All Coke County veterans can be properly recognized and encouraged to attend and during this year's program.

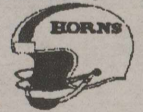

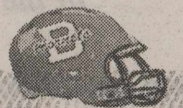

**Emert Ranch Range hosts Shooting Championship**

The Emert Ranch Range hosted the 5th annual 1000 yd Texas Metal Plate Championship on Friday the 11th of October and the next day, Saturday the 12th, the 400 yd West Texas Championship rifle shoot. Both of these events are held to benefit the Water Valley Volunteer Fire Department. The shoots were well attended by shooters from all over. The man who traveled the furthest to compete was Rolando Aviles of Puerto Rico.

Shooting conditions were typical of West Texas in that they changed every few minutes. 48 shooters competed in the 400 yd final shoot of the "Texas Long Range Shooter of the

Year" series. Shooters competed in four shoots held this year around Texas. The 2013 "Shooter of the Year" was won by Dennis Reed of San Angelo shooting a 6.5/284.

The 1000 yd Sniper Shoot was held early Friday morning. It is a one shot, cold barrel, no sight in contest. The format is as close to having to take a sniper shot as conditions will allow. The 2013 Texas Sniper champion is FBI agent Steve Field from Alabama. He was shooting a silenced Accuracy International .300 Win. Mag. His shot missed dead center by less than 3 inches.

The 1000 yd metal plate match followed the Sniper match. There were three classes to compete in, the .308 Tactical, the Open Tactical, and the Benchrest class. 36 shooters com-

peted with a few shooters shooting in more than one class. The 100 yd Benchrest shoot was won by Tymn Combest of San Angelo shooting a 7mm RSAUM. Joe Duke of Utopia won 2nd and Gary Foster of Sterling City won 3rd. The .308 Tactical shoot was won by Dr. Darrel Martin of Huntsville shooting a custom .308 and the Open Tactical was won by Leland Foster of Sterling City shooting a silenced Accuracy International .338 Lapua.

On Saturday the 400 yd match was hotly contested by many fine shooters. Shooting began at 9 am and lasted until about 3:30 pm. Each shooter shot five relays of ten shoots each at eight clays. One clay was 120mm in size worth 10 points, two clays were

90mm in size worth 20 points each, and five clays were 60mm (about 2 inches) in size worth 30 points each. The highest point total wins. Sam Duke of Utopia won the match shooting a .280 Duke Wildcat. Dr. Darrel Martin of Huntsville won 2nd, Donnel Gaines of Graham won 3rd, and Morgan Babin of Carrollton won 4th.

A fine noon meal of fajitas with all the fixins was

cooked and donated by the Roscoe and Les Turner families of Carlsbad to the W.V.V.F.D. shoot on Saturday. The trophies were sponsored by Randy Levens, Joel Gilstrap, and Roy Green of the Water Valley Oil Cartel and the Barney Sisco Ranch. We would like to thank all of the many others who took part in making the shoots a great success. This year the shoots raised \$9,500 for the W.V.V.F.D.

The Bronte Longhorns got a much needed victory this past Friday night in

Miles. The Horns defeated the Bulldogs by a score of 34-20.

The Longhorns played well on both sides of the ball, and controlled the game as the defense caused 4 turnovers. Kahd Turner recovered a Miles fumble, Ean Ward had an interception, and Kyler Richards had two interceptions. His first one was off a deflected pass that was knocked down by Joshua Puentez. Dakota Pullen also recovered a fumble on a kickoff return when the front line failed to handle the Bronte kick.

The Horns got a big night offensively from Mizael Perez who had 159 yards rushing and 3 TD's on just 6 carries. Also pitching in were Jared Scott 10 carries for 83 yards and a TD, Ean Ward 13 carries for 28 yards, and Kyler Richards completed two passes for 51 yards to Jared Scott and Ty Lee. This was the first time that Ty had returned from an ankle injury since the Eldorado game and it was certainly nice to have him back in the lineup however he went out later in the game with an injury. The Horns improve to 2-7 and 2-3 in district play and will play the season finale

this Friday night at home as they host the TLCA Eagles. Game time is at 7:30

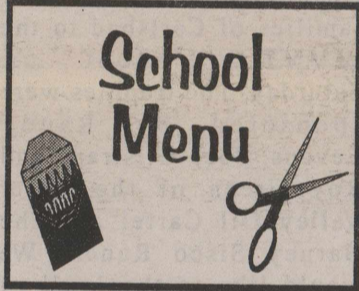
### Shorthorns fall to Yellowjackets

They are then given all the necessary technology for their robot along with a box of stuff. This box contains what could be used to build the robot -- PVC pipe, wood, aluminum, electrical wire, glue, tape, string and many other supplies not normally associated with a robot. The team then filled the six weeks with designing the robot, building and testing the robot, programming the robot, developing a marketing plan, creating a product booth, designing a t-shirt, coming up with a marketing presentation, keeping a engineering notebook, creating a website, and creating a strategy for spirit and sportsmanship. All of this is done in a real-world engineering experience. The team must create a robot to solve a problem. Students learn cooperation, sportsmanship, production, programming, website design, project management, problem solving, for a real world situation. In addition they are learning skills that will aide them in the work place.

