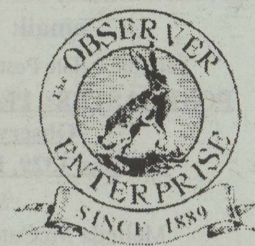

Texas Prepaid Tuition Program enrollment deadline approaches

The deadline is July 31 for Texas families to enroll their newborns in the Texas Tuition Promise Fund® and avoid future increases in tuition and required fees at Texas public colleges and universities. Newborns are children younger than 1 at the time of enrollment. The Texas Tuition Promise Fund — the state's prepaid college tuition program — allows participants to lock in the cost of undergraduate tuition and required fees at Texas public colleges and universities based on current prices.

Under the plan, families can prepay tuition and required fees for a four-year degree, two years of community college or

just a few semesters at Texas public colleges and universities by purchasing tuition units.

Enrollment in the program at 2013-14 prices closed Feb. 28 for children older than 1. The next annual enrollment period begins Sept. 1, with new contract prices based on Texas public college costs for the 2014-15 academic year.

Time is ripe to repeal estate tax

It looks like the time is ripe to begin repeal of the estate tax, said Coke County Farm Bureau President John Ross Copeland.

"More than half of the House of Representatives are cosponsoring Rep. Kevin Brady's (R-Texas) Death Tax Repeal Act, HR 2429, which would repeal estate taxes and maintain stepped-up basis," John Ross Copeland said.

He said the estate tax burden falls heavily on local farmers because it takes more capital assets, such as land and equipment, to generate the same level of income as other types of businesses.

Although permanent law was enacted in 2012 that provided significant estate tax relief, John Ross Copeland said repeal is the best solution to protect all farms and ranches from the estate taxes.

If Congress fails to permanently repeal the estate tax, surviving family members could be forced to sell off parts of the farms and ranches, jeopardizing their livelihoods.

"Local land values are skyrocketing," John Ross Copeland said. "As its value increases, the chances of surviving family members having to sell substantial acreage to pay estate taxes increase with it. This devastates not only families, but also rural communities and businesses that agriculture supports.

Absentee Landowner Initiative

Morgan Runyan Texas AgriLife Agent Ownership of agricultural lands and land use is rapidly changing in West Texas and throughout the state. The number of new and absentee landowners continues to grow and many have different goals than the previous landowners, which were primarily in production agriculture.

Many of the new and absentee landowners have limited experience or knowledge in

managing natural resources or agricultural lands. Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service can provide the science based information and resources needed to help absentee landowners reach their goals and also improve the management of agricultural lands.

We are currently challenged with the fact that this targeted audience is not familiar with AgriLife Extension programs and resources. The recently approved Absentee Landowner Initiative is designed to address this challenge and will begin this fall. The goals for the initiative were presented during the West Region ANR Program Update on June 4.

1. Absentee landowners increase their awareness of AgriLife Extension programs and resources, including the name and contact information for AgriLife Extension agent(s).
2. Provide absentee landowners the opportunity to give input on how they wish to receive information, including preferences on educational methods.
3. Develop new resources that meet the needs of absentee landowners.
4. Conduct programs that target specific areas and ecosystems across West Texas.

Agents will secure absentee landowner contact information prior to September 1, 2014. Additional information on this initiative will be available soon

