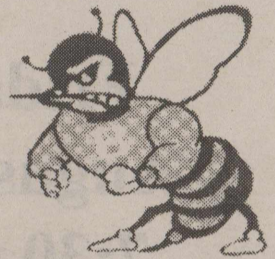

NOTICE TO WATER CUSTOMERS THE CITY OF BRONTE

Due to the lack of beneficial rain on the watershed in the last year, the level of Oak Creek Lake has dropped to a level that has triggered the "Moderate Stage" of the City's Drought Contingency Plan.

The City of Bronte has announced that the following water restrictions are now in effect:

> Residents are asked to discontinue the following uses of water:

1. Washing down of buildings, sidewalks, driveways, parking lots and other hard-surfaced areas.
2. Use of water for dust control.
3. Permitting water to run or accumulate in any gutter, bar ditch or street.
4. Recreational use of faucets, hoses and fire hydrants.

> Water for use in road construction or for oil rigs will be prohibited.

> Mandatory outdoor water use schedule will be set as follows:

1. Watering shall only occur between the hours of 8:00 pm and 12:00 midnight and between 12:00 midnight and 10:00 am. However, water is permitted at anytime if it is by means of a hand-held hose, faucet filled bucket or watering can of five (5) gallons or less, or drip irrigation.

These restrictions shall remain in effect until the level of Oak Creek Lake reaches an appropriate level.
