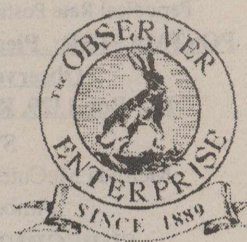

He is a member of the San Angelo Cowboy Church and serves on several advisory boards and has belonged to numerous civic organizations.

He served as a Navy hospital corpsman with the 3rd Marine Division during the Viet Nam Conflict.

During the four years he served, he was deployed all over southeast Asia.

John comes from a strong military heritage. His father was on the Battleship Massachusetts in WWII and was in most of the big battles, in the Pacific, Iwo Jima, Coral Sea etc. His brother was a Marine and his son was a Navy Seabee.

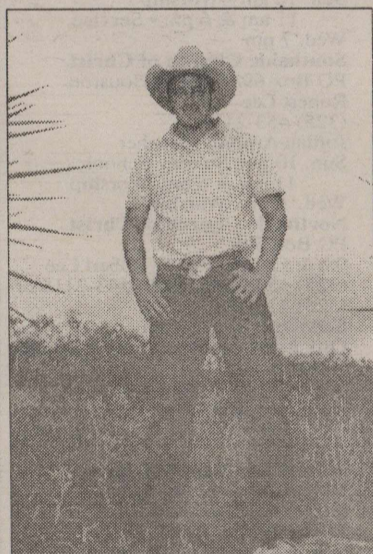

Austin

Stanley Clay Austin, 79, passed away peacefully on Sunday, June 9, 2013. He was preceded in death by his wife, Janice Lynn Austin and daughter, Janet Lei Austin. Stanley is survived by two sisters, Eva Ruth Taylor of Marshfield, Missouri, and Delia Jane Austin of Fort Worth, Texas. He is also survived by his devoted friend of 11 years, Judy Evans of Panorama Village, Texas.

Gardening and oil painting were his lifelong hobbies. Stanley was President Emeritus of the Texas Master Gardener Association - Montgomery County. He cultivated over 250 plant varieties in his greenhouse, floral and vegetable gardens. Numbered reproductions of his original oil paintings on canvas have been sold to individuals and auctioned at charitable events. He held copyrights to six (6) original Santa Claus portraits/scenes.

The son of the late Isham M. Austin, Sr. and Angie Delila Byrd, Stanley was born and reared on the Austin Ranch near Robert Lee, Texas. Stanley graduated from Angelo State University and later pursued advanced training in marketing at Western Michigan University, Purdue University, the Sterling Institute, and the University of Chicago. The Quaker Oats Company offered Stanley a Marketing Specialist position while searching for new recruits on the college campus. During the Korean War, The Quaker Oats Company issued him a military service leave of absence after the U. S. Naval Air Force assigned him to active duty. He served in the Far East as a courier aboard a P2V patrol bomber squadron and was awarded the China Service Medal after he completed combat duty in the Taiwan Straits.

After Stanley's return from military service, he resumed his employment and held a variety of assignments in corporate

sales and marketing within The Quaker Oats Company. In 1979, he was appointed to a sales manager position, southwest region, Houston. He retired in 1996 after 42 years employment at The Quaker Oats Company (1954-1996) and served on The Quaker Oats Company Advisory Board until 2000.

Graveside services were held at 2 pm, Tuesday, June 11, 2013, at Sanco Cemetery in Robert Lee, Texas. Arrangements were conducted by Shaffer Funeral Home.

many seeds that soon choke fence lines, so it's a constant battle to keep fences clean. Pasture fencing runs to multiple thousands of dollars per mile, so like any other capital improvement, it pays in the long run to keep them maintained.



Don't Text & Drive! West Coke County EMS presented a program to the Robert Lee High School Juniors and Seniors on texting and driving. The students were presented with T-Shirts and thumb bands reminding them that texting and driving kills. They were also shown clips of videos of young people involved in wrecks from texting and driving resulting in the deaths of drivers, passengers, or other vehicles with multiple fatalities.

"The trouble is due to the birds' varied diet; many different brush species infest fences, so it's hard to know just what herbicides give the best control. We'll discuss some work here in the county using various mixtures that give excellent control without having to use many different formulations."

Other topics will include juniper or 'cedar' mortality and herbicide laws and regulations.

Three Texas Department of Agriculture private pesticide applicator continuing education units will be available - two general units and one laws and regulations unit.

Individual registration fee will be due upon arrival.

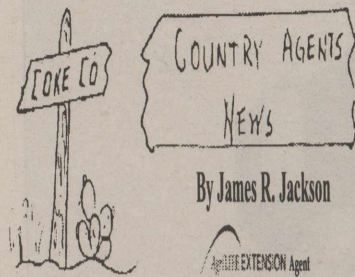

Rangeland Management Equals Water Management

An old topic to us all is brush management, as much as everyone likes to see a nice smooth pasture and one that is easy to move livestock and run a 4-wheeler across. We need to ask ourselves, do we sacrifice production for looks. In the dried out landscape of Coke County, I would like to throw out some food for thought. Keep every drop of water that falls on your place and all that your uphill neighbor will give you.

