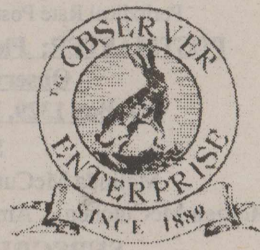

"The Reality of Islam" to be presented Wednesday evening in Bronte

Shlimon Bet Shmuel ("Sam"), a native Iraqi Christian, will speak on "The Reality of Islam" on Wednesday, September 26, at 7 pm at the Williams' building at 117 W. Main Street in Bronte.

Born in 1950 in the small village of Bet Baidey in northern Iraq, Sam showed an early interest in music, honing his gift by chanting hymns in the village church (later destroyed by Saddam Hussein). He speaks fluent English, Arabic, Farsi and Kurdish but his native language, the language of his people and his songs, the language in which he communicates his heart, is Aramaic. Yes, Aramaic — the same language spoken by Christ in communicating his heart so long ago.

Sam's life changed dramatically in August 1973 when he performed "Simele," a song he had written commemorating the 1933 massacre of 600 Assyrian Christians by the Iraqi army at the village of Simele. The subsequent targeting of Assyrian Christians ultimately led to the destruction of 63 villages and the deaths of 3,000 people. Government authorities took note of Sam's song and labeled him a "nationalistic

singer." That label made life difficult. In Iraq then as now, it doesn't pay to be noticed by the government. As a potential source of "agitation," Sam was forced to flee to Iran, beginning an odyssey that brought him to join Operation Iraqi Freedom as a contract interpreter, and eventually to Texas in 2007.

Sam will present an informal discussion about the "Reality of Islam" from a Christian perspective — and will offer attendees a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to hear the Lord's Prayer sung in Jesus' native language — Aramaic.

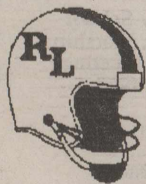

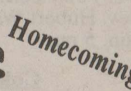

Carolynn "Carr" Prine Maddux passed from this life to the Father on Tuesday, September 11, 2012, after a courageous battle with cancer. Private graveside services were held in the Robert Lee Cemetery. Services were under the direction of Shaffer Funeral Home.

Carolynn was born to J.M. and Mary Prine in Bronte, Texas, on October 31, 1947. She lived in many parts of the world, some of which included Little Rock, Arkansas, Labrador, Canada, Big Spring and Abilene, Texas, and Biloxi, Mississippi, however, she always called the Sanco Valley her home. While away, she always looked forward to her visits there and moved back to Robert Lee in 1992 to be close to her family.

Carolynn was saved and baptized at one of the Sanco Camp Meetings by the Rev. Ernest Dewitt of San Angelo, on a ranch at Sanco, owned by the late Ira Bird. She was a Christian and it was reflected in her everyday life by the way she served and helped people.

She was a very gifted person and lived life to the fullest. Carolynn was a friend to everyone and was a servant to all people. She was employed by Mountain Creek Lodge, booking in hundreds of travelers from all over the country and adding them to her list of friends. Carolynn also worked for her brother, Kenneth Prine, who owned Kenneth's Construction, as a roofer, painter, and helper.

She was a very gifted craftsman and strived for perfection in all that she did.

Carolynn had many hobbies that she enjoyed some of which included: arrowheads and artifact hunting, rattlesnake wrangling, flying (logging many hours of flying time), sewing, and most of all just helping other people that needed help. She also loved animals, pets, and birds.

When Carolynn was hunting rattlesnakes, she kept a log book and had documented the location of over 100 dens. These log books showed the catching, selling, handling and releasing of over 4,000 Diamondback rattlesnakes. She enjoyed her experiences with the hunters but, after it became commercialized, she only caught and released instead of killing. She relocated many snakes to dens away from people protecting their rights of survival. Amazingly, although she had many close calls she was never bitten.

She is survived by her brother, Kenneth Prine; a sister, Wanda Ingram; a daughter, Shannon Maddux; a son Paul Tracey Maddux; many granddaughters, a grandson, nieces, nephews, cousins and friends. She is also survived by her Granddog Mini B.

Carolynn always had a beautiful smile and she just loved life and lived life to its fullest. Her loving ways and sweet personality will be missed by all those whose life she touched from every walk of life.

Carolynn left behind a legacy that will live on in our hearts! As Christians: Love thy neighbor with all your heart and forgive those that transgress against you.

