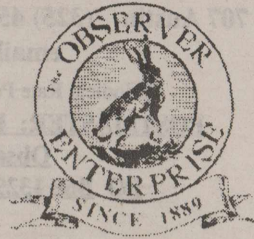

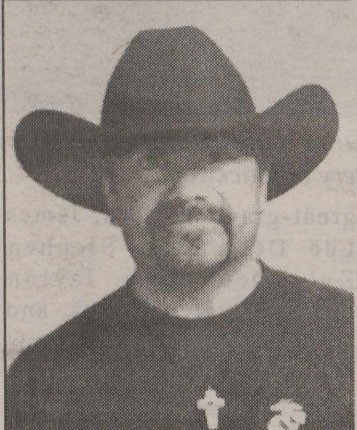

## Cook-off, Dance set for Saturday in Blackwell

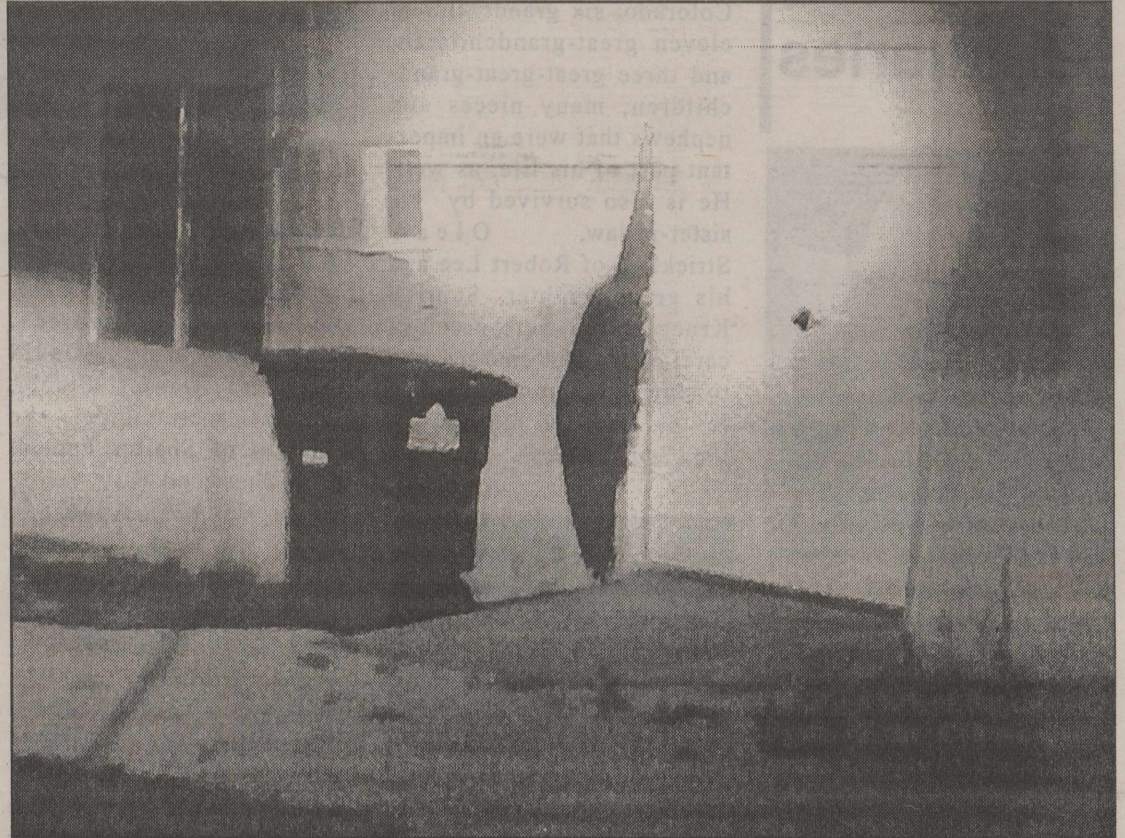

Due to the continuing lack of general rains, the City of Bronte has entered into Stage I of the Drought Contingency Plan. Customers are asked to water only between the hours of 6 pm until 12 midnight and 12 midnight to 10 am. All commercial

water users are requested to reduce water use to the greatest extent possible.

## Use Of Water From Fire Hydrants Is Prohibited

All citizens of Bronte and Robert Lee are asked to report any trucks that are taking water from fire hydrants. Fire trucks are the only allowed to use the fire hydrants. Residents in Robert Lee should call 453-2831 and residents in Bronte should call 473-3501. If you are unable to contact anyone at these numbers, contact the Sheriff's office at 453-2717.

During this time of drought it is essential that water be restricted to only authorized users.

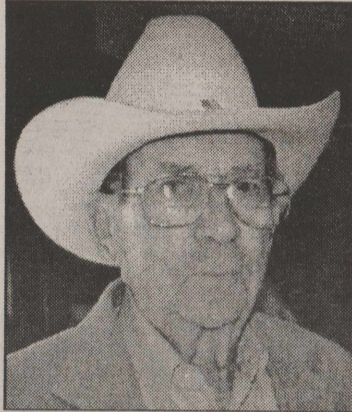

**House, Senate Ag Committees move farm bill forward**

All eyes are on Washington D.C. as legislators in the nation's capital work to cut spending while also maintaining funding for programs that help feed American families and provide a safety net to American farmers and ranchers.

