

(Continued from page 1) Currently, about 27 million acres are enrolled in CRP, a voluntary program available to ag producers to help them safeguard environmentally sensitive land. Producers enrolled in CRP plant long-term, resourceconserving covers to improve the quality of water, control soil erosion and enhance wildlife habitat. Contracts on 3.3 million acres of CRP are set to expire on September 30, 2013.