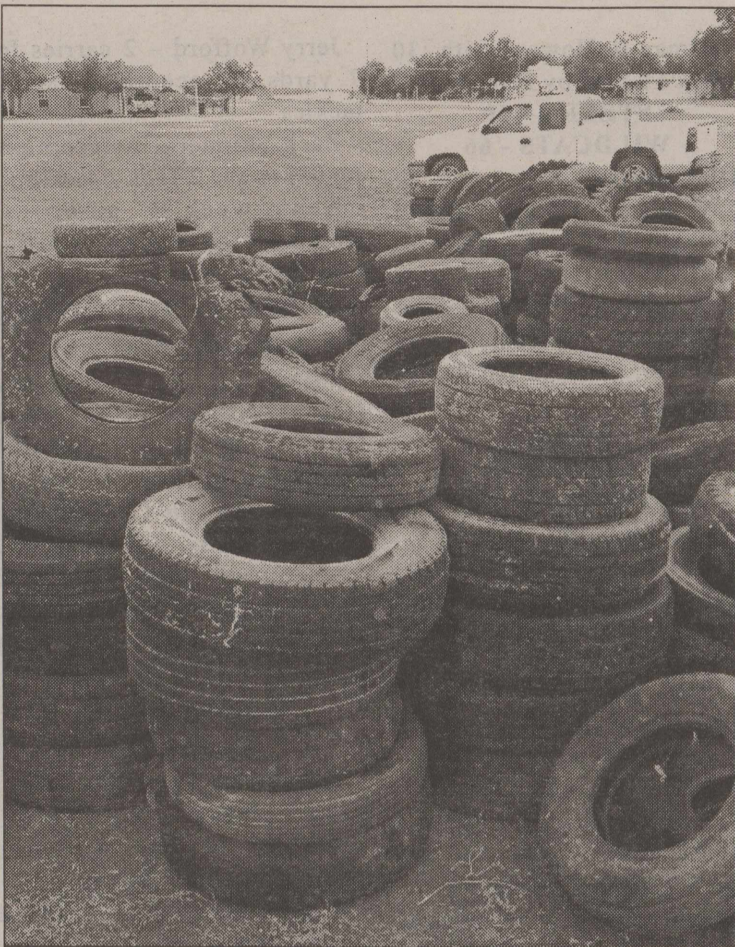

Conservationist, Hollis Farris manager of Wildcat Mountain Ranch all delivered parts of the program on Friday to the audience. The day started with a necropsy of a Bobwhite quail where the audience started learning about the quail from the inside out, the next item that was discussed habitat evaluation for quail that was followed by Dr. Rollins giving a talk on the latest research updates and different management practices that have proved successful in increas-

AN ORDINANCE LEVYING AD VALOREM TAXES FOR USE AND SUPPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL

GOVERNMENT OF THE CITY OF BRONTE FOR THE 2012-2013 FISCAL YEAR; PROVIDING FOR APPORTIONING EACH LEVY FOR SPECIFIC PURPOSES; AND PROVIDING WHEN TAXES SHALL BECOME DUE AND WHEN SAME SHALL BECOME DELINQUENT IF NOT PAID.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRONTE:

SECTION 1. That there is hereby levied and there shall be collected for the use and support of the municipal government of the City of Bronte, upon all property, real, personal, and mixed, within the corporate limits of said City subject to taxation, a tax of \$ 0.38 on each \$100.00 valuation of property, said tax being so levied and apportioned to the specific purposes here set forth:

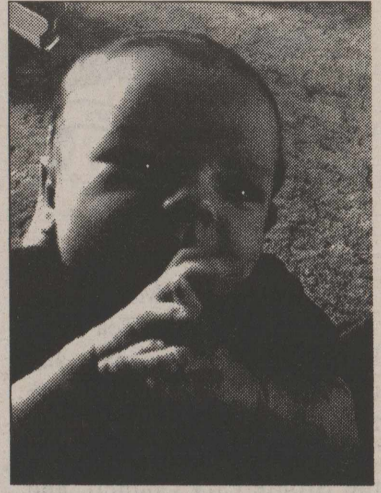
For the maintenance and support of the general government (General Fund), \$ 0.38 on each \$100.00 valuation of property.

SECTION 2. That taxes levied under this ordinance shall be due October 1, 2012, and if not paid on or before January 31, 2013, shall immediately become delinquent.

All taxes shall become a lien upon the property against which assessed, and the City assessor and collector of the City of Bronte is hereby authorized and empowered to enforce the collection of such taxes according to the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas and ordinances of the City of Bronte shall, by virtue of the tax rolls, fix and establish a lien by levying upon such property, whether real or personal, for the payment of said taxes, penalty and interest, and the interest and penalty collected from such delinquent taxes shall be apportioned to the General Fund of the City of Bronte. All delinquent taxes shall bear interest from the date of delinquency at the rate as prescribed by state law.
