The 75th edition of the Coke County Junior Livestock Show was held this past weekend at the Sterling Lindsey Memorial Exhibition Building in Robert Lee. This year's show featured animals in the Market Lamb, Market Goat, Market Swine and Market Steer shows, but more importantly, many young exhibitors from around the county.

The show began Friday with the Market Lamb Show. Rachel Everheart showed lambs to both Grand Champion Lamb and Reserve Grand Champion Lamb honors.

In Friday evening's Market Goat Show, Rachel Everheart also swept both titles taking Grand Champion Goat and Reserve Champion Goat.

On Saturday morning, Kaci Queen exhibited the Grand Champion Hog in this year's Market Swine Show. The Reserve Grand Champion Hog was shown by Moriah Royall.

In the final division of competition, the Market Steer Show, James Roberts exhibited the Grand Champion Steer. The Reserve Grand Champion Steer was exhibited by Carson Kelso.

A delicious barbecue lunch was held at 12 noon, followed by the awards presentation and the Premium Sale

Winning the Lamb Showmanship award was Carson Kelso. Katlyn Reeves took home the Goat Showmanship award, with Kassie O'Dell earning the Swine Showmanship award.

Rachel Everheart earned the Ralph Walker Memorial Top Hand Award and the Frank Percifull Overall Showmanship award.

James Roberts was honored with the Clay Antilley Memorial Steer Showmanship award. He also was named McCutchen Ranch Top Hand. This award (formerly the Alderman-Cave Top Hand) is presented to a Junior or Senior exhibitor, alternating between Bronte and Robert Lee students, who have assisted with the show and exhibited an exceptional work ethic. The winner is chosen this year by the two ag teachers.

Move to make liquor sales legal begins in Bronte

The process begins with delivering copies of the public notice posted on page 7 of last week's Observer/Enterprise to Bronte City Hall, along with a petition containing signatures in support by 10 registered voters who reside within the Bronte city limits. Addona completed this

week. According to Bronte's receives. City Secretary Pat Martindale, in favor of placing this initiative included her plans and on the May 10, 2014, local election ballot. 

He is survived by seven grandchildren, 1st Lt. Hunter Williams of Ft. Eddie is also survived by his brother ,Dennie Ray Braswell and wife Sharon of Bronte, Texas and a host of nieces and nephews who were very special to him throughout his life. He was preceded in death by his wife of 54 years, Carolyn Ruth Braswell, as well as a son, Sterling Braswell.

Eddie grew up and spent his youth in Bronte, Texas. He loved to explore the creeks and hills of this beloved area especially with his brother, Dennie. He attended Bronte

schools and graduated from Bronte High School in 1954. He attended San Angelo College and received an Associates Arts degree in 1956. He returned to Coke County and met Carolyn Childress at an American Legion dance. They would date and marry in June of 1957, adding a partner to his life's journey.

After working in Maryneal, a short time, he joined the USDA ASCS in 1957. This was the start of a 40-year career in service to American farmers and the source of many lifelong friendships. He trained in Robert Lee and Ballinger, and then spent 4 years in Sterling City. He transferred to Colorado City, Texas for seven years, and then two years in Alpine as District Director before moving to Sweetwater in 1972. Everywhere Eddie and his family went, they became a part of the community and their church. Making new friends and visiting old ones enriched their lives.

In 1978, Eddie and Carolyn moved to College Station and embraced their new area with the

usual vigor and energy. He became an avid fisherman on the lakes around College Station and continued to hunt in central and west Texas. He retired from the USDA after 40 years, in November 1996 as Chief of Price Support. In retirement he expanded his many interests and was as active as ever. He was an avid knife maker as well enjoying many activities including hunting, fishing, 42, and music.

He continued his involvement with the Boy Scouts, supporting the youth of Troop 802. Eddie and Carolyn became members of A&M United Methodist Church when they moved to College Station. In 1995, they were part of the mission team that started Christ United Methodist Church in College Station. Eddie has been an important part of the face and spirit of the church through his ministry as an usher and greeter, as well as long time support of youth ministries. Loved by children and adults, he brought many to the knowledge of Christ through his fellowship.



"I hope to open a liquor store in the city on Highway 277 within the next year or so. It will not be just your traditional liquor store; I would add my own personal touch! I plan on becoming a member of the Go Texan program and carry Texas made products such as boxed chocolates, specialty breads, gourmet foods like cheeses, nuts, salsa's, meats, sausage and jerky; the possibilities are endless and I really haven't quite made up my mind on the inventory yet. I know I would like to carry a line of Bronte sports and visitor shirts & caps, and have an area in the store for tables and chairs where shoppers can stop and relax for a bit.

I want to make this store an attraction not only for our residents, but for the residents from surrounding cities, the many travelers and tourists that drive through our welcoming city, and for the Hunters who faithfully visit our city; of whom I know many and can tell you from talking to them that they are in favor of seeing a liquor store in the city. Over the years, I've constantly heard them ask "where is the closest liquor store?", and "how much further do we have to drive?".

Presently those that want to purchase alcohol go out of town. Why not support this legalization and keep the money in the city? This would generate increased tax revenue for the city, and keep those from shopping the bigger towns for an item not supplied in town. I know there are those that are against this legalization, and that's alright. But by not selling liquor in town does not mean that no one will consume it or that it will stay out of the city. On the contrary, it will still be bought and the money will continue to be spent out of the city. I have the passion to try to obtain this approval; not only for myself, but for those that share my same view."


