This Order does not prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Natural Resources Commission for: firefighter training: (2) public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations; (3) planting or harvesting of agricultural crops; or, (4) burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manager certified under Section 153.048. Natural Resources Code, and meet the standards of Section 153.047, Natural Resources Code.

BE IT ALSO ORDERED THAT the purpose of this order is the mitigation of the hazard posed by wildfires by curtailing the practice of outdoor burning, with the exception of barbecuing in an enclosed fire box with water hose or fire retardant accessible at all times and someone attending the fire at all times, and materials used outdoors in activities such as welding and any other activity that could result in a fire. The purpose is to be taken into account in any enforcement action based upon this order.

Burns that are conducted after submission of a Natural Resources Service Conservation approved burn plan to the Coke County Judge.

Burns conducted under this section must meet the following conditions:

1. Prior to beginning a burn in Coke County, the Sheriff's office must be notified by calling 453-2717 on each day for each occurrence;

2. The person giving notification to the Sheriff's office must identify the area to be burned by describing the pasture or range by address, by location of County Road or State Highway, and also must give the name of the person requesting the burn;

3. A water sprayer apparatus or water containers and other fire fighting tools must be available on site;

4. Fire guards are to be used whenever possible;

5. Wind speeds must not exceed 15 MPH;

6. The Humidity index must be 20% or higher as determined by the Texas Forest Service for Coke County; and,

7. A cellular telephone or other reliable radio communication must be available on site for emergency notification and

response. B. Outdoor welding or cutting and grinding associated with welding activities are permitted under the following

1. Welding and cutting and

circumstances:

grinding associated with welding activities shall not take place when the wind is over 15 miles per hour;

2. The welder must notify the Coke County Sheriff's Department before any welding, cutting or grinding begins;

3. All grass, leaves, brush and other easily combustible materials must be cleared within a fifty (50) feet radius surrounding the area where the activity is to take place before any welding, cutting or grinding begins; and

4. A spotter with water and a ready pressurized delivery system must be on hand before any welding, cutting or grinding begins and remain on hand until the activity is completed.

C. Burning of household trash is permitted under the following conditions:

1. Shall take place only when the wind speed is 15 miles per hour or less;

2. All grass, leaves, brush and other easily combustible materials must be cleared within a fifty (50) foot radius surrounding the area where the activity is to take place and before any burning of trash begins;

3. The burning takes place in a container with a mesh cover; and

4. A spotter with water and a ready pressurized delivery system must be on hand before any burning begins and remain on hand until the burning is completed.

Outdoor cooking is permitted under the following conditions:

1. Shall take place only when the wind speed is 15 miles per hour or less;

2. All grass, leaves, brush and other easily combustible materials must be cleared within a fifty (50) foot radius surrounding the area where the activity is to take place

and before any outdoor cooking begins; and,

3. A spotter with water and a ready pressurized delivery system must be on hand before any outdoor cooking begins and remain on hand until the outdoor cooking is completed.

In accordance with Local Government §352.081 (h), a violation of this Order is a class C misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00.

(Continued from page 5) to fit in an ice-cube tray compartment. Once the entire tray is filled with pieces of herb, carefully add a little water to each compartment. Then it's ready for the freezer. Once the herbs are completely frozen, transfer these cubes from the tray to re-sealable plastic freezer bags. Label the bag with the name of the herb. Then, when a recipe calls for that herb, figure on l ice cube yielding 1 teaspoon of it. To defrost the cube, just put it in a small strainer and run hot water

Add dried herbs to what you're cooking about 30 minutes before the dish is done. To help the fresh herb keep its color and flavor, add the herb 10 minutes before you turn off the heat.

If your recipe is not specifically written for microwave cooking, keep in mind that fresh herbs tend to be milder when microwaved, so you may want to increase the amount you use. And the flavor of dried herbs is height-

you may want to decrease the amount you use.

To make fresh herbs into dried herbs, place them on a paper towel and cook them in the microwave on high for about 1 minute. When dry, store them in labeled re-sealable plastic bags. They should retain their flavor for up to 1 year. **DID YOU KNOW?**

You can keep lettuce fresh in a re-sealable plastic bag with a piece of almost-burnt toast. When the toast gets soggy, replace it with another piece. Lettuce should stay crisp in the fridge for a cou-

ple of weeks this way. ALSO - try keeping your collard greens, kale, lettuce and other salad greens fresher by keeping them in a covered container in the frig, along with a piece of stainless-steel silverware.
