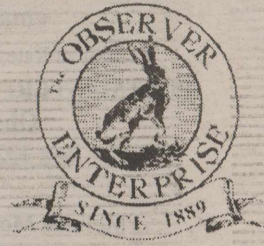

Mary Youngblood Glenn of Bronte departed this world on April 12, 2013. Her Lord and Savior, as well as loved ones and friends, rejoiced at her coming home.

She graduated from Bronte schools and then graduated from Hardin Simmons University where she made many life-long friends.

Mary married Earl F. (Tuny) Glenn on July 2, 1945, shortly after Tuny's return from Germany during WWII. They were stationed in Benton Harbor, Michigan, and then returned home to Bronte after Tuny's discharge from the army. 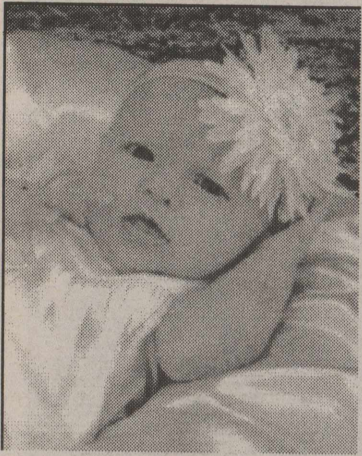

Watch a nest to help the birds

Over the past 30 years, some bird species have dropped in number (including Barn Swallows, Purple Martins, and Eastern Phoebe, which nest in Texas.) The cause remains unknown, though scientists believe it may be linked in part to declines in the insects that birds eat.

Anyone who loves watching birds can help scientists study and understand their plight by participating in the Cornell Lab of Ornithology's NestWatch citizen-science project (NestWatch.org).

"Every year, thousands of volunteers from across the United States monitor bird nests to help researchers track changes in bird populations," says Dr. Jason Martin, NestWatch project coordinator. "By keeping track of how many eggs birds lay and how many

State water funding

important to Coke County residents

State water funding has been a priority issue in Austin during the 83rd session of the Texas Legislature, and members of the Texas House and Texas Senate are drafting legislation to allocate money to future water projects across the state.

"Coke County farmers and ranchers rely on adequate water supply to ensure they can continue producing food for the


region and beyond," said John Ross Copeland, president of Coke-Sterling County Farm Bureau. "We understand that our fellow community members need access to water, too."

The Texas House Natural Resources Committee has approved a bill that would allow \$2 billion from the Texas Rainy Day Fund to go toward water projects like new reservoirs, pipelines, desalination plants and conservation projects.

According to the bill,

water projects would be selected based on a points system, which accounts for overall need and community's involvement in the project. The current bill requires 10 percent of funds be allocated to projects in rural communities.

The House Natural Resources Committee unanimously approved the bill. The Texas Senate also is working on a similar bill. The House and Senate versions will need to be reconciled before legislation is final.

**STATE OF TEXAS
COUNTY OF COKE
ORDER RESTRICTING
OUTDOOR BURNING**

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court finds that circumstances present in all or part of the unincorporated area of the county create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Commissioners Court of Coke County that outdoor burning is restricted in the unincorporated area of the county for 90 days from the date of adoption of this Order, unless the restrictions are terminated earlier based on a determination made by the Texas Forest Service or this Court. This Order is adopted pursuant to Local Government Code §352.081, and other applicable statutes. This Order does not prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Natural Resources Commission for: (1) firefighter training; (2) public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations; (3) planting or harvesting of agricultural crops; or, (4) burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manager certified under Section 153.048. Natural Resources Code, and meet the standards of Section 153.047, Natural Resources Code.

BE IT ALSO ORDERED THAT the purpose of this order is the mitigation of the hazard posed by wildfires by curtailing the practice of outdoor burning, with the exception of barbecuing in an enclosed fire box with water hose or fire retardant accessible at all times and someone attending the fire at all times, and materials used outdoors in activities such as welding and any other activity that could result in a fire. The purpose is to be taken into account in any enforcement action based upon this order.

A. Burns that are conducted after submission of a Natural Resources Conservation Service approved burn plan to the Coke County Judge.

Burns conducted under this section must meet the following conditions:

1. Prior to beginning a burn in Coke County, the Sheriff's office must be notified by calling 453-2717 on each day for each occurrence;
2. The person giving notification to the Sheriff's office must identify the area to be burned by describing the pasture or range by address, by location of County Road or State Highway, and also must give the name of the person requesting the burn;
3. A water sprayer apparatus or water containers and other fire fighting tools must be available on site;
4. Fire guards are to be used whenever possible;
5. Wind speeds must not exceed 15 MPH;
6. The Humidity index must be 20% or higher as determined by the Texas Forest Service for Coke County; and,

7. A cellular telephone or other reliable radio communication must be available on site for emergency notification and response.