There are many practices that can help achieve this goal. These can include brush control, grazing intensity and riparian area management. Practices such as brush control are always thought to decrease the amount of brush and increase the amount of grass. However, let's also think of increasing water as well. During the drought that we have been in for the past few years, many pastures only have water in a depression in the ground, which could have been caused from clearing the brush. Now, as a result of clearing the brush and leaving the depression in the ground, you have a means of slowing down the water and holding it to grow grass.

Other means of pasture management to conserve water is grazing management. Grass roots serve many purposes. Two of the most basic are to take up nutrients from the soil and bring it to the plants and to keep the soil loose where water infiltrates into the soil instead of running off of the soil. The easiest way to maintain a good root system is to maintain good above-ground plant structure such as leaves and roots. By utilizing the old theory of leave half - take half, you will allow the above-ground portion of the plant to maintain enough structure to support the roots.

Another way to improve water with grazing management is to control the grazing in the riparian areas. Riparian areas are classified as the interface between the creek, river or stream. When proper management occurs, these areas can produce more vegetation than many land managers could ever imagine. For a riparian area

to maintain maximum production, it is necessary to hold off grazing until you can establish a stable plant community and stabilize the banks to prevent erosion. Once the banks get an established plant community, you can utilize this area with short duration grazing.

Bronte Longhorn Golf Club announces Summer Youth Golf Program

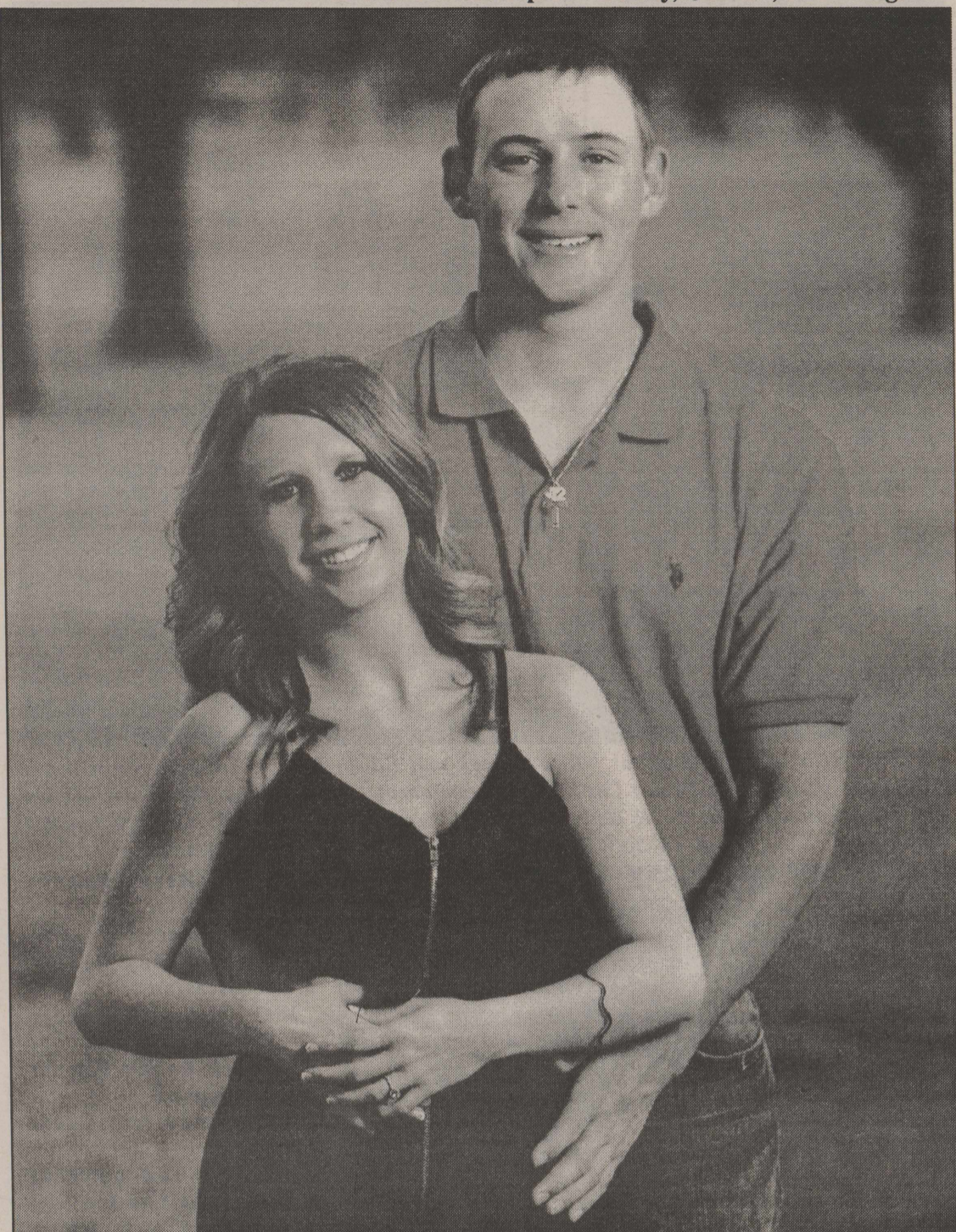
The Bronte Longhorn Golf Club will be hosting a Summer Youth Golf Program that is open to all area youth. This summer, learn to play golf or just improve your game.
