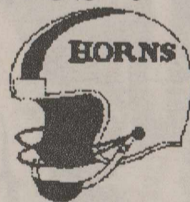

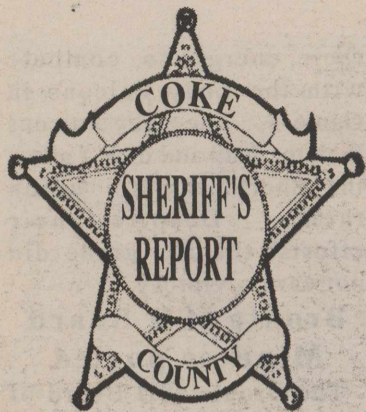

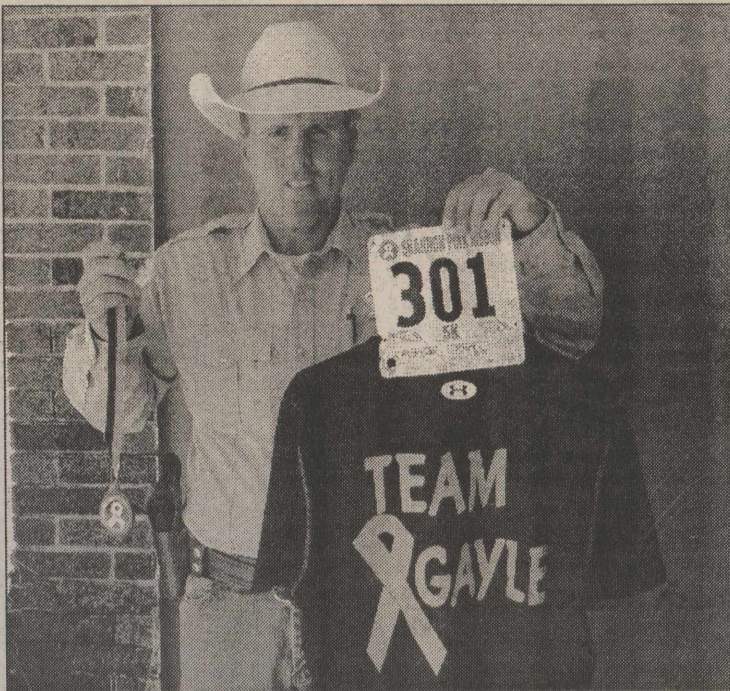
Council. At the conference, Thorn will be introduced as the 2014 TMCN President.

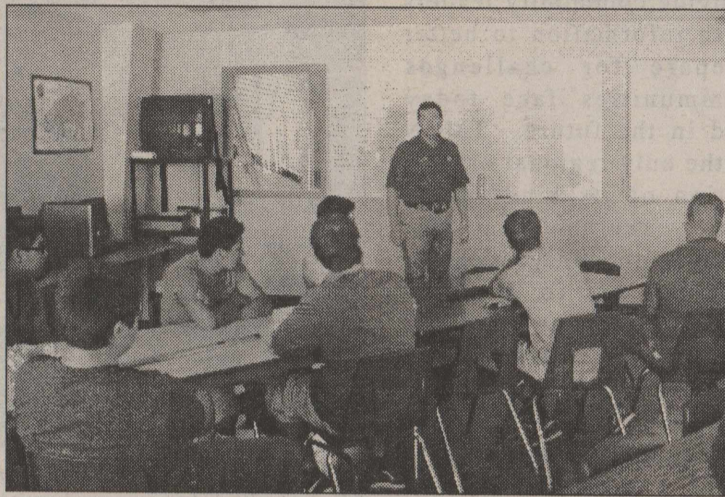

The Bronte Longhorns hit the win column last Friday night as they defeated the Irion County Hornets at home 26-24. Both teams scored a TD in each of the four quarters, and it came down to PAT tries as the Horns converted on two, and the Hornets didn't convert any.

The Longhorns made two big two point conversion stops as the Hornets went for two on two of their conversion attempts and the Horns defense held them out.

