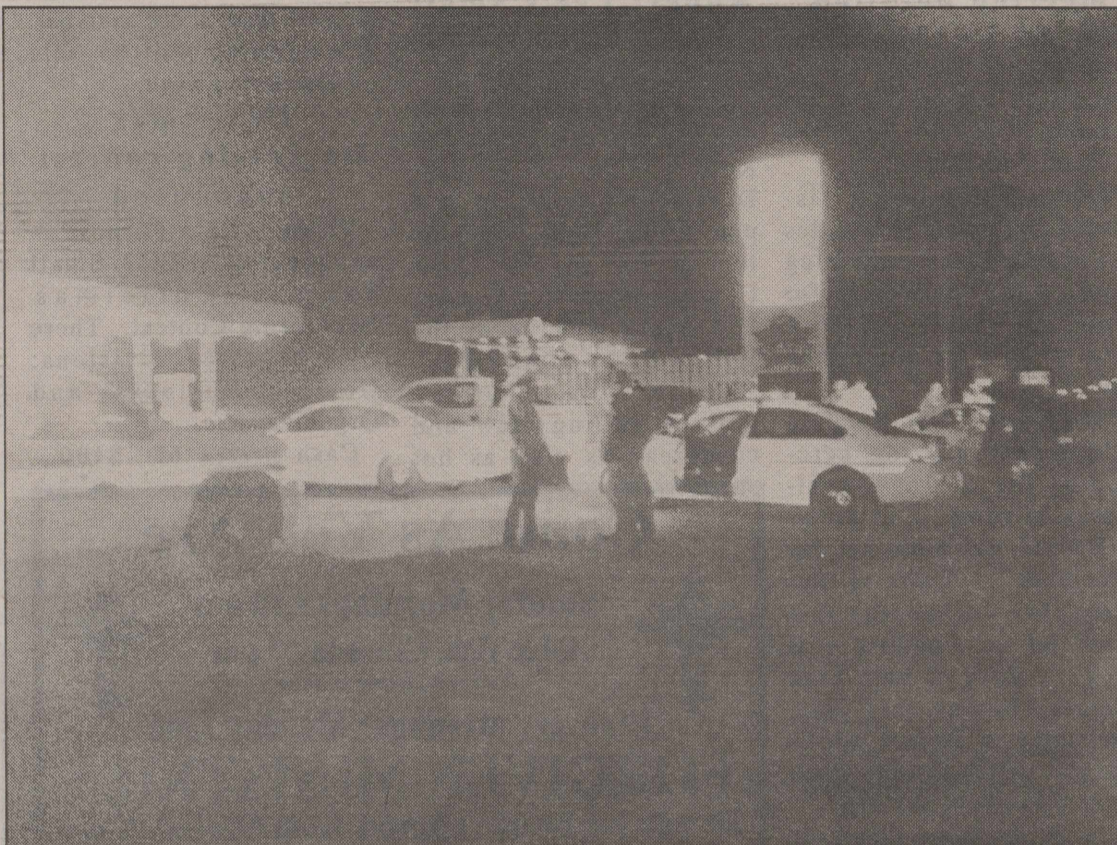
The Bronte Longhorn Golf Club is sponsoring a 3 person 27 hole golf tournament on Saturday, November 2. Tee time is 9 am.

Multi-County Chase Ends in Bronte! A "slow speed" chase which began in Abilene last Wednesday evening ended in the Stripes parking lot in Bronte. It began when a car refused to stop for Abilene Police. At the Abilene city limits, Taylor County Sheriff's Deputies took over. First reports from the Taylor County Deputies participating was that the situation involved a kidnapping and the woman in the car was a hostage. They discerned this information because the woman kept trying to jump from the car and had made contact by telephone. One Taylor County Deputy stated that the Taylor County Sheriff's Office procedure requires its deputies to follow and not attempt any maneuvers to stop a vehicle. They relayed to the Coke County Sheriff's Office that the man would only stop at the Stripes in Bronte because he was afraid of being shot by officers if he stopped in a remote area. Sheriff Wayne McCutchen and Deputy Brian Albertson were the only members of the Coke County Sheriff's Office on duty. Deputy Albertson joined the chase as it entered our county. Sheriff McCutchen went to Stripes to warn employees and customers. He had them clear the parking lot and lock the store. As the suspect entered the Bronte city limits, he was followed by six Taylor County Deputies, one DPS Trooper and Deputy Albertson. Sheriff McCutchen forced the suspect's vehicle into the curb at the entrance of the Stripes parking lot and he and Deputy Albertson used their vehicles to block the man's escape. McCutchen and Albertson then forcibly removed the man from his vehicle at gunpoint.

