Fall Hunting Season is here

General deer and turkey season begins tomorrow, Saturday, November 3, 2012, and will run through January 6, 2013. The special late general season will run from January 7 - 20, 2013, for antlerless and spike bucks only. The bag limit for deer is 5, with no more than 2 bucks, all seasons combined.

Turkey season will run concurrently with deer season, November 3, 2012 through January 6, 2013. Spring turkey season has been set for March 30 through May 12, 2013, gobblers or bearded hens only, with a bag limit of 4 (all seasons combined).

Quail season began statewide October 27, 2012, and will run through February 24, 2013, with a daily bag limit of 15 and a possession limit of 45.

The winter short dove seasons runs from December 22, 2012, through January 6, 2013, with a daily bag limit of 15 in the central zone, which includes Coke County.

Legal shooting hours for all game animals and nonmigratory game birds are from one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset.

Hunting stamp endorsement which are required in addition to your license include an archery stamp - \$7; migratory game birds - \$7; upland game birds - \$7; and a federal migratory game bird (duck stamp) - \$17.

Hunting Lease License (Types 132, 133, and 134)

Required of a landowner or landowner's agent who leases hunting rights to another person on property they own or control for pay or other consideration. The license must

be displayed on the property.

License fee: \$79 for 1 through 499 acres; \$147 for 500 through 999 acres; or \$252 for 1,000 acres or more: Note - Recordbook no longer required.

Coke County wants all of our visiting hunters to have a wonderful time during your stay in our area. Please remember that you are ambassadors for all of us involved in the hunting and outdoor industries. Don't forget to think SAFETY every time you handle a firearm, and make proper gun handling and safe shooting a part of your everyday life at home or in the field. Have a safe and successful season. And... don't forget to check out the area barbecues and dinners slated for opening day. They are detailed on page 12 of this issue.

Important Election set for Tuesday

This total includes mail in ballots and the 59 ballots cast at the branch station in Bronte on the October 23 and 24. Voters may still cast an early ballot through 1 pm today in the Clerk's office at the Coke County Courthouse in Robert Lee.

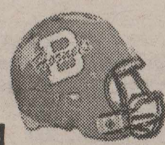

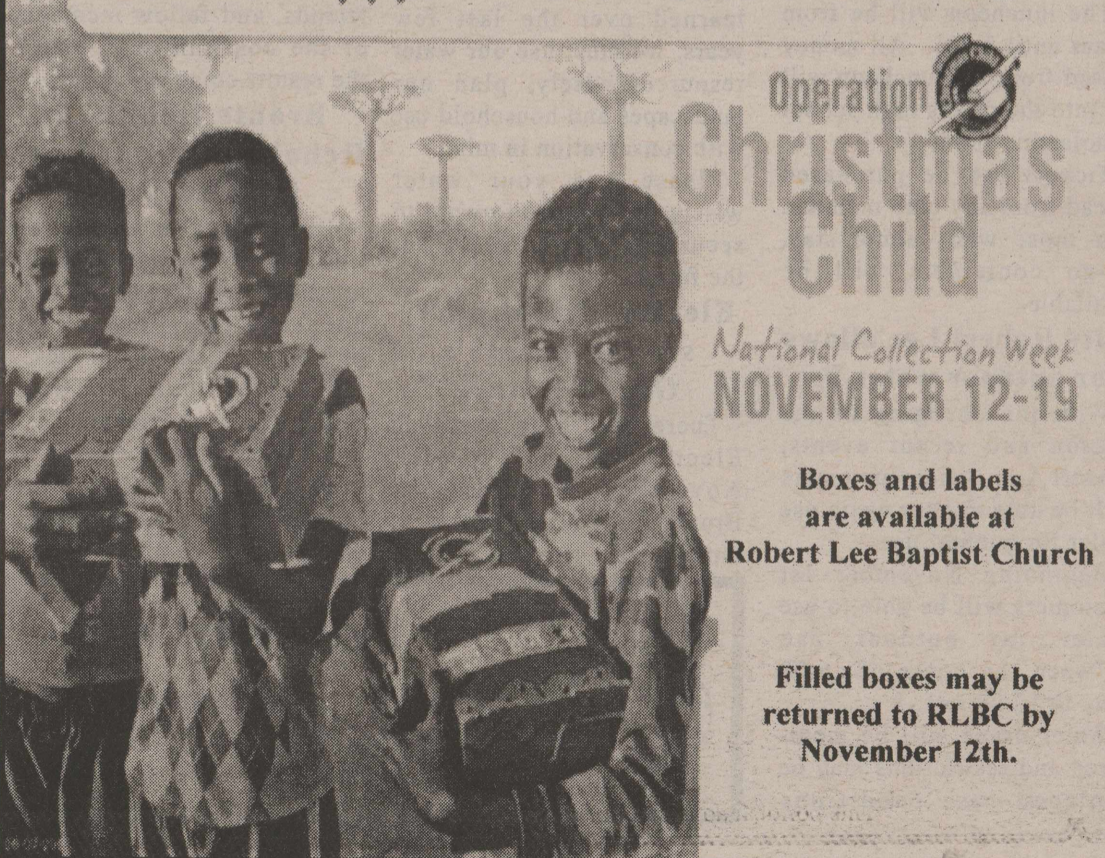

Add Hunters for the Hungry to Your Check List

Hunters help local communities each deer season by donating deer to the Texas Hunters for the Hungry program. Last year, hunters donated 152,962 pounds of venison, resulting in more than 600,000 servings. Of that, 5,358 pounds were donated in Coke County alone.

