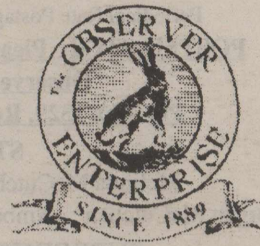

Country's results differ from Coke County, Texas

Coke County and Texas voters turned out in huge numbers in support of conservatives in Tuesday's General Election. However, not much will be changing in Washington as President Obama has been re-elected and the United States Senate and House of Representatives retain basically the same configuration.

Over 62% (1,451 voters out of 2,322) of registered voters in Coke County voted in this election with 669 voters casting straight ticket votes. Of these straight ticket votes cast, 583 were Republican, 80 were Democrat, 4 were Libertarian and 2 were Green Party. Overall in Coke County, Romney received 1,216 votes with Obama receiving 179 votes. In Texas, over 57% voted for Romney.

In the race for Texas Senate, Republican Ted Cruz picked up over 56% of the vote statewide and won in Coke County over Paul Sadler 1,143 to 204.

The other statewide race voters in Coke County had been watching was the Justice, 3rd Court of Appeals District, Place 3 contest. This election pits conservative small counties against the more liberal stronghold of Austin and Travis County. Republican challenger Scott Field overwhelmingly defeated incumbent Democrat Diane Henson in Coke County, 1,079 to 236.

He also won statewide by a smaller margin of 51.70% to 48.29%.

Coke County only had one contested election – the race between incumbent Marty Boyd and write-in candidate Brandon Busby for Coke County Constable Precinct 2. Boyd was returned to office with 494 votes to the Busby's 80 votes.

This year's results reporting is a little different than in years past as under votes are going to be reported in District 51 and Coke County races. Under votes are voters that chose not to cast a vote for a candidate. Election totals are listed below.

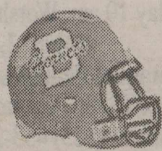

Zada Denman passed away Tuesday, October 30, 2012, at the Bronte Health & Rehab Center. Viewing was at the funeral home from 9 am to 8 pm Friday, November 2, 2012. Funeral Services were held at 2 pm Saturday, November 3, 2012, at First Baptist Church of Bronte with Reverend Cecil Harper and Reverend Morris Johnson officiating. Interment followed in Fairview Cemetery. Services were under the direction of Shaffer Funeral Home.

Zada was born December 15, 1919, to Bob and Ninnie Patterson at Indian Creek between Bronte and Robert Lee Texas. She graduated from Robert Lee High School in 1937. Zada married Aubrey Denman on June 6, 1937, at the Methodist parsonage in Robert Lee by Bro. Earl Hoggard.

Zada was very active in the churches she attended, which included San Angelo, McCamey and Bronte. She started the first Sunday school class at the Bronte Nursing Home, delivered sermon tapes of Sunday morning services to shut-ins and also delivered many peach cobbles to them as well. She was very active in WMU, GA's, and other activities of the church, willing to work anywhere she was needed. She loved the Lord and was very dedicated to Him and she did not mind telling you about Him. She loved music and played the piano and harmonica by ear.

In January 1947, they purchased a small farm northwest of Bronte. Hardships

endured with the drought of the fifties, no transportation for a year, and Aubrey leaving home to find work. They were thankful for good neighbors, businesses and the First National Bank of Bronte.

Zada and Aubrey first attended church in Bronte in the old church building where Lanny and Don were baptized in the old tabernacle. Aubrey's first carpenter job was the construction of First Baptist Church as it stands today.

In 1956, they moved to the new county park in Bronte where Aubrey was caretaker for ten years. Zada worked beside him keeping up flower beds, working concession stand, keeping swimmers at the pool fed with good hot dogs and homemade goodies. In 1966 they moved to Mount Lebanon Baptist Encampment at Cedar Hill, Texas where Aubrey was maintenance superintendent for 19 months and Zada worked many hours preparing meals for campers. In 1967, they moved back to the farm in Bronte and purchased White Auto store from

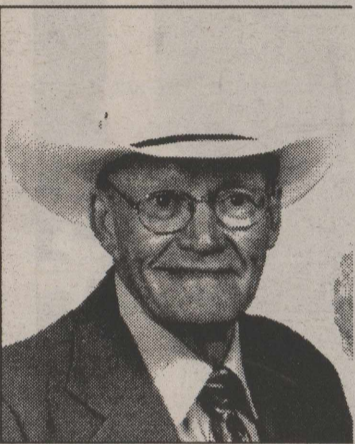
C. E. and Neva Bruton. They sold the store in 1977 to daughter Jeanna and husband Wendell Lee. The store was in the family for over forty years. She moved to San Angelo in 1996 and really enjoyed living at Baptist Memorial Retirement Village and enjoyed singing in the Senior choir (The Melody Makers) at Immanuel Baptist Church and playing her harmonica.

Zada was preceded in death by her husband Aubrey, her Mom and Dad, Bob & Ninnie Patterson; son Aubrey Don and grandson Troy Don Lee; siblings Herman, R.C., L. C., Clifford, Eddie Patterson, Ila Belle Compton and Nola Harmon.

