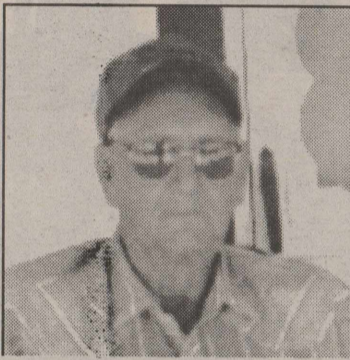

**First National Neighborhood Watch Program in Coke County registered by Bay View Estates**

The Neighborhood Watch is a program sponsored by the National Sheriff's Association and USAonWatch.org.

On September 4, 2012, the first registered Neighborhood Watch in Coke County met at the home of Tom and Beverly Prichard in Bay View Estates with Sheriff Wayne McCutchen in attendance.

The Watch is registered with National Sheriffs' Association. Bay View neighbors, Josie Castleberry and Tom and Beverly Prichard, conducted the meeting about the need to "watch out" for our families, neighbors, and our pets and livestock, which drove them to contact Sheriff McCutchen about starting a Neighborhood Watch for Bay View Estates.

Sheriff McCutchen spoke about neighbors being "eyes and ears" assistance for each other and for law enforcement. He mentioned the need to be alert for any suspicious activity in our neighborhood that would be criminal in nature. Examples of criminal activity are robbery, vandalism, drug traffic, cruelty and/or neglect and harm to humans or animals. He encouraged everyone to be conscience of any criminal activity that the Sheriffs' department should be made aware and to call them immediately.

Attendees discussed their concern about neglected home sites in Bay View Estates where trash and other articles are left unattended for years. With Texas being the hardest hit areas for West Nile Virus, the attendees are concerned these locations harbor sites for mosquitos to breed causing a heath hazard, as well as housing snakes, bees, mice and rats. Coke County has no mosquito control activities in the county, only in the towns. A suggestion was made for a "health and safety ordinance" be researched to protect county residents, which would allow owners to be notified to clean up their property for health and safety issues.

Other topics of interest discussed were First Aid/CPR training, disaster preparedness training, a neighborhood clean-up day, neighborhood garage sale, and seeking a Veterinarian to come to Bay View once a year to provide vaccinations for our pets.

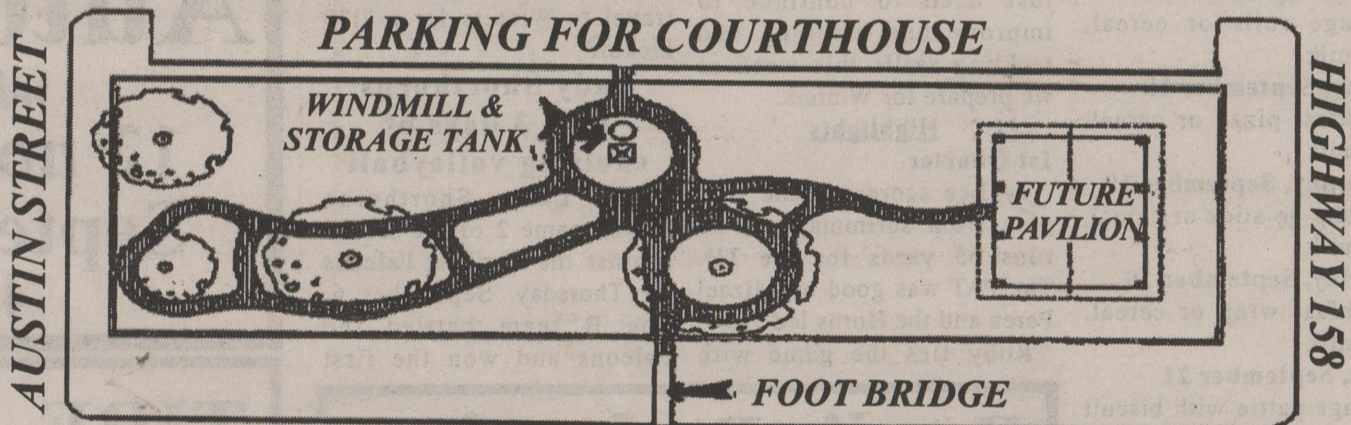

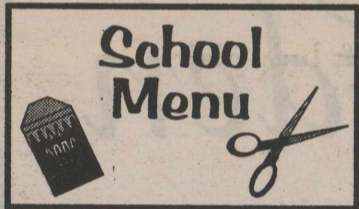

Ty completed one pass on one attempt to McGinnis for another touchdown.

The Horns at times blocked very well, but still need to work on fundamentals and adjusting to different defenses and blocking rules.

The Horns had 323 yards rushing and 20 passing overall.

Defensively, the Horns gave up 160 yards on the ground and another 123 through the air. Roby did a good job of attacking our defensive fronts and it took a little time for the kids to get adjusted to some new wrinkles by the Lions. Overall, the kids gave a good effort and played hard. We just need to continue to improve our blocking and tackling skills this week as we prepare for Winters.

### Highlights

#### 1st Quarter

Ty Lee scores on the first play from scrimmage as he runs 65 yards for the TD. The PAT was good by Mizael Perez and the Horns led 7-0. Roby ties the game with

4:11 to play in the first, but they missed the PAT. Horns lead 7-6.

#### 2nd Quarter

Nathan McGinnis finds the endzone from 11 yards out, but the PAT was missed. Horns lead 13-6.

Roby scores on a 9 yard pass just two minutes after the Longhorn TD and the PAT was good and tied the score up at 13-13.

With two minutes remaining in the first half, Ty Lee scampered 19 yards for a touchdown, but again the PAT was no good and the Horns led 19-13 at the half.

#### 3rd Quarter

Roby scores their final touchdown on a 5 yard run midway through the quarter and the PAT was good. This gave Roby the lead at 19-20.

The Longhorns would respond just 5 minutes later as McGinnis capped the scoring drive with a 2 yard run. The Longhorns would go for a 2 point conversion attempt and get it as Ty Lee scored on a keeper play to give the Horns the lead at 27-20.

#### 4th Quarter

At the 6:41 mark of the 4th quarter, Ty found McGinnis in the left corner of the endzone and Nathan made a great catch for a 20 yard touchdown. The PAT was blocked and closed out the scoring for the evening and gave the Horns the 33-20 victory.

The Horns improve to 2-0 on the season and this week travel to Winters for a 7:30 kickoff.

### Lady Shorthorns play 3 days of exciting volleyball

The B team earned playing time experience as they met up with Sterling City A team and Grape Creek A tem and B team with a few game winners, but fell short on all 3 matches.