According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, one out of every five households in Texas struggles to afford food. Food assistance agencies such as food banks, play an important role in helping families fill the nutrition gap. Obtaining adequate protein is often difficult for low income families and individuals. As a result, venison donations are a favorite.

If you are a hunter, consider adding Hunters for the Hungry to your check list as you prepare for deer season. It is easy to participate: locate a participating meat processor; drop off your tagged, legally harvested white-tail or mule deer; and pay a nominal fee to cover basic processing costs. A receipt is issued for tax purposes. This season, Hunters for the Hungry is working with Menchaca's Processing in Robert Lee to accept venison donations. 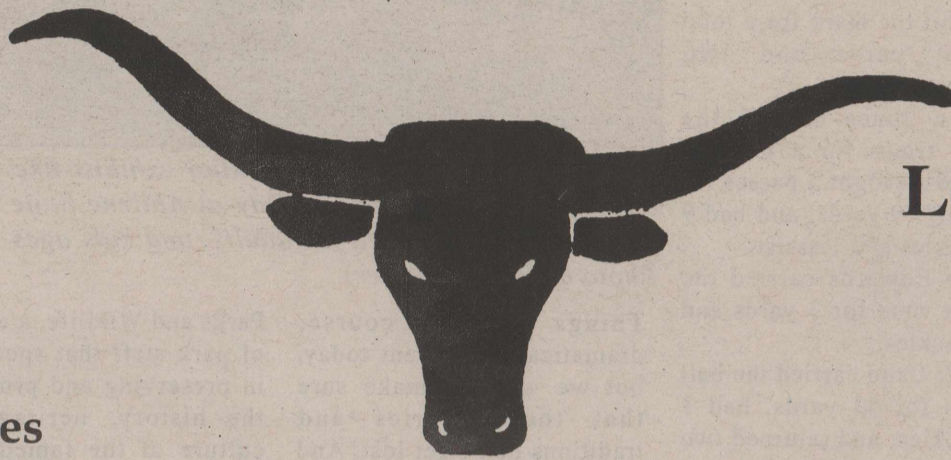

It was a very tight game at the start of the fourth quarter, but the Steers opened a gap with two touchdowns. The final score of the night was a Hornet 55 yard run, leaving the scoreboard at 36-46 in

favor of the Steers.

Frontier Day Lives Again at Abilene State Park

Outdoor Event Also Marks 20th Anniversary of Buffalo Soldiers Program

A one-time popular annual event celebrating 19th-Century life on the rugged Texas plains, Frontier Day is again a part of Abilene State Park and scheduled for the afternoon of Saturday, Nov. 3.

From noon to 4 p.m., park visitors can enjoy booths, activities, displays, re-enactors and demonstrations that highlight the daily routines and challenges experienced by settlers and soldiers who called this area home during the 1800s. Activities and programs scheduled for the day include a vintage baseball game, an authentic chuck wagon, a buffalo hunter, archery, Old-West re-enactors, 1870s military soldier demonstrations, animals from the official Texas State Longhorn herd, the Game Warden Operation Game Thief trailer, dulcimer music, flint knapping and more. The park friends group will also have snacks and drinks available for sale.

"They used to have a Frontier Day event at Abilene, and we decided to bring it back," said Dawn Capps, park ranger and peace officer at Abilene State Park. "It's important to show people what life would have been like so many years ago, and how people would have survived on the frontier.

Things are, of course, dramatically different today, but we want to make sure that these stories and traditions don't get lost. And Abilene is a perfect place to host this event; the area in and around the park was a strategic and leading edge to the frontier, because of the buffalo passageway, water and trees that have always been here."

This Saturday's festivities also mark the 20th Anniversary of the Buffalo Soldiers program at Texas

Parks and Wildlife, a division of park staff that specializes in preserving and promoting the history, heritage and culture of the famed Black Soldier units of the 9th and 10th Cavalry and 24th and 25th Infantry regiments of the U.S. Army. The Buffalo Soldiers, who will have an encampment at Frontier Day, historically served at various frontier outposts across Texas during the Indian Wars campaign from 1866-1892. Through education programs and curriculum, outreach

events and re-enactments, the Buffalo Soldiers unit of TPWD staff and volunteers travels the state as a living history exhibit, and is making its first return trip to Abilene since the program began two decades ago.

The presidential battle between President Barack Obama and former Massachusetts Governor Mitt Romney is the highlight race on the ballot. However, this election will determine the makeup of both the United States House and Senate. There are two more names on the ballot for president, Jill Stein and Gary Johnson. However, these third party candidates will only succeed in pulling votes away from the two main competitors. With that being the case, third party candidates in the other races will not be mentioned in this overview.

In Texas, voters will have to choose a new senator. On the Republican ticket is Ted

Cruz who is facing Democrat candidate Paul Sadler. These two men are vying for retiring longtime Texas Senator Kay Bailey Hutchison's seat.

Coke County is currently represented by Congressman Mike Conaway in Texas' District 11 of the US House of Representatives. He is facing Democrat candidate Jim Riley.

The remaining candidates on Tuesday's ballot are vying for state and local offices. These include the following races.