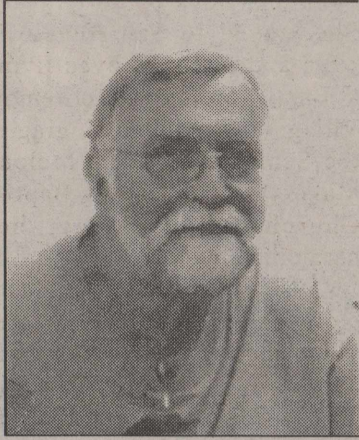

In Memory of Frank Tubb

My brother, Frank Tubb, was a radio operator on one of the most famous Mitchell B-25 bombers. The plane "Bold Venture" B-25 was part of the renowned 500th Bomber Squadron, of the 345th Bomb Group of the US Fifth Air Force. The men of the 345th Bomb group were the best low-level strafing and bombing group of any conflict.

On March 15, 1945, they were sent on a mission that included the coast line in the South China Sea. The leader of the group spotted a 2000 ton Japanese freighter off the

coast line and made a bomb run on the ship. They dropped a 500 pound bomb into the side of the ship, which exploded at the water line. The pilot, Lt. Reheis, did not know tht Lt. Jensen had followed him into the target. Shrapnel from the explosion riddled Bold Venture's bomb bay and right engine, which Jensen immediately tried to feather. Beyond the ship was a 75 foot ridge line running off a steep mountainside, and the Bold Venuter didn't have enough power to clear it on one engine. The crash, 16 miles northwest of Hong Kong, killed all five crewmen. Lost in the crash were: 2nd Lt. Robert W. Jensen, pilot; 2nd Lt. Orville Garrison, co-pilot; Sgt. Henry M. Worley, Jr., engineer; Sgt. Robert H. Waggy, Armorer; and my brother, Cpl. Frank M. Tubb, radio operator. Their exploits and heroism have never been forgotten.

I will always remember my brother, how he loved to dress, and be a part of activities at SAC. He taught me how to dance and to appreciate the music of Glenn Miller, Tommy Dorsey, Frank Sinatra and all the other big band music.

He is now laid to rest with two of his fellow crewmen in the Ft. Smith National Cemetery in Ft. Smith,

Estate tax reform critical in lame duck session for farm families

Farm Families in Coke County are calling for help from Washington legislators to help preserve their family farms by establishing permanent estate tax reform during the lame duck session.

"Estate taxes can be devastating to a family business, including farms and ranches that have been handed down for generations," said John Ross Copeland, president of Coke-Sterling County Farm Bureau.

The estate tax requires families to pay taxes on land and assets owned by a family member when that family member passes away. Currently, the tax exemption is set at \$5 million in assets, and assets above the exemption are taxed at a 35 percent top rate.

"If Congress doesn't act on estate taxes before the end of the year, the estate tax exemption will drop to \$1 million and the top rate will increase to 55 percent," John Ross Copeland said. "Farmers are asset rich and cash poor, and those changes could really devastate our family farms as they're already experiencing the loss of a loved one."

Farm Bureau supports a lower estate tax top rate and higher exemption, as well as a permanent extension of the 15 percent capital gains tax. The capital gains tax is set to increase from 15 to 20 percent, if Congress does not take action before the end of the year.

Tax relief for drought-driven livestock sales offered

Farmers and ranchers in Coke County who were forced to sell draft animals, breeding livestock or dairy animals early because of drought, flood or weather-related conditions have been granted more time to defer payment of capital gains taxes on replacement animals, said John Ross Copeland, Coke-Sterling County Farm Bureau president.

"The deferment for purchasing replacement animals is normally four years," John Ross Copeland said. "But during an extended drought like Coke County farmers and ranchers have been

The Week After

Now that the long awaited opening day of hunting season has past and all the deer hunters have spent a weekend in a box looking at a feeder. The hunters are beginning to plot and plan what it is going to take to harvest that trophy buck this year. I thought it would be beneficial to use this week's column to share my thoughts on what I see it is going to take to kill the buck the hunters desires this year.

To begin with as we all know, we made it through another hot dry summer where there was little vegetation produced for the wildlife. However, the rains that came were and always will be a blessing, however; they most likely will force the hunters away from the feeders until we have a killing frost this hunting season. This is due to the rains coming just in time stimulate the growth of the forbs such as the filarees, Engelmann daisy and many other forbs that will take priority in the whitetails diet any day, when compared to the protein pellets and corn. This gives the deer a very broad area with desirable food instead of coming to the one central location (example the feeder) to give them the meal they are looking for.

What I see as happening to this year's hunting season is until the first killing frost hits (which does not look to be happening any time soon) the odds are stacked against any hunter who desires to sit in the box blind overlooking a feeder unless that blind is overlooking an area that is covered up with forbs that are desirable to the deer. The more scouting information the hunter can gather the more he improves his chances.

Some traits the hunters should consider in their scouting should be looking for travel lanes, areas that have increased forb production and don't be scared to ask the landowner where he sees the most deer, until next week good luck with the hunting.
