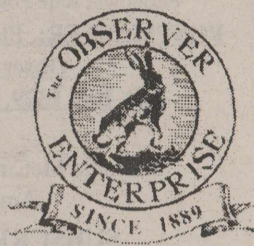

The menu will consist of deer and elk sandwiches, smoked sausage, beans, soft drinks, and dessert. Serving will begin at 11 am and go until 2 pm. The location is B&K Processing (behind Hall's Grocery) in Bronte.

If you haven't eaten the variety of wild game sandwiches and sausages prepared at Bronte, don't miss this opportunity to sample some of these excellent meats. In previous years, the menu has also included rattlesnake and other exotic wild game cooked on the grill for your sampling pleasure.

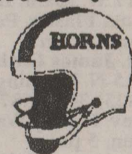

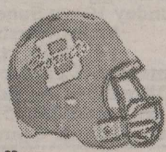

### Amendment Election set for Tuesday

On Election Day, Tuesday, November 5, 2013, Coke County Precincts 1 and 3 will be consolidated and held at the Courthouse. Precincts 2 and 4 will also be consolidated and held at the Bronte Senior Citizens Building on election day.

The proposed Texas Constitutional amendments will appear on the ballot in the following order:

Proposition 1 (HJR 62) Authorizes and exemption from ad valorem taxation of all or part of the market value of the residence homestead of the surviving spouse of a member of the armed services of the United States who is killed in action.

Proposition 2 (HJR 79) Eliminates an obsolete Constitutional requirement for a State Medical Education Board and a State Medical Education Fund, neither are operational.

Proposition 3 (HJR 133) Authorizes a political subdivision of this state to extend the number of days that aircraft parts that are exempt from ad valorem taxation due to their location in this state for a temporary period may be located in this state for purposes of qualifying for the tax exemptions.

Proposition 4 (HJR 24) Authorizes an exemption from ad valorem taxation of part of the market value of the residence homestead of a partially disabled veteran or the surviving spouse of a partially disabled veteran if the residence homestead was donated to the disabled veteran by a charitable organization.

Proposition 5 (SJR 18) Authorizes the making of a reverse mortgage loan for the purchase of homestead property and to amend lender disclosures and other requirements in connection with a reverse mortgage loan.

Proposition 6 (SJR 1) Provides for the creation of the State Water Implementation Fund for Texas and the State Water Implementation Fund for Texas to assist in the financing of priority projects in the state water plan to ensure the availability of adequate water resources.

-Works in conjunction with House Bill 4 which restructured the Texas Water Development Board to modernize and prioritize funding for water projects and House Bill 1025 which transfers \$2 billion from oil & gas severance taxes to effort.

-The state population is expected to nearly double by 2060. Meeting that need (estimated to be \$53 billion) requires state participation to keep costs lower for local investment in new water resources, delivery systems, and conservation efforts.

Proposition 7 (HJR 87) Authorizes a home-rule

municipality to provide in its charter the procedure to fill a vacancy on its governing body for which the unexpired term is 12 months or less.

Proposition 8 (HJR 147 and SJR 54) Repeals Section 7, Article IX, Texas Constitution, which relates to the creation of a hospital district in Hidalgo County.

Proposition 9 (SJR 42) Expands the type of sanctions that may be assessed against a judge or justice following a formal proceeding instituted by the State Commission on Judicial Conduct.

The Invocation and pledge were led by Erin Oleksiuk, George Grim, appointed board member, was sworn in by Robin Allen.

