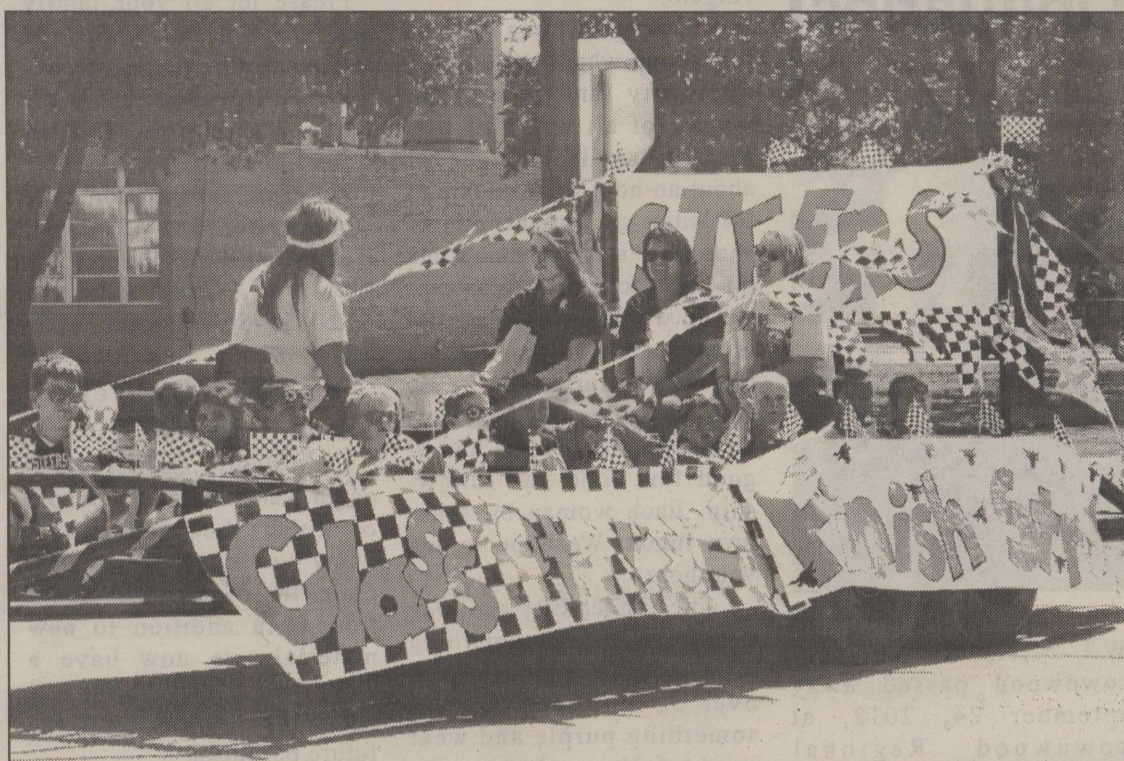

Camouflage convention set to converge on county

Don't be alarmed if you see a lot of camo type attire in Coke County and the surrounding area this weekend. No, these are not troops training to go overseas, or a new type of militia group invading the county.

These guys and gals are what most of us believe to be the premier hunters in the country. And, they have come to Coke County to try their hand at bow hunting, one of our most primitive, specialized, and challenging methods of harvesting white tailed deer and turkey.

Archery or bow season for whitetail deer and turkey begins Saturday, September 29, 2012, in Coke County and pretty much throughout the state. This year's early bow season runs through November 2, 2012, with the general gun season starting the next day, November 3, and running through January

6, 2013.

Bag limit for whitetail deer for the upcoming seasons (all seasons combined) is 5, with no more than 2 bucks. Bag limit for turkey is 4 (all seasons combined), with either sex permissible during the archery and fall gun season.

Best of luck to all those who choose to visit Coke County during the fall hunting season. And, don't forget to capture that Kodak moment with a picture, if you are successful. As hunting season approaches and everyone spends time preparing their feeders and stands in preparation to harvest that trophy buck, I would like to take this week's news column to discuss how the way you hunt the deer this year can make a difference on the quality of the deer that you will hunt in the future.

To start out, I would like you to think of the deer in terms of a livestock operation, the first question that every livestock owner needs to ask themselves is how many animals can my property support and from there determine the stocking rate for deer. As wildlife managers we need to ask ourselves how many deer can my place support. The best deer stocking rate for Coke County will be 1 deer to every 15 acres and depending on where the property is, your may have to go as low as 1 deer to every 40 acres depending on the landscape.

The next point I want to make is all the hunters typically accuse the landowner of being overstocked with livestock and blame the livestock for the poor deer quality (typically goats get the blame for poor deer); well I got bad news for any hunters who blame the livestock. The number one animal to compete with a deer is another deer. For the hunters who desire more control on their hunting lease this problem can be fixed by continuing hunting once that trophy buck is harvested and use the doe tags to reduce the population to a suitable stocking rate for that particular landscape.

To finish up this week's column I would like to close by saying that I am not advocating going on a mad killing spree and killing any deer in sight. I am recommending gathering an estimate of the population on the property (example Spotlight County, stand count or helicopter count any of which is better

than none) and harvesting the number of deer that is needed to get to the desired density. By doing this you will be reducing the amount of competition between the deer and will allow more resources to each deer which will equal better deer.
