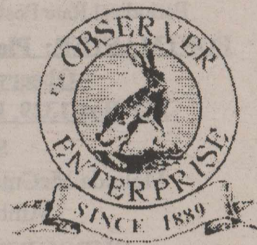

Commissioners vote to continue 911 negotiations

On Monday, March 24, 2014, the Coke County Commissioners voted to have Judge Blair continue negotiations with Tom Green County regarding the transfer of Coke County's 911 system.

The prison facility was also on the agenda at Monday's meeting. However, the attorney has still not completed the necessary documents.

In other news, Morgan Runyan was introduced and confirmed as the new Texas AgriLife Ag Agent for Coke County. She will begin her duties on May 1, 2014.

Lee Wommack, representing the Bronte Economic Development Board, addressed the Court with regard to construction of a new dock at Lake Knierim at the Coke County Park in Bronte. Total cost of the construction is \$17,460. Bronte Economic Development is contributing \$15,000 to the project and Wommack request Coke County to contribute the remaining \$2,460. The Commissioners approved this request.

No action was taken to lift the Burn Ban and this ban remains in effect for Coke County.

Obituaries



Jackson

Pastor Harry Jackson went home to his Heavenly Father Sunday afternoon, March 23, 2014, at Medical Center of McKinney in McKinney, Texas. His life and ministry were celebrated with a memorial service at 11 am Thursday, March 27, 2014, at the Chapel of Prestonwood Baptist Church in Plano, Texas. A graveside service will be held at 3:30 pm Friday, March 28, 2014, at Fairview Cemetery in Bronte, Texas.

Harry David Jackson was born June 26, 1940, to Roy and Mabel Jackson in Pueblo, Colorado, the youngest of nine children. A polio survivor, Harry discovered a love for music that was expressed through his talent with the trumpet. Following his graduation from Central High School in Pueblo and Pueblo Junior College, he received his Bachelor of Arts in Music Education from Adams State College in Alamosa, Colorado. While at ASC, Harry met Meredith Ann Barrett who would share his life and ministry for the next 50 plus years. The couple was married July 28, 1963, in Pueblo, Colorado.

Following their marriage, they settled in Fowler, Colorado, where Harry served as high school band director. Harry then served as band director at Skyler, Nebraska. It was there when God called him to the ministry. He and Meredith moved to Springfield, Missouri, where Harry attended and graduated from Baptist Bible College. He was ordained into the ministry on August 23, 1967. Pastor Jackson was also awarded two honorary doctorate degrees, including one from San Francisco Baptist Theological Seminary.

After graduating from BBC,

Harry served as a youth pastor and minister of music at churches in Kansas, Missouri, Ohio and New York. In 1974, the Lord led the family to the suburbs of Chicago, Illinois, to begin a new church which would grow to a congregation of over 1,500. Harry was next called to pastor Calvary Baptist Church in Fairfield, California. At Calvary Baptist, Harry also served as head of the church's Christian school where all three of their sons graduated high school.

During the family's time in northern California, Harry served as Chairman of the California Council for Religious Freedom. In this role, he assisted California state legislators in drafting three laws protecting religious freedom for California churches. This alliance of pastors was formed following onerous regulations in California being imposed upon churches requiring them to pay taxes as a business if they took a public stand on specific social issues. This group initiated and spearheaded the efforts to protect churches from this bureaucratic

persecution. Only one church of many in danger was sold before the legislation was passed and signed into law.

After many years in the pastorate, Harry and Meredith began Heritage of Faith Ministry. The ministry brought the early Americans who served on the foreign mission field to life for today's Baptist congregations. He went on to serve as Vice President of Western States Baptist Bible College in California and it was there he first became ill. He and Meredith moved to McKinney, Texas, in 2005. Although battling health issues, Harry continued to serve the Lord at Prestonwood Baptist Church where he taught an adult Bible class from 2006 to 2013.

Harry was preceded in death by his parents, Roy and Mabel Jackson brothers Carroll Jackson, Alvin Jackson, Hubert Jackson, and Kenneth Jackson sisters Lula Mae, Loretta Enderud; and father-in-law and mother-in-law, Cliff and Mary Barrett.

Pastor Jackson is survived by his wife, Meredith; sons and daughters-in-law, Dave and Tina Jackson of Sugarland, Texas, Jon and Meredith Jackson of Dallas, Texas, and Cliff and Cindy Jackson of Dallas, Texas; grandchildren, Charla Jackson, Barrett Jackson, K. C. Yost, Jon Michael Jackson, Braun Jackson, Cherish Jackson, Caleb Yost, Isabella Jackson, Ellie Gould, Julia Jackson, Olivia Jackson, Harry Jackson, and Charles Jackson; sister, Loraine Hoagland of Hemet, California; sister-in-law Beryl Jackson of Broken Arrow, Oklahoma; sister-in-law and

brother-in-law, Melinda and Wayne McCutchen of Bronte; niece and fiancé, Morgan McCutchen and Will Brigham of Stamford; niece Ashley Braswell and husband, Reese, of Bronte; and numerous Jackson family nieces and nephews.

Pallbearers included Barrett Jackson, K. C. Yost, Jon Michael Jackson, Braun Jackson, Caleb Yost, Reese Braswell and Will Brigham.

