

Cumbie honored at annual banquet

Ed Cumbie was honored as the Citizen of the Year at the annual Bronte Chamber of Commerce banquet Tuesday, April 30, 2013. The letter nominating him for this award follows.

Mr. Cumbie, at 90 years of age, is a life-long citizen of Bronte who has been active in the community through his church, school, hospital district service, service organizations, business developments, Farm Bureau and agriculture interests for all of those years.

As a life-long member of First Baptist Church, he has and continues to be a dedicated Sunday School teacher. For many years during the 1960's, he served his community as a member of the Bronte Independent School **District Board of Trustees.**

He also served for many years as a director for both the East Coke County Hospital District and the Coke County Livestock Association.

For over 30 years, he served as the Farm Bureau Area Representative for the largest Farm Bureau Area in the nation - stretching all the way to El Paso. During this time, he actively fought against proposed legislation which would hurt Coke County property owners. His most successful battle was

leading the opposition to an effort by our state legislators to tax ranchers for the value of wildlife (deer, etc.).

He has continued his service by acting as the auctioneer at both the chamber banquets and the July 4th Bronte Health & Rehab Center auctions.

However these "spotlight" actions are just the tip of the service and volunteer hours and dollars he has given to Bronte. His behind the scenes service is vast as both a silent partner in local business ventures and silent donor to many community projects. He didn't want recognition for his actions and donations. He only wanted the best for his community. From my earliest memories, I can't remember a civic activity in which he wasn't a part. Discussing a disaster with children

During emergencies, children often feel afraid, anxious, confused and worried. To help give them a sense of comfort and security, discuss the disaster with them. Below are some tips:

Assume that the children know about the disaster. Children know more than you think. They are often exposed to the events as soon as they are able to watch television and interact with others.

Reassure them. Help your children feel safe by giving them reassurance.

Be realistic—although you try to support and protect them, you cannot prevent all bad things from happening. Tell them that you love them, no Find emotional outlets. Help your children use creative outlets such as art and music to express their feelings.

Help them take action. Children may want to take action. The action can be very simple, such as writing a letter or getting involved with a disaster preparedness organization. Make a Family Plan in Case of a Disaster You can help protect your family during and immediately after a disaster by making a family disaster plan and by creating a family disaster kit for your household. You and your family need to be able to take care of yourselves without outside

help for at least 3 days. **Make a family plan** F a m i lies d i f fer considerably. I t's important to create a plan that fits your family's needs. Regardless, all

family members need to know how to respond to severe weather or any disaster that could occur in your area.

When making a family disaster plan, you will need to consider escape routes, family communication, utility shut-off and safety, insurance and vital records, special needs, caring for animals and safety skills.

Escape routes: You need to know escape routes from each room in your house as well as from your neighborhood.

To establish escape routes from your house or apartment, draw up a floor plan and make sure that all f a m i l y m em b er s understand the plan.

conduct a practice session. Be sure to select a site outside the home for everyone to meet after they've left the house.

To establish escape routes from the neighborhood, draw a map that shows all the streets and their names so that when authorities provide evacuation instructions, you will know where to go.

Family communication: It's important to plan how your family members would contact one another if they were separated when disaster strikes. Fill out a contact card for each family member (you may use the samples located in this booklet) and have everyone keep a copy of it in a wallet, purse or backpack for easy reference.

Communication with emergency personnel: If you are injured because of an accident or disaster, you may be unable to speak with emergency medical technicians. In these cases, paramedics and other emergency response personnel often turn to a victim's cell phone for clues to his or her identity and emergency contacts.

You can make their job much easier by simply adding an entry in the contacts list of your cell phone: ICE. ICE stands for "In Case of Emergency." Add an entry, label it ICE, and enter the name and phone number of the person whom the emergency services should call on your behalf.

Adding this entry takes only a few moments, but it can save time for the emergency personnel who can contact your loved ones quickly.

Paramedics know what ICE means, and they look

for it immediately.

Utility shut-off and safety: For some types of disasters, you may need to disconnect utility services to your home. Natural gas leaks are the number one cause of fires after a disaster.

Be sure that responsible family members can turn off the gas, electricity and water supplies. Contact your local utility company for proper shut-off procedures.

Caution: Never turn gas service back on by yourself. Service should be restored only by a trained professional.

Remember It is important to be prepared if a disaster happens.

Be available. Be available and "askable." Let your children know that it's OK to talk about unpleasant events

Say how you feel. Sharing your feelings can help children know that others also are upset by the events.

Recognize their fears. Support your children's concern for people they do not know. Children often are afraid not only for themselves, their family and their friends, but also for people they do not know.


Be aware of other emotions. Look for feelings beyond fear. Let your children express all of their emotions.

• SALES TAX - Thanks to residents shopping locally and tourists visiting our community, the city's sales is 3.80% higher this year than last year.

WATER SUPPLY PLANS - Our objectives are as follows:

1. Secure an adequate supply of quality water from multiple sources.

2. Keep the water rates as affordable as pos-Bronte.

The City of Bronte has rights near our current well field that will allow us to increase our well count from 10 to 16. We Mason Bradbury, Abby hope that two of the wells





will be online by the end of summer. Funds from the Economic Development will help fund the cost of the two wells.

The City has received a loan and grant from the Texas Water Development Board for planning the city's future water needs. The loan will be paid with funds from the sale of water to Robert Lee.

The City purchased land from the City of Sweetwater on which there were 3 Bronte wells. The City then sold the land but retained the water rights.

LAKE LEVEL - It is estimated that there is a year and a half of water left in Oak Creek Lake. Residents should be aware that the majority of water taken out of the lake is


going to Sweetwater. Bronte and Robert Lee combined are only taking a tenth as much water out of Oak Creek as Sweetwater. During the heat of the summer more water is lost to evaporation than is used between Bronte and Robert Lee.
