The City has placed signs around Bronte to remind people that shopping locally benefits the community. Try to shop Bronte first before spending money in the bigger towns.



Filing ends Monday for 2014 Primary Election

The filing period for the March 2014 Primary Election will continue through Monday, December 9, 2013. All candidates must either file for a place on their party's ballot or declare their intention to run as an independent candidate. The Primary Election will be held Tuesday, March 4, 2014.

County offices included in the primary are the County Judge, County/District Clerk, County Treasurer, County Commissioner Precinct 2, County Commissioner Precinct 4, Justice of the Peace Precint 1, and Justice of the Peace Precint 2.

Grady Coulter, Justice of the Peace, Precinct 2, has filed for re-election in the Democratic Primary.

Incumbents who have already filed for re-election in the Republican Primary include Roy Blair, County Judge; Mary Grim, County/District Clerk; Hal Spain, County Treasurer; Wendell Lee, County Commissioner, Precinct 2; Bobby Blaylock, County Commissioner, Precinct 4; and Jackie Walker, Justice of the Peace, Precinct 1.


