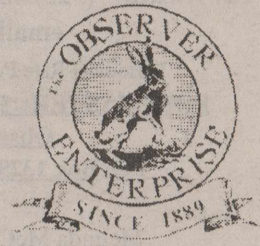

Fort Chadbourne receives award

Lana and Garland Richards and the Fort Chadbourne Foundation in Coke County, and The Runnels County Historical Commission were recently honored with the R. C. Crane Heritage Service Award by the Texas Historical Association in Odessa, Texas. The award recognizes non-profit organizations for their preservation efforts to West Texas History.

Nominees must show a contribution to our Texas heritage through projects of restoration, community partnerships, and most importantly work with local and area schools, teachers and students, through educational events and activities.

The Fort Chadbourne Foundation organized in 1999 as a non-profit charitable organization, to preserve and present the historic 1852 fort site, was chosen for its preservation work, and meeting all the requirements of their original mission statement. In all six buildings have been restored and all ruins stabilized. The Foundation has educated and entertained well over 25,000 students and teachers at their annual Fort Chadbourne Days

Living History Event held the first weekend each May. And, they opened a new 12,500 square foot Visitor Center/Museum in April 2012. Much work at Fort Chadbourne, such as archeological excavations, has been completed by volunteerism with groups such as the Concho Valley Archeological Society and the SMARTS.

The Runnels County Historical Commission was also honored at the April 5, 2014 meeting. They were selected for their cooperation with other organizations and extreme volunteerism, as well as the preservation projects throughout Runnels County. Janie Ruth Cooper, of Winters, was at the presentation to accept the award. Cooper also gave a presentation at the 91st annual meeting "The Chick Inn and the Diners of Winters, Texas". She also serves as the President of the Edwards Plateau Historical Association.

The prestigious R. C. Crane award comes with a \$500.00 monetary award, which was awarded to both recipients.

Both organizations have contributed heavily to the historic preservations in Runnels and Coke Counties, along with

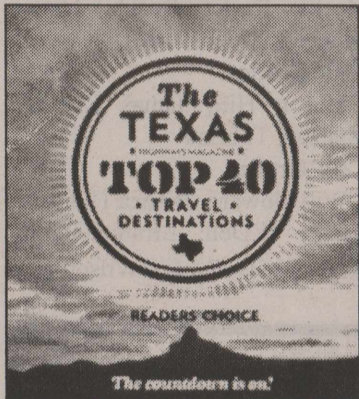
Picnic in the Park set for May 17 in Bronte

Early Voting begins in Bronte ISD and City of Robert Lee Elections

Early voting in the Bronte ISD Trustee election and the City of Robert Lee Council election will begin Monday, April 28, 2014, and continue through Monday, May 5, 2014. The election is scheduled for Saturday, May 10, 2014.

In the Bronte ISD election, two three year terms will be decided. There are no incumbents on the ballot. Vying for the two seats are Nicholas Arrott, John Seales, Riley Coalson and Josh Schoenfield. Early voting will be held between 8 am and 4 pm in the Superintendent's Office.

The City of Robert Lee will decide on a mayor and two members of the city council. John Jacobs, incumbent, is running unopposed for the mayoral office. Incumbents Richard Johnson and Sid Burns will face Manuel Abalos for the two council seats.

Early voting for this election is being held in the County Clerk's

office at the Coke County Courthouse between the hours of 8 am and 5 pm Monday through Thursday and 8 am to 1 pm on Fridays.

Comptroller distributes over \$555 million in sales tax revenue

Texas Comptroller Susan Combs said today that state sales tax revenue in March was \$2.09 billion, up 5.6 percent compared to March 2013.

"The growth in sales tax

revenues was led by business spending in the oil and natural gas mining, wholesale trade and construction sectors," Combs said. "Collections from restaurants were also strong. This marks 48 consecutive months of growth in state sales tax collections."

Combs will send cities, counties, transit systems and special purpose taxing districts their April local sales tax allocations totaling \$554.5 million, up 6.2 percent compared to April 2013.