Upon further investigation, it was determined the woman was not a hostage. Both suspects had long histories of drug abuse. Sheriff McCutchen declined to press local charges and turned both suspects and the vehicle over to the Taylor County deputies. "I refuse to allow our county to pay jail and towing bills for a situation that should never have entered our borders." stated Sheriff McCutchen.

Everyone is encouraged to attend these events and to support the local businesses by shopping at home.

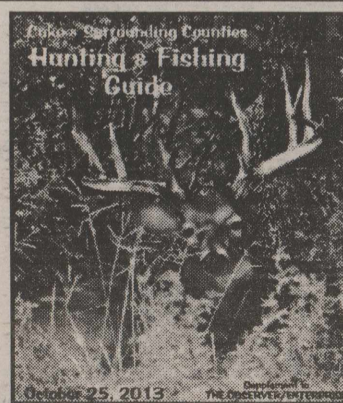
Potato Bake Luncheon set for November 5


Entry forms must be dropped off at these same

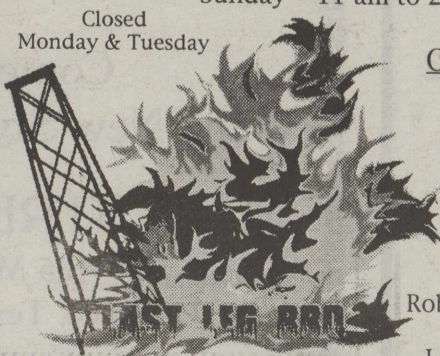

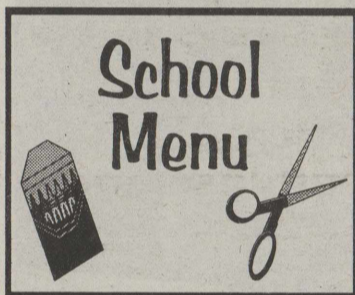

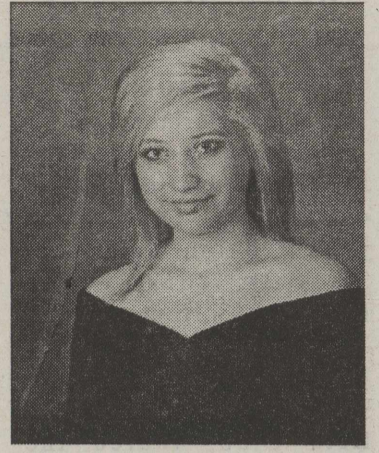
The 8th grade continued the momentum by coming out

THE CITY COUNCIL OF
THE CITY OF ROBERT LEE
DOES HEREBY AMEND
SECTION G AND SECTION I
ESTABLISHING NEW
RATES FOR TRASH
COLLECTION SERVICES.
SECTION G: COLLECTION
CHARGES**

The following rate schedule is hereby implemented as stated in Exhibit A of the Solid Waste Contract between the City of Robert Lee and Duncan Disposal:

(a) Premises inside city limits used for private residences, single mobile home sites and/or locations, shall be charged a base rate of \$16.33 per month per family unit as to occupied residences, apartments, and units, with one collection per week.

(b) Premises outside city limits used for private residences, single mobile home sites and/or residences, shall be charged \$17.55 per month with one collection per week.

(c) Premises used for commercial, business, and/or public purposes not receiving sanitation container service as described herein shall be charged \$16.33 per month with one collection per week.

(d) Charge for additional carts shall be \$10.18 per month, with one collection per week.

(e) Base rate may be adjusted monthly based on the previous month's cost of diesel fuel as published by the Department of Energy - Gulf Coast Region.

**SECTION I:
CONTAINERIZED SYSTEM**

The following rate schedule is hereby implemented as stated in Exhibit A of the Solid Waste Contract between the City of Robert Lee and Duncan Disposal:

(a) Public, private, business and/or commercial locations and sites, including certain private residences receiving a 3 yard sanitation container system shall be charged the following rate with one collection per week:

3 yard container 1x per week - \$46.00

3 yard container 2x per week - \$74.18

(2x per week is special rate established when service was reduced to 3 yard containers and one collection per week.)