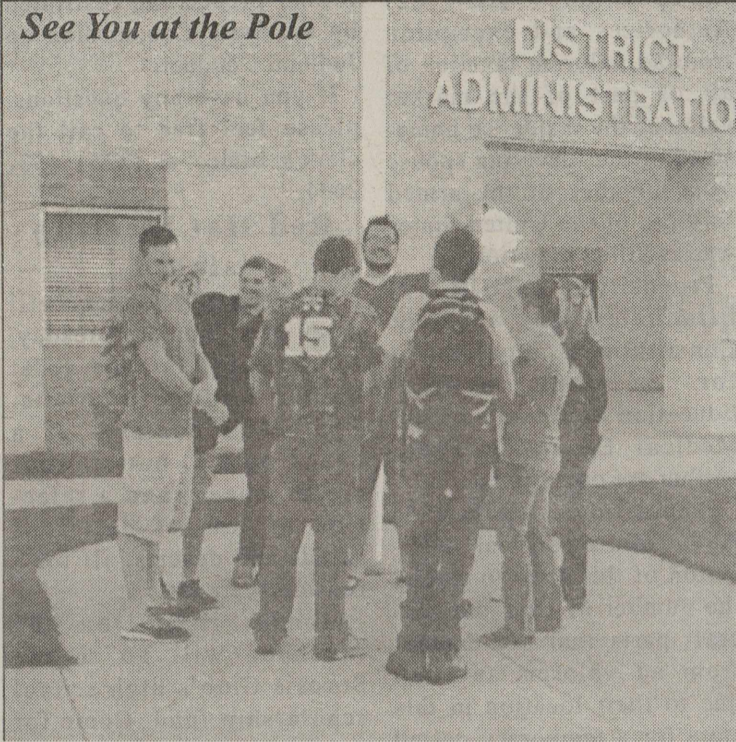

Improvement Plans as presented. The motion was seconded by Irma Torres. All voted for.

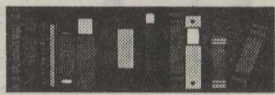

## Photo ID now required for voting in Texas

Texas Secretary of State John Steen announced that photo identification will now be required when voting in Texas elections. His announcement follows a decision by the U.S. Supreme Court that cleared the way for photo ID requirements in Texas, originally passed by the Texas Legislature in 2011, to take effect.

A voter will be required to show one of the following forms of photo identification at the polling location before the voter will be permitted to cast a vote:

- Texas driver license issued by the Texas Dept. of Public Safety (DPS)
- Texas Election Identification Certificate issued by DPS
- Texas personal identification card issued by DPS
- Texas concealed hand-

gun license issued by DPS

- United States military identification card containing the person's photograph

- United States citizenship certificate containing the person's photograph

- United States passport

With the exception of the U.S. citizenship certificate, the identification must be current or have expired no more than 60 days before being presented at the polling place.

Election identification certificates are now available only for voters who do not already have a required form of photo identification. There is no fee for the certificate. Information on how to obtain an election identification certificate can be found at [www.dps.texas.gov](http://www.dps.texas.gov). You may also contact DPS by telephone at (512) 424-2600.

To review frequently asked questions and answers, visit [www.votetexas.gov](http://www.votetexas.gov).

Texas Secretary of State John Steen said his office is working to educate the public before the November election to make the transition to the photo ID requirement as smooth as possible. The state office will air television commercials, YouTube videos and include a new website that should be able to answer many questions.

Keith Ingram, director of the elections division for the state, said if a name is "substantially similar" to the name on the registered voters list, then poll workers can note the name and allow the person to vote.

Voters who do not show proof of identity will be allowed to vote by provisional ballot. Refusing to

show ID is not valid ground for casting a provisional ballot, however "and it is likely that the voter's ballot will be rejected by the ballot board."

To have the provisional ballot count, the voter will have to visit their voter registrar's office within six calendar days of the election to either present a photo ID or submit a temporary affidavit attesting that he or she does not have any of the required photo IDs.

A permanent exemption is available for voters with documented disabilities.

Affidavits are available to voters who have a religious objection to being photographed and for voters who do not have any photo identification as a result of certain natural disasters.

In general, it is easier and cheaper to change a name on the voter registration records to match a driver's license or other identification.

The photo identification requirement does not have an address matching requirement, nor does it change the process for voting by mail. And while voter certificates (the cards sent to voters in the mail) will no longer be necessary to vote, they do contain precinct information, so officials recommend voters hang onto them and bring them to the polls.

October 7 was the last day to register or make changes for Tuesday's election. The November ballot for local voters will be the Texas Constitution amendments.