Our team did well this year. They won 1st in T-shirt design, 2nd in Marketing Booth and Interview, Honorable Mention in Spirit, Coach Essay, and Marketing Presentation.

We are ready to gear up for the next year but we need something from the community. We need Sponsors and Mentors. Robert Lee Robotics does both the Lego and B.E.S.T. competitions each year. We needed Sponsors to help the teams cover the cost of going to competition, materials, shirts, and other expenses. **GOSTEERS-STEERPRIDE  
Pasture, range and  
forage insurance  
deadline nears**

Coke County farmers and ranchers are reminded the deadline to sign up and report acreage for pasture, range and forage insurance for 2014 is Nov. 15.

"Insurance is a critical component of many operations because farming and ranching is a gamble," said John Ross Copeland, Coke County Farm Bureau president. "The policy can offer stability during these consecutive years of drought and other extreme adverse conditions."

Producers can determine any number of acres to insure, but must also select a minimum of two-month intervals or a maximum of six two-month intervals per year to insure. Payment is determined by area losses based on a grid system, not by individual damages.

Coverage levels between 70 and 90 percent are available.

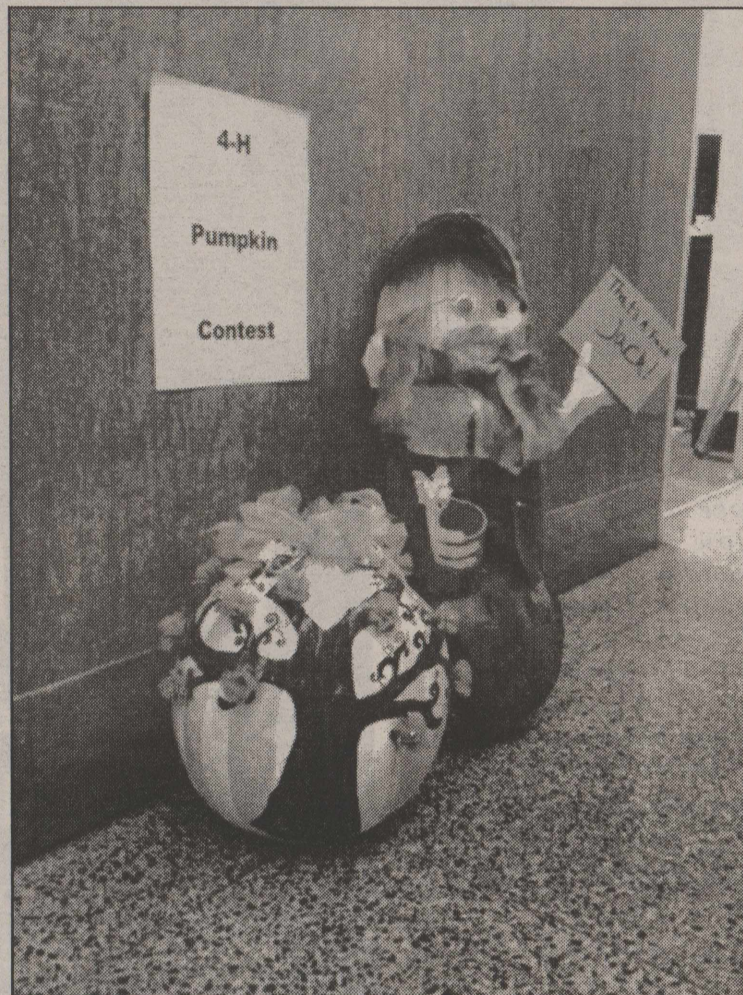
"After the producer selects a coverage level, then a productivity factor, which is a percentage of the established county base value for forage, is chosen," John Ross Copeland said.

Parents, grandparents, and caretakers did a super job of costuming and seeing that everyone said "Thank You" and making sure that all kids had a hand to help out.

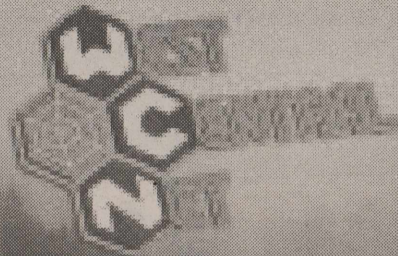
