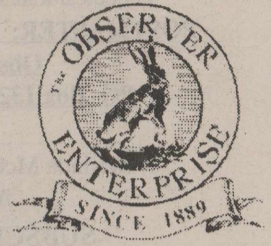

Bronte Water

Restrictions detailed

Due to the continuing lack of general rains, the City of Bronte has entered into Stage I of the Drought Contingency Plan. Customers are asked to water only between the hours of 6 pm until 12 midnight and 12 midnight to 10 am. All commercial water users are requested to reduce water use to the greatest extent possible.

Use Of Water From Fire Hydrants Is Prohibited

All citizens of Bronte and Robert Lee are asked to report any trucks that are taking water from fire hydrants. Fire trucks are the only ones allowed to use the fire hydrants. Residents in Robert Lee should call 453-2831 and residents in Bronte should call 473-3501. If you are unable to contact anyone at these numbers, contact the Sheriff's office at 453-2717.

During this time of drought, it is essential that water be restricted to only authorized users.

A. No person may sell, detonate, ignite, or in any way use fireworks classified under 49 C.F.R. part. 173.100(r)(2) (10-1-86 edition), as "skyrockets with sticks" and "missiles with fins" in any portion of the unincorporated area of Coke County.

B. This Order does not prohibit:

1. common fireworks, small in size classified as Class C explosives;

2. large fireworks devices designed primarily to produce visible or audible effects by combustion, deflagration, or detonation and classified as Class B explosive by the U.S. Dept. of Trans. [TEX.

OCC. CODE, Chapter 2154].

C. A person commits an offense if the person knowingly or intentionally violates a prohibition established by this Order. An offense under this order is a Class C. Misdemeanor.

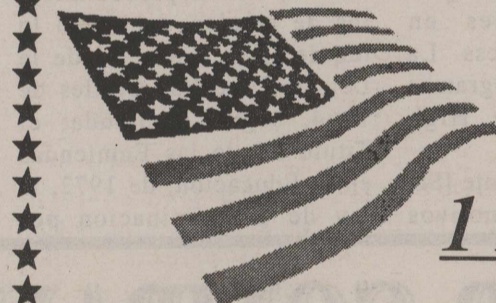