Coordinator, cautioned that such systems are only as good as the telephone number database supporting them. "If your phone number is not in the database, you will not be called." One of the reasons the CodeRED system was selected is it gives individuals and businesses the ability to add their own phone numbers directly into the system's database, this is an extremely important feature.

"No one should automatically assume his or her phone number is included," All individuals and businesses to log onto the Coke County website, [www.co.coke.tx.us](http://www.co.coke.tx.us) and follow the link to the "Co-

deRED Community Notification Enrollment" page. Those without Internet access may call 325-453-2641 and speak with the Coke County Judge's office to supply their information over the phone. Required information includes first and last name, street address (physical address, no P.O. boxes), city, state, zip code, and primary phone number, additional phone numbers can be entered as well.

All businesses should register, as well as all individuals who have unlisted phone numbers, who have changed their phone number or address within the past year, and those who use a cellular phone or VoIP phone as their primary number.

CodeRED allows geographically based delivery, which means street addresses are required to ensure emergency notification calls are received by the proper individuals in a given situation. The system works for cell phones too, but we need to have an associated street address to provide relevant messages.

CodeRED gives those who want to be included an easy and secure method for inputting information. The data collected will only be used for emergency notification purposes." Questions should be directed to the Coke County Judge's Office at 325-453-2641.

# Law enforcement concludes missing man is not in Coke County

Members of Texas Search and Rescue and various law enforcement agencies began arriving last Wednesday evening for Thursday's massive search for Brandon Lawson.

This latest search stems from an incident which occurred just before 1 am Friday, August 9, 2013. It began with a 911 call about a stranded motorist just south of Bronte on Highway 277. The driver was not at the vehicle when Chief Deputy Brandon Neal arrived just after 1 am. However at this time, investigation has revealed that Brandon Lawson was hiding in the brush (due to an outstanding felony warrant) watching Deputy Neal while speaking to his brother, Kyle Lawson, on his cell phone. According to Ladessa Lofton, no one has heard from Lawson since this time.

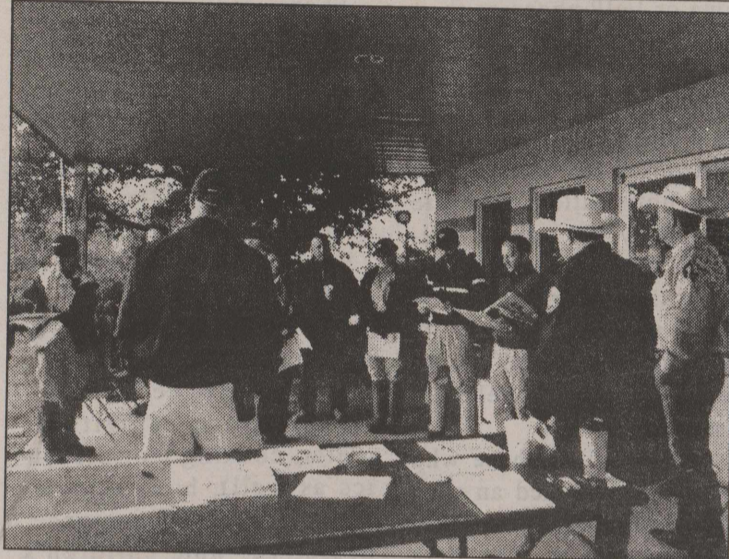
The Coke County Sheriff's Office, in conjunction with DPS and the Texas Rangers, had already conducted an aerial search and a ground grid search without revealing any clues to his whereabouts.

To rule out the possibility that Lawson had become lost in the brush and died, Coke County Sheriff Wayne McCutchen approved a search using cadaver or human remains (HR) dogs. The search was scheduled for Thursday, October 24, 2013.

Members of Texas Search and Rescue provided six HR dogs, handlers and flankers in addition to numerous support and logistics personnel for this search. According to Greg Pyles, TexSAR Chief Executive Officer and Incident Commander, TexSAR expended approximately \$25,000 for this search. TexSAR is a non-profit organization completely supported by private and corporate donations. The group only conducts law enforcement approved searches.

