Farm bill passes, spells changes for Coke County farmers

The recently passed farm bill reforms food, agriculture and nutrition policy for the next five years, which will affect farmers and ranchers in Coke County.

"The 2014 Farm Bill supports farm families by providing a safety net for farmers, affordable food for consumers and jobs for Americans," said John Ross Copeland, Coke County Farm fixed, government-set target Bureau president. "But there are many changes- including






