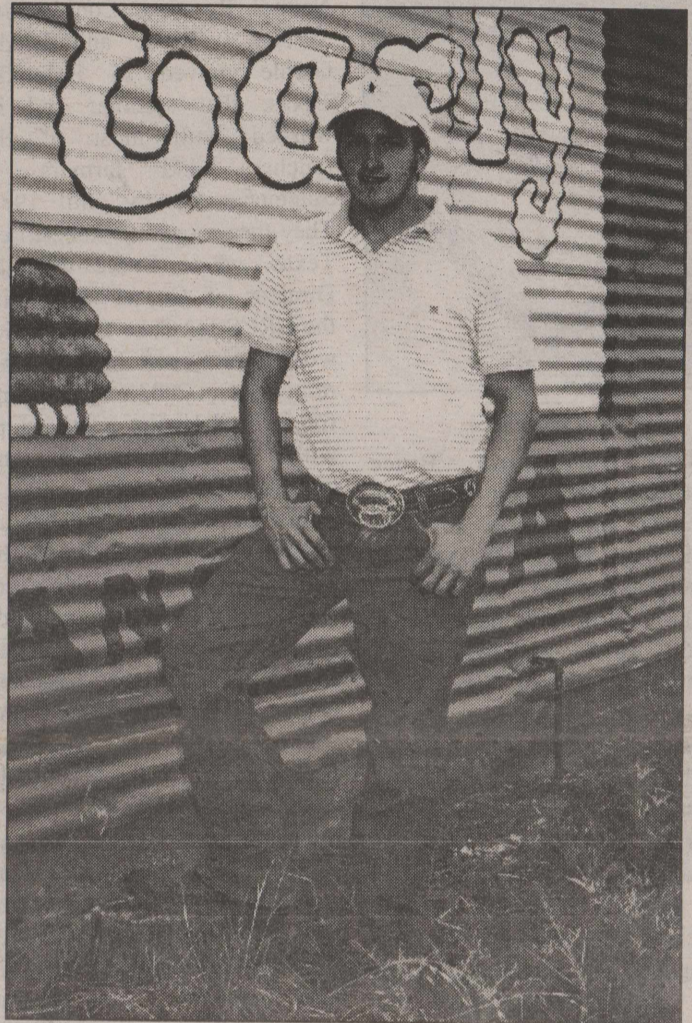

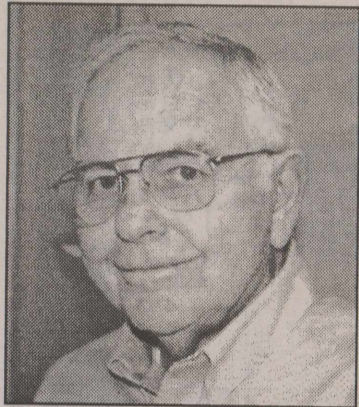

Obituaries



Deere

Dad was born Bruce Frederick Deere on March 9, 1939, in Brownwood, Texas, to B.F. and Mary Deere. He graduated from Brownwood High School with the class of 1957. Bruce enlisted in the United States Air Force after graduating to fly fighter jets. Because of a burn spot in his right eye due to looking through a hole in a cup at a sun eclipse during his earlier years at school, the Air Force would not let him fly their jets. Bruce became an expert in the Russian language and traveled all over the world with the Air Force listening to the Russians over radio waves and interpreting their actions to the U.S. Air Force. Bruce taught the Russian language at Goodfellow AFB in San Angelo to new recruits until his retirement after 20 years of service as Master Sergeant in 1978.

Bruce married Linda-Carole Clark on February 6, 1960. They were married for 54 years before his wife's death on March 24, 2014. They lived in San Antonio, Texas, where their first two kids were born, Biloxi, Mississippi, Hoff Germany, where their last son was born, San Angelo, Texas, Misawa Japan and finally back to San Angelo. Bruce served in several places overseas where his family was not allowed to travel with him.

