
• Marty Boyd was elected as Constable, Precinct 1 in 2004.



A library research report has been issued by the Pew Research Center American Life Project that explores the role libraries play in people's lives and in their communities. Two thousand, two hundred and fifty-two Americans ages 16 and older were surveyed between October 13 and November 10, 2012.

Eighty percent of Americans surveyed say borrowing books is "very important." Seventyseven percent say free access to computers and the internet is "very important." Online services are used for research, email, recreation, health information, job searches, and a few said paying bills or ordering products was done at the library.


People have different views about whether libraries

should move some printed books and stacks out of pubmorning, lic locations to make space for tech centers. Thirty-six percent said "definitely not," 39% said "maybe" and 20% said "definitely."

Fully 91% say libraries are important to their communities; 84% say that they have been to libraries.

Some say their visits have increased because they take their children or grandchildren, do research, read more, save money, a variety of reading material;, and to use computers. Some folks say their visits have decreased because of online research at home computers; too busy; prefer e-books (only 6% so far); "don't read much these days" (3%). Thank goodness only 3% of the 2,252 people interviewed said they didn't go to the library because they "didn't like local library or staff."

The full report is available at the Coke County Library. Library hours are Tuesdays, 8-12; Wednesdays, 8-4; Thursdays, 1-5; Fridays, 8-12. The number is 453-2495.





"Recreational vehicle park or RV park" is any lot, tract, or parcel of land upon which accommodation is provided for two or more recreational vehicles used as living or sleeping quarters by the day, week, or month, whether a charge is or is not made. A recreational vehicle park is a unified development of recreational vehicle spaces provided for recreational vehicle use with or without community facilities.

"Recreational vehicle" site or RV site is that part of the lot or area in a recreational vehicle park or RV park that has been reserved for the placement of one recreational vehicle or RV.

#### **SECTION 3**

License (a)

Required It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any RV park within the city limits unless he/she holds a valid license issued annually by the City of Bronte in the name of such person for the specific park. The applicant shall make all applications for the licenses on forms furnished by the City of Bronte, which shall issue a license upon compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.

#### **SECTION 3.3**

Violations declared nuisance; abatement; penalty

Any noncompliance with this ordinance is hereby deemed a nuisance. The City may abate and remove the nuisance and punish the person(s) responsible for causing or allowing the nuisance condition to exist. Any person(s) violating this ordinance shall be subject to a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each provision violated, and each day that there is failure to comply with the terms of any provision of this article is declared to be a separate offense. For violations of the provisions of this ordinance that govern fire safety or public health sanitation, including dumping of refuse, the fine may not exceed two thousand dollars (\$2000.00) per day, per violation. The ordinance enforcement official shall be the authority of the jurisdiction responsible for the issuance of citations and any action deemed necessary for the enforcement of this ordinance.

# recreational vehicle

The placement of a recreational vehicle for occupancy longer than fourteen (14) days shall not be permitted except in an approved recreational vehicle park. A recreational vehicle may be placed (1) at an owner's residence as long as the RV is placed in the side or rear yard area and not used for occupancy longer than fourteen (14) days in a twelve (12) month period or (2) at a lot owned by the owner of the recreational vehicle and the recreational vehicle is the only habitable structure on the lot. In either of the aforementioned exceptions (1) and (2), only one recreational vehicle can be placed on the residence or lot aforementioned.

# **ORDER RESTRICTING OUTDOOR BURNING**

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court finds that circumstances present in or part of the all unincorporated area of the county create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Commissioners Court of Coke County that outdoor burning is restricted in the in Coke County, the Sheriff's unincorporated area of the office must be notified by county for 90 days from the calling 453-2717 on each day date of adoption of this for each occurrence;

Order, unless the restrictions are terminated earlier based on a determination made by the Texas Forest Service or this Court. This Order is adopted pursuant to Local Government Code §352.081, and other applicable statutes. This Order does not prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Natural Resources Commission for: (1) firefighter training: (2) public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations; (3) planting or harvesting of agricultural crops; or, (4) burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manager certified under Section 153.048. Natural Resources Code, and meet the standards of Section 153.047, Natural Resources Code.

BE IT ALSO ORDERED This ordinance shall be in THAT the purpose of this order is the mitigation of the hazard posed by wildfires by curtailing the practice of outdoor burning, with the exception of barbecuing in an enclosed fire box with water hose or fire retardant accessible at all times and someone attending the fire at all times, and materials used outdoors in activities such as welding and any other activity that could result in a fire. The purpose is to be taken into account in any enforcement action based upon this order.

Burns that are Α. conducted after submission of a Natural Resources Conservation Service approved burn plan to the Coke County Judge.

Burns conducted under this section must meet the following conditions:

1. Prior to beginning a burn

2. The person giving notification to the Sheriff's office must identify the area trash is permitted under the to be burned by describing the pasture or range by address, by location of County Road or State Highway, and also must give the name of the person requesting the burn;

3. A water sprayer apparatus or water containers and other fire fighting tools must be available on site; 4. Fire guards are to be

used whenever possible;

5. Wind speeds must not exceed 15 MPH;

6. The Humidity index must be 20% or higher as determined by the Texas Forest Service for Coke County; and,

7. A cellular telephone or other reliable radio communication must be available on site for emergency notification and response.

B. Outdoor welding or cutting and grinding associated with welding activities are permitted following under the circumstances:

1. Welding and cutting and grinding associated with welding activities shall not take place when the wind is over 15 miles per hour;

2. The welder must notify the Coke County Sheriff's Department before any welding, cutting or grinding begins;

3. All grass, leaves, brush and other easily combustible materials must be cleared within a fifty (50) feet radius surrounding the area where the activity is to take place before any welding, cutting or grinding begins; and

4. A spotter with water and a ready pressurized delivery system must be on hand before any welding, cutting or grinding begins and remain on hand until the activity is completed.

C. Burning of household following conditions:

1. Shall take place only when the wind speed is 15 miles per hour or less;

2. All grass, leaves, brush and other easily combustible materials must be cleared within a fifty (50) foot radius surrounding the area where the activity is to take place and before any burning of trash begins;

3. The burning takes place in a container with a mesh cover; and

4. A spotter with water and a ready pressurized delivery system must be on hand before any burning begins and remain on hand until the burning is completed.

D. Outdoor cooking is permitted under the following conditions:

1. Shall take place only when the wind speed is 15 miles per hour or less;

2. All grass, leaves, brush and other easily combustible materials must be cleared within a fifty (50) foot radius surrounding the area where the activity is to take place and before any outdoor cooking begins; and,

3. A spotter with water and a ready pressurized delivery system must be on hand before any outdoor cooking begins and remain on hand until the outdoor cooking is completed.

In accordance with Local Government §352.081 (h), a violation of this Order is a class C misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00.







Please turn samples in by 10 am. Samples from private water wells will be screened for \$10 per sample.





Salinity as measured by Total Dissolved Solids (TDS) will also be determined for each sample. Water with high TDS levels may leave deposits and have a salty taste. Additionally, using water with high TDS for irrigation may damage the soil or plants.

Pick up a sample bag and support from the Texas State sampling instructions from the Coke County AgriLife Extension Office. You can contact the Coke County Extension Office by calling (325) 453-2461. It is very important that only sampling bags from the Coke County Extension Office be used and all instructions for proper sampling followed to ensure accurate results.