B. Outdoor welding or cutting and grinding associated with welding activities are permitted under the following circumstances:

1. Welding and cutting and grinding associated with welding activities shall not take place when the wind is over 15 miles per hour;
2. The welder must notify the Coke County Sheriff's Department before any welding, cutting or grinding begins;
3. All grass, leaves, brush and other easily combustible materials must be cleared within a fifty (50) foot radius surrounding the area where the activity is to take place before any welding, cutting or grinding begins; and
4. A spotter with water and a ready pressurized delivery system must be on hand before any welding, cutting or grinding begins and remain on hand until the activity is completed.

C. Burning of household trash is permitted under the following conditions:

1. Shall take place only when the wind speed is 15 miles per hour or less;
2. All grass, leaves, brush and other easily combustible materials must be cleared within a fifty (50) foot radius surrounding the area where the activity is to take place and before any burning of trash begins;
3. The burning takes place in a container with a mesh cover; and
4. A spotter with water and a ready pressurized delivery system must be on hand before any burning begins and remain on hand until the burning is completed.

D. Outdoor cooking is permitted under the following conditions:

1. Shall take place only when the wind speed is 15 miles per hour or less;
2. All grass, leaves, brush and other easily combustible materials must be cleared within a fifty (50) foot radius surrounding the

area where the activity is to take place and before any outdoor cooking begins; and,

3. A spotter with water and a ready pressurized delivery system must be on hand before any outdoor cooking begins and remain on hand until the outdoor cooking is completed.

In accordance with Local Government §352.081 (h), a violation of this Order is a class C misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00.

are unlikely to succeed until we fully understand the causes of decline. Limiting our ability to identify factors driving population declines is a lack of information on reproduction.

The nests of many birds are easy to find and observe. Barn Swallows often plaster their nests onto beams inside barns and under bridges. Purple Martins use large communal nesting houses, and Eastern Phoebes frequently nest under porch eaves and in garages.

It's especially easy to observe nests built in nestboxes, opening the nestbox about twice a week during nesting season. Texas Bluebird Society offers a free nestbox to individuals who join

through the local Volunteer Distributor, Judy Hetherington in Bronte. 325-473-2027; email: heth76933@gmail.com).

Participating in NestWatch is free and easy. Information on where and when to look for nests and how to properly monitor them is available at NestWatch.org. NestWatch accepts observations for all nesting birds.

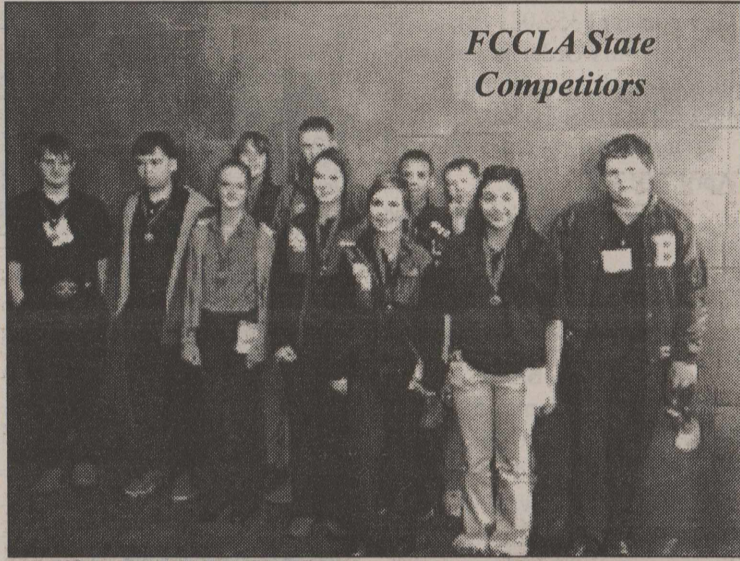

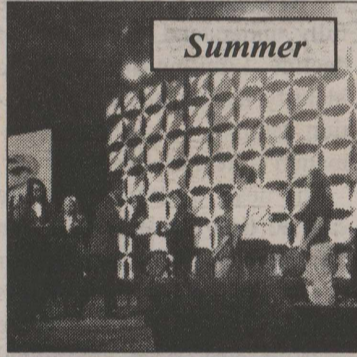

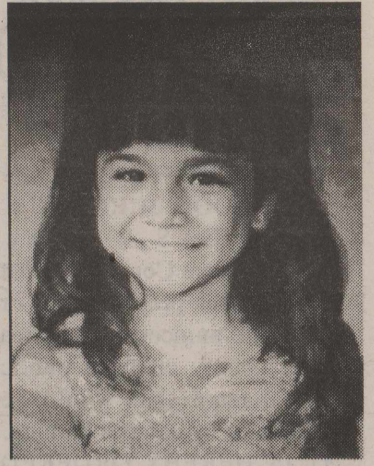