After his retirement from the U.S. Air Force, Bruce went back to school at Angelo State University and graduated Summa Cum Laude with his master's degree in Agriculture and Range Management in 1982. Bruce researched the bitter weed problem for west Texas and wrote a book on his research for his thesis. This book is in the libraries of all the major universities in Texas for

future students to reference it for their studies. Bruce hired on with the Soil Conservation Service in 1982 which later changed their name to the Natural Resource Conservation Service. Bruce and Linda-Carole moved to Eldorado, Texas, that summer and he worked with most of the ranchers and farmers in Schleicher County until 1987. They then moved to Robert Lee, Texas, where Bruce was the Director of Conservation with the NRCS for Coke County. He worked in Robert Lee until his retirement in 2002 making many friends and lasting relationships with co-workers and land owners.

Dad loved to hunt and fish all over the United States and the world when he was deployed. He taught us kids and grandkids how to hunt and fish at a young age and also the state laws and ethical laws of the land and waters. He was truly an outdoorsman. We will certainly miss that part of you, dad.

Dad was a member of the Church of Christ and served as an Elder at one time. His love for God, Christ and his family were the backbones that kept his family together. He became known as Papa Deere to all his grandkids and family members. He showed his love and concern for his family when life for them was not going as planned. He will be missed greatly by everyone.

Bruce is preceded in death by his parents, B.F. and Mary Deere and his loving wife of 54 years, Linda-Carole Deere.

Bruce is survived by his son Ben Deere, wife Kenda and their five kids: Hunter Deere, Forest Deere and Chase Harris of Kuna Idaho, Jaime Weisweaver and husband Chuck and Leslie Harris of Seattle, Washington; daughter Dana Cauley and husband Lynn of Bronte, Texas, and their kids Amy Holifield and husband Cameron of San Angelo, Luke Cauley of San Antonio and Cadye McKinnon and husband Quaid of San Angelo; son Todd Deere of San Angelo and his kids, Nicole Deere of Tucson Arizona, Brooke Deere of San Angelo and Trevor Deere of San Diego California. Also sharing our grief is his sister Becky Hayes and husband Mike of Lake Brownwood, brother Doug Deere and wife Ora Mae of Bedford along with all of their sweet daughters that knew dad as Uncle Bruce and numerous great-grandkids, nephews and

nieces.

Our family would like to express our eternal gratitude to Dr. Stanley and the staff of Odyssey Hospice for caring for dad for the last year of his life. hours and the temperature was 93 degrees. The next reunion will be held sometime in June, 2015.

