Parents should be reminded that prom should be a positive experience for a student—one that he or she will never forget. There is much talk about gowns, tuxedos, which groups will share a limousine, and of course, who will be the big date; however, the most important part of that talk should come

Drinking and driving is a serious problem among teens. In 2005, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration reported that 23 percent of drivers ages 15 to 20 who died in motor vehicle crashes had a blood alcohol content of 0.08 or higher. And among teen drivers who were killed in motor vehicle crashes after drinking and driving, 74 percent were unrestrained. In a survey conducted by the Centers for Disease Control, nearly 30 percent of the teens reported that in the previous month, they had ridden with a driver who had been drinking alcohol. According to the Centers Another study showed that midnight; 54 percent occurred on Friday, Saturday, or Sunday.

Make sure there will be no alcohol involved on prom night, and be sure your teen wears the right thing to and from the prom—a safety belt!