TexSAR uses "math and science" based upon information provided by the family to determine the size and area to be searched. The organization has a great track record with a 95% success rate. Their findings and reports have proven accurate and have stood up under scrutiny when used in court cases.

TexSAR's team included officers with Texas Division of Emergency Management, Cen-Tex Search and Rescue and the Lewisville Police Department. They also

brought in two game wardens with Texas Parks and Wildlife. Incident Commander Greg Pyles' resume lists several law enforcement positions, two of which include the US State Department operating overseas with diplomat security and following 9/11, a time with the US Transportation Security Administration.

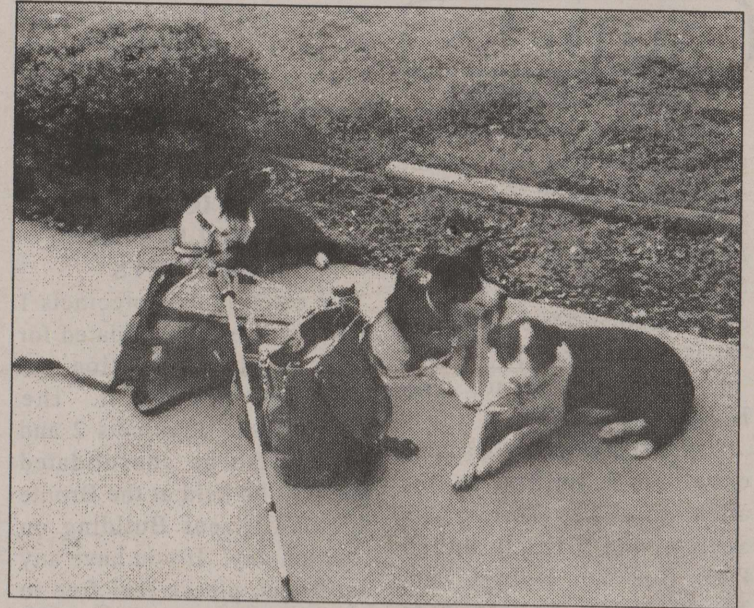
The TexSAR canines are highly trained. These HR dogs will not "hit" on varmint carcasses. However, dead hogs sometimes prove a distraction to HR animals. Each handler wears a gps device which provided Brandon Goering, Operations Section Chief, an extremely detailed analysis of all area covered.

The search was extended to the northeast following

one HR-dog showing slight interest. However even with the extension, the search revealed no sign of Brandon Lawson - no remains, no clothing, no wallet, no cell phone, and no keys.

Following a conversation with Sheriff McCutchen and Ranger Nick Hanna, the investigation will turn elsewhere and will not include any further searches unless new detailed information arises.

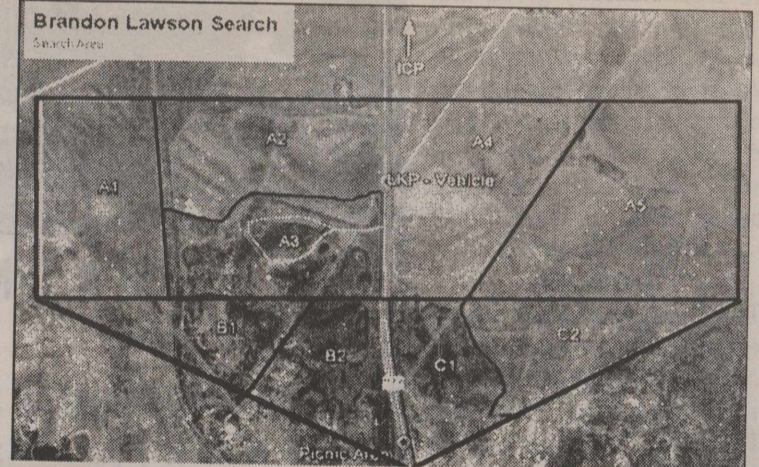