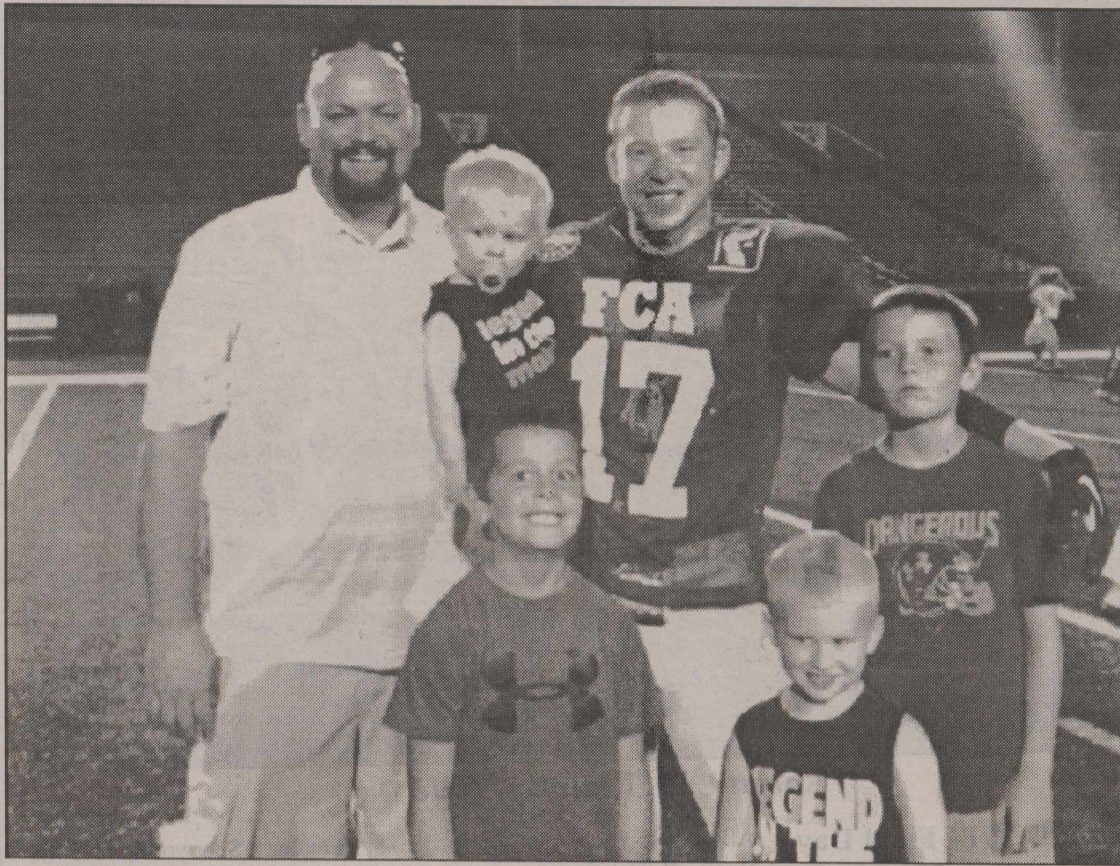

ligaments are still developing, and they are more vulnerable to crash forces than a full-grown adult. Studies have shown that restrained children in rear seats have the lowest risk of dying in fatal crashes. Even in side-impact crashes, properly restrained children in the back seat do better than children sitting in the front. Frontal air bags can also pose a danger to children, just as they can to small adults.

So what is the minimum age when a child can ride in the front seat? The American Academy of Pediatrics continues to recommend that children under 13 years of age sit in the back seat for the best protection. Children under 13 are always safer buckled up in the back seat in the appropriate car seat for their age or a seat belt if they are big enough to fit correctly.

Unfortunately, the law in Texas does not address seating positions. The law simply states that children under age 8, unless taller than 4'9", must be in a child safety seat according to manufacturers' instructions. The law is always the minimum. Parents and caregivers want the

maximum safety for their children.

Parents and Caregivers should be reminded to keep children rear-facing until age two or until the limit of their rear-facing convertible seat is reached, which is usually 35-40 pounds. Also, children should stay in a 5-point harness system until they are mature enough to ride in a booster seat. Booster seats are for children who are at least age four and 40 pounds or more. Finally, keep children in a booster seat until the seat belt fits correctly. This is usually sometime between ages 8 and 12 years old when the child reaches 4'9" tall and the lap and shoulder belt fit correctly. The average child reaches 4'9" at age 11!

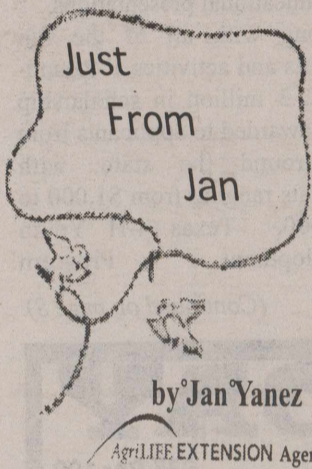
Next time you are thinking about rewarding your child, think about treating them like a VIP and keeping them in the back seat! Explain how the back seat is more protective, buckle them up correctly, and take them out for a healthy fruit smoothie!! Remember, children under age

13 are safest in the back seat buckled up on every trip!

When Can My Child Ride in the Front?

We are all guilty of occasionally rewarding our children's good behavior with special indulgences. Think about the extra candy bar or the special trip to the fast food restaurant to be entertained with not so healthy treats. But perhaps the most dangerous reward parents give their children is letting the child ride in the front seat!

The truth is that the back seat is always a safer choice –not just for children but for everyone! Most crashes are frontal crashes, so just by virtue of being in the back seat you are further away from the point of impact. Children are not just small adults. Their bones and
