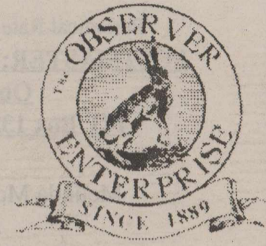

Everyone is encouraged to come and worship, sing praises and hear the Word of Lord preached.

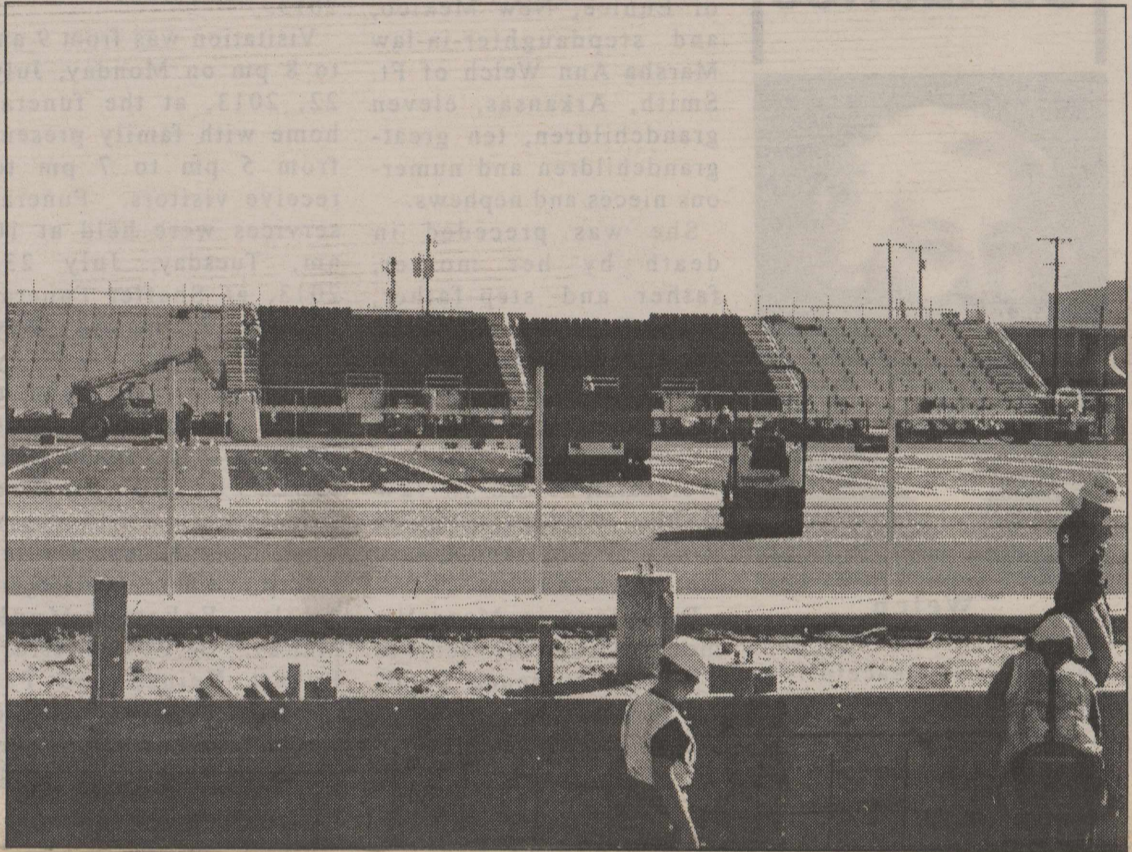
## TMDL meeting set for July 31 in Bronte

A TMDL meeting will be held Wednesday, July 31, 2013, at 9 am in the Community Room of the Bronte Housing Authority at 116 NE Railroad. The meeting concerns the Implementation Plan Evaluation for Total Maximum Daily Load for Dissolved Solids on Stream Segment 1426, Colorado River below E.V. Spence Reservoir.

Goals of the meeting include: Build a representative and inclusive Coordination Committee; Discuss possible workgroups; and Set ground rules for I-Plan Process.

The agenda includes: welcome and introduction; finalization of coordination committee; setting ground rules; forming work groups; and discussion of the next steps.

