#### Early Voting begins Tuesday in March 2014 **Primary Election**

Early voting began Tuesday, February 18, 2014, for the March 4th Primary Election and will continue through Friday, February 28, 2014.

Early voting is currently ongoing at the courthouse Monday-Thursday from 8 am to 5 pm and Friday from 8 am to 1

Branch polling will be held at First National Bank in Bronte on February 25 and 26 from 9 am to 1 pm.

On election day, Precincts 1 and 3 will be voting at the courthouse. Precincts 2 and 4 will vote at the Bronte Senior Citizens Building. Voting hours are from 7 am to 7 pm.

Only two local offices will have contested races. Coke County Commissioners in both Precincts 2 and 4 will face challengers. Currently, these offices are held by Wendell Lee in Precinct 2 and Bobby Blaylock in Precinct 4. Facing Lee for Commissioner Precinct 2 is Paul Williams. Blaylock is being challenged by Joe Sefcik for Commissioner Precinct 4.

Incumbents without opponents filing to retain their positions include: Roy Blair, County Judge; Mary Grim, County/ District Clerk; Hal Spain, County Treasurer; Jackie Walker, Justice of the Peace, Precinct 1; and Grady Coulter, Justice of the Peace, Precinct 2. All of the above offices except for Justice of the Peace, Precinct 2, are in the Republican Primary.

It has been mentioned to me that we may be spending too much time on private road work, rather than county roads. This is a mistake on somebody's part as we are very cautious about taking on private work. Any time that I am asked to do private work I encourage the customer to see if they can get a private contractor to do the job. While we have done a few private jobs we have a contract and customer has paid for the job.

Also, I know the roads get bad, but we can only blade the roads when we have rain and as you know we are in severe drought and without moisture we cannot blade the roads. We blade roads when we have a little moisture, and most of the time it dries out before we get all of them bladed. Another problem we have is our equipment. It is old and we are constantly working on them.

Also, I believe that our Sheriff Department needs and increase in salary and have mentioned this is the past Commissioner's Court. They spend lots of hours on the job and what would we do without them? The only time we can review and address these problems is during the time that we are setting the year's budget. I will continue to work on this, but also realize the financial limitations that Coke County works under.