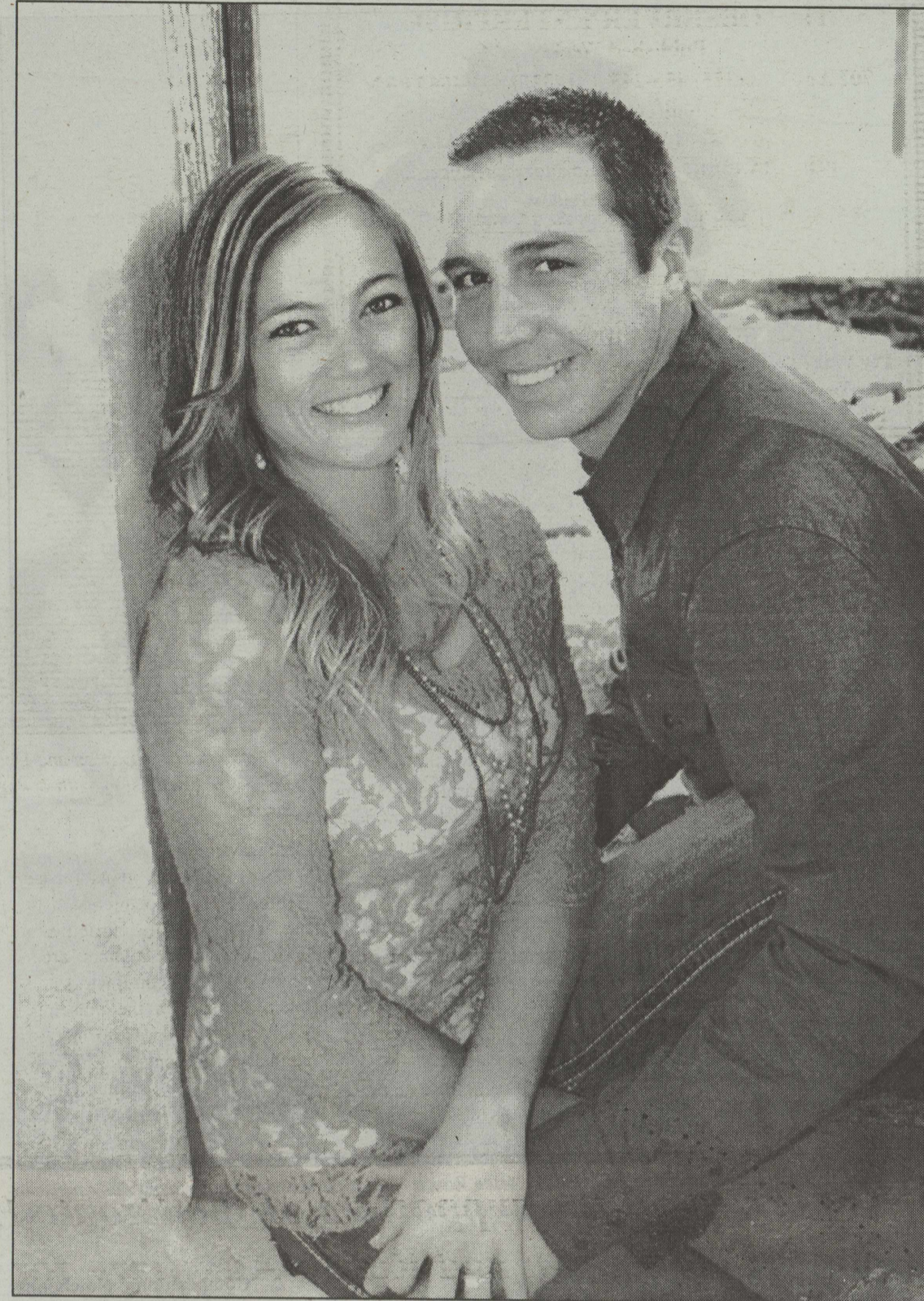
EPA extends comment period on Clean Water Rule

Coke County farmers and ranchers should make their voices heard on new and highly burdensome clean water rules, according to Coke County Farm Bureau President John Ross Copeland. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has extended the time available to comment on their "Waters of the U.S." proposal until Oct. 20, and until July 7 to comment on the accompanying interpretive rule.

"The regulated community has been misled by EPA about the rule's impact on land use," John Ross Copeland said. "Local farmers and ranchers will be outraged when they find out regulators want to require permits for everyday activities on dry land, or penalize farming families for not getting them."

John Ross Copeland said the latest rule broadly expands federal jurisdiction and threatens local land-use and zoning.

"It's time to ditch this rule," John Ross Copeland said. "Farm Bureau, together with dozens of

Laundry and Mildew

Laundry is nobody's favorite task. However, it's even more difficult when stains won't come out in the wash. What should you do? Jan Yanez, Family and Consumer Sciences Extension Agent recommends that you start by making sure damp or wet clothes are not placed in the laundry basket and left for several days.

Warm summer temperatures, high humidity, and any remaining food on clothing—especially kids' clothes creates the perfect conditions for the growth of mildew. Mildew is a fungus and appears as dark colored spots and splotches on textile items. When the textile is left in a warm, humid location

with little or no light or air circulation, you have created the perfect condition for mildew to grow and it is very difficult to remove.

Prevention is the key. Experts at the International Fabricare Institute suggest drying any wet textiles before placing them in the laundry and certainly not storing them dirty. Some typical items might include infants' and children's clothing, sportswear, jackets, t-shirts, kitchen textiles, towels, and other common items. Avoid tossing damp clothing in a dark laundry hamper or closet. If you can't get to the laundry immediately, hang the item in an area with good air circulation until the item is dry. Or wash the item as soon as possible, treating the soiled area with a pre-wash enzyme product. What removes mildew? Actually, only chlorine bleach removes and kills mildew growth and stains. Since not all fabrics can be safely treated with bleach, preventing the growth of mildew may be a better solution than trying to remove it later and possibly ruining the item.