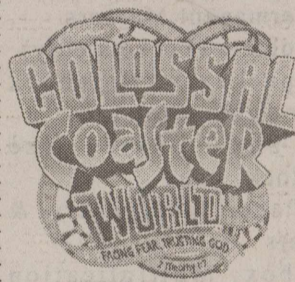

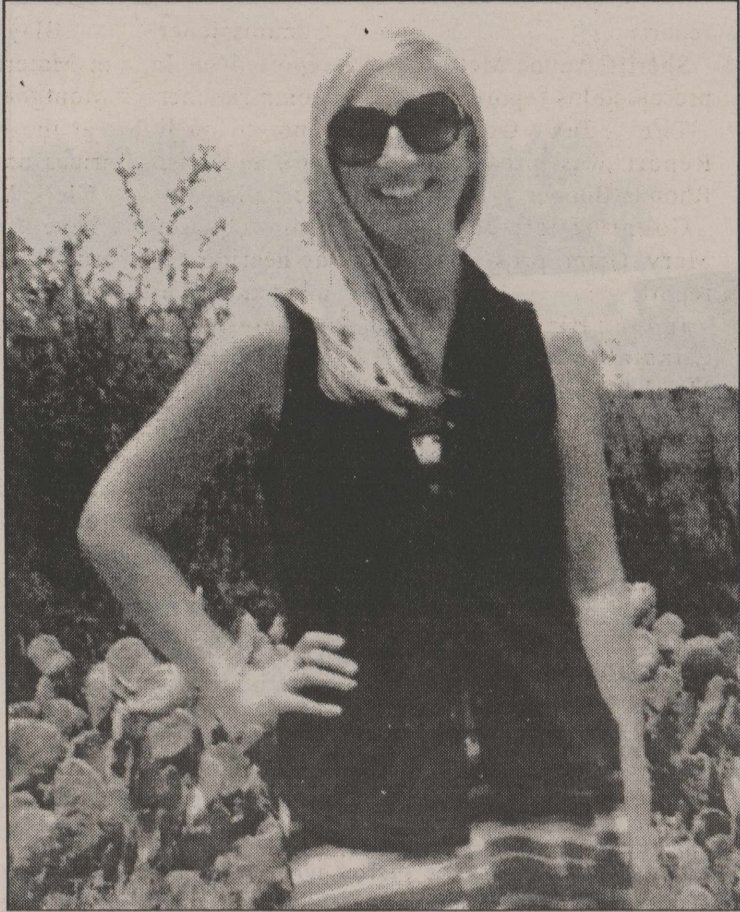

Miranda Wauson

**Wauson speaks to RL Methodist**

Miranda Wauson of the Dominican Republic was the guest speaker at the Robert Lee United Methodist Church worship service on Sunday, July 14, 2013.

Miranda told of her mission work in the Dominican Republic. She serves with the Makarios International School that teaches impoverished children from Pre-K through 4th grade.

Miranda showed a video of the first day of school. Most of the children are brought to school by a parent or family member on motorcycles, the common mode of travel. They line up for a breakfast of oatmeal, fruit, and a multi-vitamin in the cafeteria. Then the day begins with singing songs and praying. After a morning of classes and playground time, the children are served a noon lunch of beans, rice, and meat (the same menu everyday).

The children are issued uniforms: two t-shirts, one pair of pants and a pair of sneakers. They are given another pair of shoes later in the year.

Miranda told of the flood that inundated their school last November. The nearby river, Rio Camu, overflowed and four foot of water ran through the school destroying books, equipment, and the playground area.

With the help of special donors, flood relief, and much hard work, all has been restored. The playground is more beautiful than ever with landscaping, pathways, and new playground equipment.

Miranda began her three year experience serving as librarian of the school. All books are in Spanish and all students and staff speak Spanish. The need for an administrator of the school occurred and Miranda was appointed to the job, serving in lieu of a principal. This

spring, she was appointed interim director of the Makarios operation in the Dominican Republic which includes the school. She is now beginning her third year of service. Prior to answering the call to serve God as a missionary, Miranda had a lucrative, exciting job with Corematrics in Austin. The corporation was purchased by IBM while she was working there. Her job was to present instructions to corporate executives on how to use company-produced software. Miranda has made her presentation in about twenty of the fifty states, Canada, China, and Japan.

The pastor of Miranda's church in Austin preached a sermon saying all people are called to serve God and some are free to answer the call for Foreign Service. She was inspired to realize that she was free to do just that and she answered the call.

In the late 1980's, Miranda attended second and third grade at Robert Lee Elementary in Robert Lee. She is a graduate of Midland Lee High School in Midland. She was awarded a scholarship to St. Edwards University in Austin where she received her college education.

Miranda is the granddaughter of Jamie Boren and the late Bob Boren of Robert Lee. She is the daughter of Kathy Alexander of Austin and Trent Wauson of Bolivia, South America. She is also the granddaughter of Lois Wauson and the late Eddie Wauson of Floresville.

At the service Sunday, July

14, Mary Bessent was the worship leader. Gayle Bolding read the scripture that Miranda had chosen to go with her presentation, Psalm 96:2-3:

"Sing to the Lord, praise his name; proclaim his salvation day after day. Declare his glory among the nations, his marvelous deed among all people."
