Beginning early Thursday morning, August 29, 2013, law enforcement Brandon Lawson's truck was abandoned south of Bronte. Officers widened their search to include "likely lines of travel", such as river beds, etc., leading away from the main search area. Thursday's search turned up no sign of Brandon Lawson. Assisting with this search were members of the Coke County Sheriff's Office, Texas Rangers, San Angelo Fire Department, Tom Green County Sheriff's Office, Department of Public Safety Highway Patrol, Department of Public Safety Criminal Investigative Division, and a Search and Rescue Tracker.