The Bronte defense was led in tackles by Ean Ward and Jared Scott as they each recorded 8 1/2 tackles and Lance Burns had 7 1/2 tackles. Ward and Burns each recovered a fumble that stopped Irion County drives and Mizael Perez intercepted a pass on the Hornets last drive to preserve the win. The Horns did a good job of slowing down the Hornets big plays as they held their RB Dontae Harris to 23 carries

Offensively, the Horns were led by Kyler Richards as he rushed the ball 10 times for 111 yards and a TD. Jared Scott had 4 carries for 68 yards and 2 TD's, Mizael Perez had 5 carries for 52 yards, and Tristin Minjarez 14 carries for 33 yards. Richards scored in the first quarter from 17 yards, Perez scored in the second quarter on a 36 yard run, and Scott scored in the third quarter on a 7 yard run, and finally in the fourth on a 17 yard run. Our offensive line play was better and led to the opportunities for our backs to move the ball better this week than we have the past couple. Mizael Perez connected on his last two PATs after just missing on the first two.

The win brings the Longhorns record to 1-5 on the season and 1-1 in district play. The Longhorns are off this week and will resume district play next week in Christoval.

The Bronte Shorthorns tied the Irion County Hornets in an exciting and entertaining game last Thursday, 24-24. Both offenses moved the ball in the first half, scoring a total of 6 touchdowns. In the second half, both team defenses adjusted and played better, and only one

TD was scored.

The Shorthorns got on the scoreboard first when QB Tanner Bedford completed a TD pass of about 20 yards to Shawn Puentez. The extra point failed. After a Hornet TD, Bronte came right back to score on a pass from Bedford to Zach Jackson. The extra point failed.

In the second quarter following another Irion County TD, the Shorthorns scored on a long pass from Bedford to Puentez. Late in the first half, Bedford threw his fourth TD pass, this time to Aaron Cervenka. Both extra points failed. The Shorthorns led 24-16 at halftime. Some excellent blocking by tackles Emmanuel Casillas and Nathan Arthur, guards Coltan Martin and Kevin Parks, and center Hunner Powell contributed to many pass completions and successful runs. RB Garrett Knight also had some key blocks in pass protection, along with some good runs. Good blocking on the perimeter by receivers Tanner Braswell, Jason Woehrl, and Hunter Hortenstine contributed to the Shorthorn offense.

The third quarter was scoreless as the Bronte defense began to play with more consistency. Some key stops were made by Emmanuel Casillas, Bedford, Cervenka, Martin, and Knight. Also contributing in the defensive line were Danny Pullen and Raphael Casillas. Providing good

pass coverage in the secondary was defensive back Anthony Demory.

The Hornets scored in the fourth quarter by converting twice on fourth down. The extra point was good to tie the game. Bronte drove the ball deep into Irion County territory, but ran out of time at the end. The Shorthorns had a good outing and played well. They are getting better each week. Following an open date, they will next be in action on October 17, at home against Christoval.

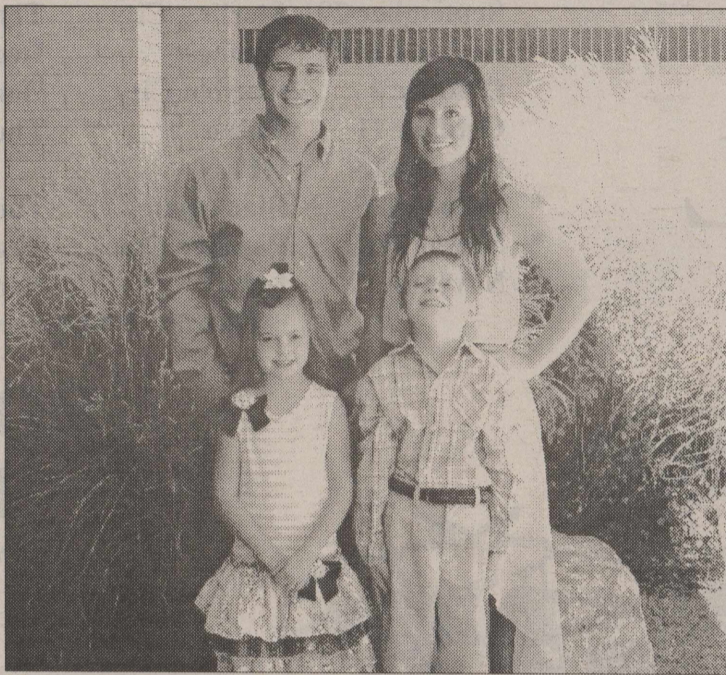