Judge Blair adjourned the meeting at 9:30 am.

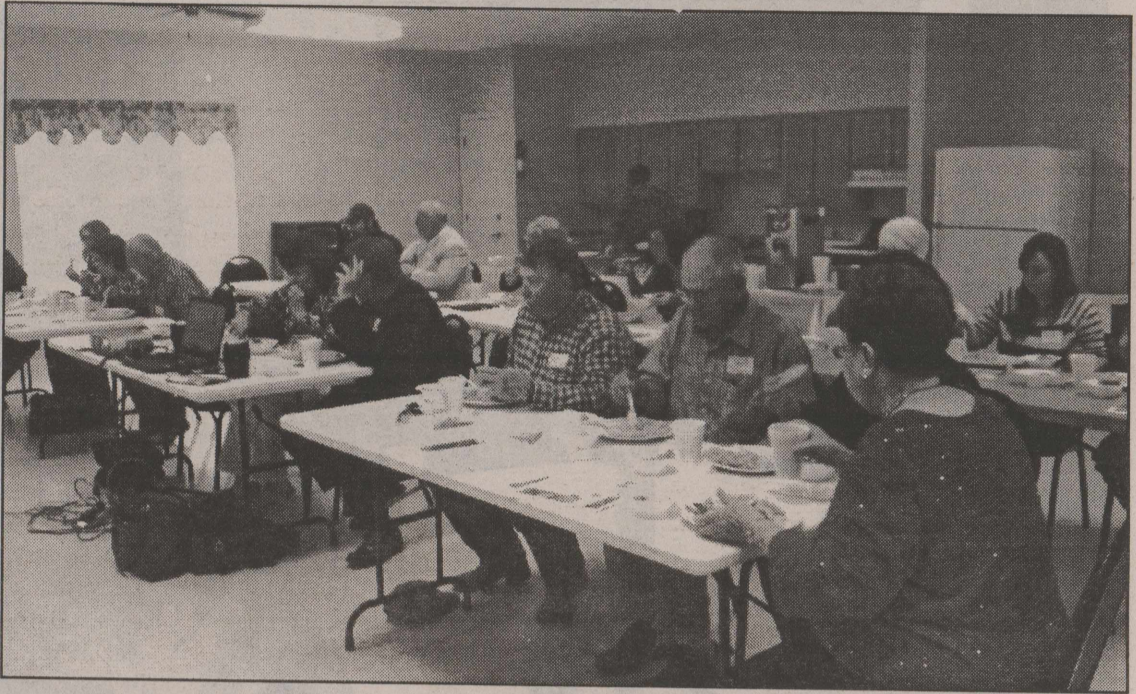
CCRTA meeting held

TDLR Helping Military Service Members, Veterans, and Spouses Get Licensed to Work in Texas

The Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (TDLR) recently updated its licensing procedures to help military service members and veterans become licensed to work in Texas using their military service, training, and education. The procedure also helps military spouses become licensed to work in Texas if they hold an equivalent license issued in or by another state. These changes were authorized by bills enacted in 2013 by the 83rd Texas Legislature.

"TDLR values the contributions of all who serve or have served in our nation's armed forces and of the spouses

of military service members," said Bill Kuntz, TDLR Executive Director. "These new licensing changes allow us to help service members, veterans, and spouses get licensed and get to work in Texas."

TDLR currently accepts verified military experience for licenses in these programs:

- Air Conditioning and Refrigeration
- Architectural Barriers
- Barbering
- Electricians
- Polygraph Examiners; and
- Water Well Drillers and Pump Installers.

Beginning May 1, 2014, TDLR will issue any master electrician and journeyman electrician applicant a temporary license, license by endorsement, or license by reciprocity if the applicant holds a substantially equivalent similar license issued in or by

another state. Applicants will become fully licensed in Texas once they meet all state experience and examination requirements.

A military spouse is eligible to obtain a TDLR program occupational license if they hold a substantially equivalent license issued in or by another state and their application is given priority for expedited processing. This applies to the spouse of a person who currently serves in an active or reserve component of the United States armed forces, in the National Guard, or in a state military force.

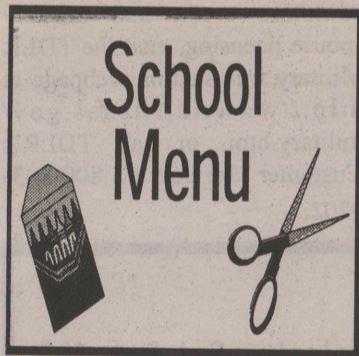

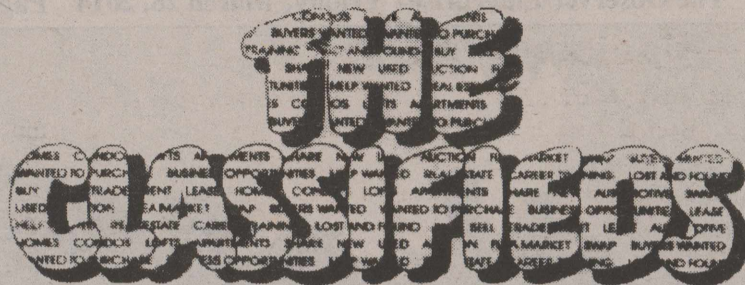
