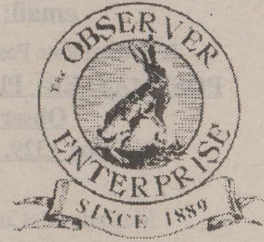

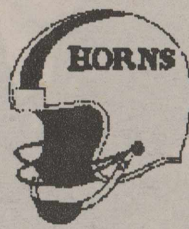
Golf Tourney slated for November 3 in Bronte

The Board of Directors of the West Coke County Hospital District met in regular session September 25, 2012. President Mary Bessent called the meeting to order at 9:40 AM, and declared a quorum was present. Board members present were Mary Bessent, Sarah Green, Pat Stephens, and Dessie Kendall, and Patsy

Cason. Also present were Roger Alexander, Administrator, and Janie Munoz, Business Office Mgr. Roger Alexander gave the invocation. The minutes from the previous meetings were approved. There were no visitors, and one absentee from the previous meetings was excused. In the staffing update, Roger informed the Board the facility is in need of at least 3 CNAs at the current time. There are 44 residents total in the Care Center as of the meeting date, since the Alzheimer Unit is closed for renovation. In Public Relations, check out our website at www.robertleecarecenter.com. Under capital improvements, work has begun on the Alzheimer Unit, and the inside section of the building has been demolished in order to do all the necessary work on the sewer line, after which time the framing will begin. It will be a work in progress for the next few months. 12 new beds have been ordered for the Unit, and the a/c-heat-

Bronte posts win over Hornets

The Bronte Longhorns defeated the Irion County Hornets on the road this past Friday, 47-14. The win improves the Longhorns to 4-2 on the season and 1-1 in District 6-1A play. The

Longhorns have their open date this week and will play Christoval next week.

The Longhorns' offense scored on 5 of their first 6 possessions last week. Nathan McGinnis rushed for a game high 193 yards and 4 touchdowns. Ty Lee added 60 yards and a touchdown rushing and he also completed 7 of 10 passes for 98 yards and a touchdown. Josh Puentez caught 3 passes for 46 yards, Jared Scott caught 2 for 21 yards, Mizael Perez 1 for 24 yards and Kyler Richards caught 1 for 10 yards.

Defensively, the Longhorns held the Hornets to 205 yards rushing and 15 yards passing. They had less than 60 yards total offense at the half. Jared Scott led the team in tackles with 9. The Longhorns defense also caused three fumbles. Lance Burns recovered two of the Hornet fumbles, and Dakota Pullen recovered one.

This, coupled with the needs and interests of youth in the local community, makes the perfect match for fostering a positive relationship among youth and adults.

4-H Volunteers play a vital role in the ongoing growth and development of the 4-H and Youth Development Program. They build a special relationship with youth, guiding project learning experiences and offering youth with opportunities to learn and serve their community. Volunteers also serve in a coaching and mentor role for youth, helping build confidence among youth and foster positive youth devel-

opment. Volunteers also help youth achieve their personal goals and motivate them to continue participating in and learning from the various opportunities provided through the program.

The relationships built among adult volunteers and youth also have lasting effects. As Retired General Colin Powell stated, "When adults take time to help young people through 4-H, they exert an enormous, positive influence on the lives of youth." From 4-H experiences led by volunteers, youth gain important leadership, citizenship and life skills that can be applied to daily living, used in their community, in future jobs or when they continue their education. Although it may be years before a youth realizes and truly appreciates the influence of the 4-H volunteers that served as positive adult role models, one can be certain that volunteers are truly making a difference for life.

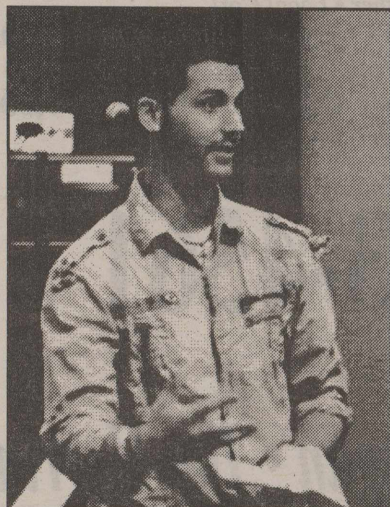