WHEREAS, it is deemed in the best interest of the City of

Bronte for the health, safety and welfare of its citizens than an ordinance be established to regulate manufacture homes within the City of Bronte, Texas, and that mobile homes be prohibited; and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance shall be known and cited as the "Manufactured Home Ordinance" of the City Bronte, Texas.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF BRONTE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1-DEFINITIONS

D. HUD-Code Manufactured Home-A structure constructed on or after June 15, 1976, according to the rules of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, transportable in one or more sections, which, in the traveling mode, is eight feet or more in width or 40 body feet or more in length, or when erected on site is 320 or more square feet, and which is built on a permanent chassis and designed to be used as a dwelling, with or without, a permanent foundation when connected to the required utilities, and includes plumbing, heating, air conditioning and electrical systems. Manufactured home or manufactured housing means a HUD-Code manufactured home or mobile home.

E. Mobile Home-A structure constructed before June 15, 1976, according to the rules of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, transportable in one or more sections, which, in the traveling mode, is eight feet or more in width or 40 body feet or more in length, or when erected on site is 320 or more square feet, and which is built on

a permanent chassis and designed to be used as a dwelling, with or without, a permanent foundation when connected to the required utilities and includes plumbing, heating, air conditioning and electrical systems.

G. Manufactured Housing District-All HUD-Code manufactured homes older than ten (10) years of age at the time of application and all mobile homes in the City of Bronte shall be located within the Manufactured Housing District.

**SECTION 2 -
MANUFACTURED HOMES,
MOBILE HOME
RESTRICTIONS**

Manufactured homes, HUD-Code manufactured homes, and mobile homes shall not be placed, installed or located on any property that fronts on any State or U.S. highway. Manufactured, HUD-Code manufactured or mobile homes being greater than ten years of age at the time of installation is sought shall also be prohibited from locating the City unless they are located in the established Manufactured Home District.

**SECTION 3 -
MANUFACTURED HOUSING
DISTRICT ESTABLISHED**

For the purpose of this ordinance, Block 9, Block 10 and Block 11, OT, Bronte, Texas, are hereby designated as the Manufactured Housing District.

**SECTION 5-MOBILE
HOMES PROHIBITED**

No mobile home shall be permitted within the City Limits of the City of Bronte, Texas unless located in the Manufactured Housing District. Any mobile home located in the City legally,

prior to the enactment of this ordinance and used and occupied as a residential dwelling shall be allowed to remain. The mobile home may be replaced with a newer mobile home only one time.

2. Use and Occupancy Permit-\$35.00-This permit is the prerequisite for a Use and Occupancy Certificate and includes the cost of the initial Use and Occupancy Inspection.

3. Re-Inspection Request-\$25.00-This fee must be paid before the Building Official will conduct a Use and Occupancy re-inspection after a failed inspection. This fee will be paid after each subsequent failure before another inspection is made.

SECTION 14-EXCEPTIONS

This ordinance is prospective and does not apply to HUD-Code manufactured Homes and Mobile Homes currently used and occupied as residential dwellings in the City on the Effective Date of this Ordinance. HUD-Code Manufactured Homes and Mobile Homes currently used and occupied as residential dwellings are exempted as long as the current mobile home or HUD-Code Manufactured Homes exists on that particular lot. A Mobile Home (non HUD-Code Manufactured) subject to this section may be replaced only

one time with a newer mobile home.

**SECTION 15-PENALTY FOR
NON-COMPLIANCE**

Any person, firm, or corporation violating this Ordinance or any part of this Ordinance or providing false information to a City official concerning licensing or permitting under this Ordinance and found guilty by the Judge of the Municipal Court, will be guilty of a Class "C" Misdemeanor, and be fined not more than \$500.00 (Five Hundred Dollars) except for health violations which may be fined not more than \$2000.00 (Two Thousand Dollars). Each day such violation continues, or be permitted to continue, shall be a separate offense.

**SECTION 18-REPEAL OF
ORDINANCE**

This ordinance hereby repeals Ordinance #325 and all ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance.

**SECTION 19-EFFECTIVE
DATE**

This ordinance shall become effective October 20, 2013.

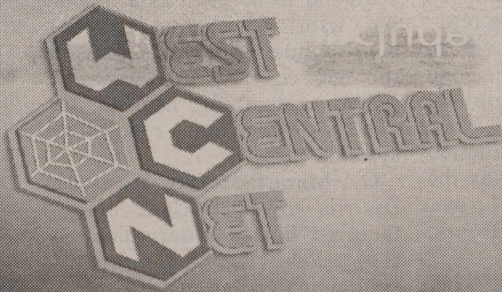