Both the Senate and House Agricultural Committees have passed their respective versions of the farm bill, according to John Ross Copeland, Coke County Farm Bureau president.

"There are differences between the two proposals, but we hope, for the sake of the people who rely on the programs in the farm bill, that legislators are able to work out their differences and pass a full, five-year farm bill," John Ross Copeland said.

Both bills now move to their respective chambers for consideration by the full body of legislators. If

**Additional Drought Relief Funding to Texas Landowners**

In response to Texas' ongoing drought, the USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) State Conservationist Salvador Salinas has announced that NRCS in Texas has additional funding available for agriculture operators wishing to address plant health conditions on their land through the agency's Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP).

"With so much of Texas suffering from a lack of rainfall, this funding will help farmers and ranchers apply conservation practices to reduce the impacts of drought, while improving soil health and productivity," says Salinas.

Through this additional EQIP funding, the NRCS will work with landowners in providing assistance to

establish and improve plant health on their private lands. Applications will be accepted in NRCS field offices until June 14. Priority for funding will target 129 counties that are designated as extreme drought (D3) or exceptional drought (D4), according to the current US Drought Monitor map. Currently, the vast majority of Coke, Sterling and Nolan fall into the D3-D4 range. Only the far northwest tip of Runnels is considered in this category. Priority counties will be adjusted as the drought changes.

Salinas suggests that landowners consult with their local NRCS district conservationist to develop a conservation plan, which is an effective strategy for pasture and rangeland recovery, along with helping mitigate the effects of Texas' current drought conditions.

Minutes from the previous meeting were approved, and there were no absent Board members from that meeting.

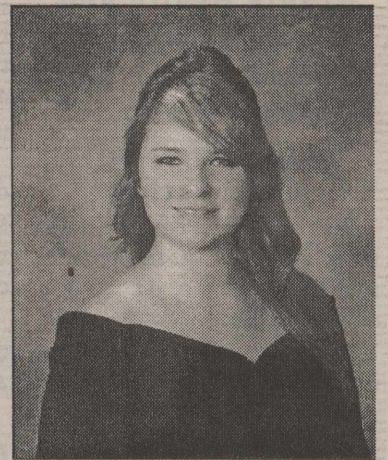
The Board went into Executive Session at 10 AM to discuss Personnel. The Board returned to regular session at 10:39. No action was needed.

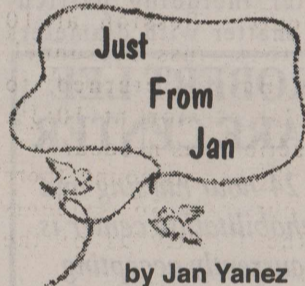
**The Most Problematic Plant**

With the recent rains that Coke County has received, brush mangers should opt to change their spraying routines for the next few weeks. While soil moisture is essential for spraying prickly pear, it can create heartaches while trying to spray mesquites if it is overabundant.

In the areas of the county that received multiple inches of rain, watch the mesquite trees over the next few weeks and the trees will go from a dark olive green to a bright green color. This color lets us know that the trees are putting on new growth and the flow of carbohydrates is moving up the tree.

When this process occurs, it is difficult for the herbicides to go against the flow of the carbohydrates. As the soil dries out and warms up, the mesquite leaves mature to the point they are able to replenish and the carbohydrate flow is reversed. The tree starts to replenish the carbohydrate reserves in the root system, which takes place when the leaves are mature and fully developed. This is the best time to apply leaf herbicides and

will result in a higher mortality rate due to the herbicides being carried down in the root system of the trees. This occurs when the soil temp reaches 75 degrees. However, for most brush mangers, just look for a uniform dark olive green color. This, in combination with mature leaves, is a good indicator that the soil temp has reached 75 degrees.

- Eat fruits like watermelon and pineapple rather than drinking the juice. They are cooling and perfect for hot summer days. They have high water content and are rich in minerals. Another perfect fruit for summer months is the apricot as it is good for fluid retention. Honeydew melon, commonly known as musk-

melon cools the body so gorge on it. The vitamin C and minerals present in these fruits are an added benefit.

- Munch on cucumbers and tomatoes. These foods have more than 90% of their weight in water content.

- Fresh citrus fruits such as orange, grapefruits, lemon and lime are excellent as they not only hydrate the body but also provide valuable nutrients.

- Take a break from coffee this summer and sip the benefits of green tea. Enjoy it with lemon, as it will keep the body from retaining water. Herbal iced teas are also great thirst quenchers. Be adventurous and mix and match flavors.

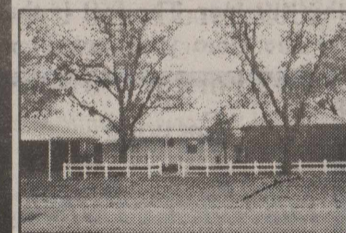


