RLHS Spirit Quilt donated for raffle

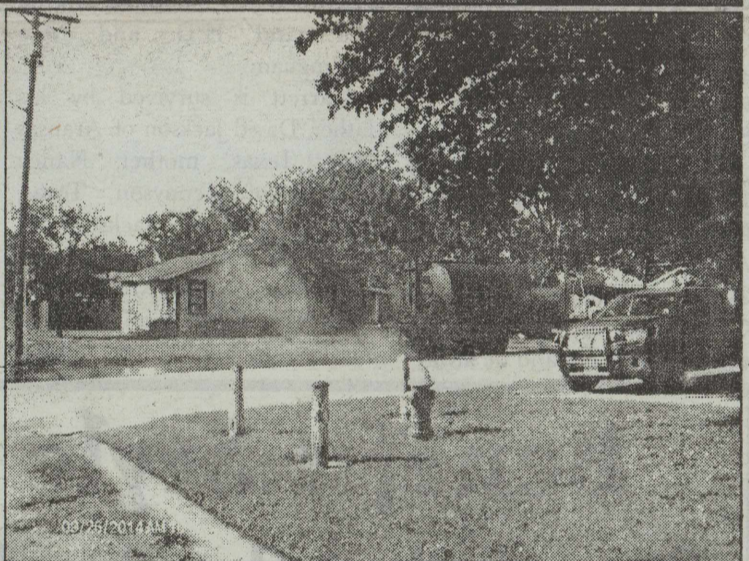

Members present included Wes Washam, Jeffie Roberts, Beverly Sinclair, George Grim, Erin Oleksiuk, and Irma Torres. Tom Sawyer was absent.

The Invocation and pledge were led by Beverly Sinclair.

Tina Prentice addressed the Board for public comment regarding the purchase of land owned by the school district.

Jeffie Roberts made a motion to approve the minutes of the August 27, 2014, meeting. The motion was seconded by Erin Oleksiuk. All voted for.

George Grim made a motion to approve the financial reports given by Robin Allen and to approve the bills, seconded by Irma Torres. All voted for.

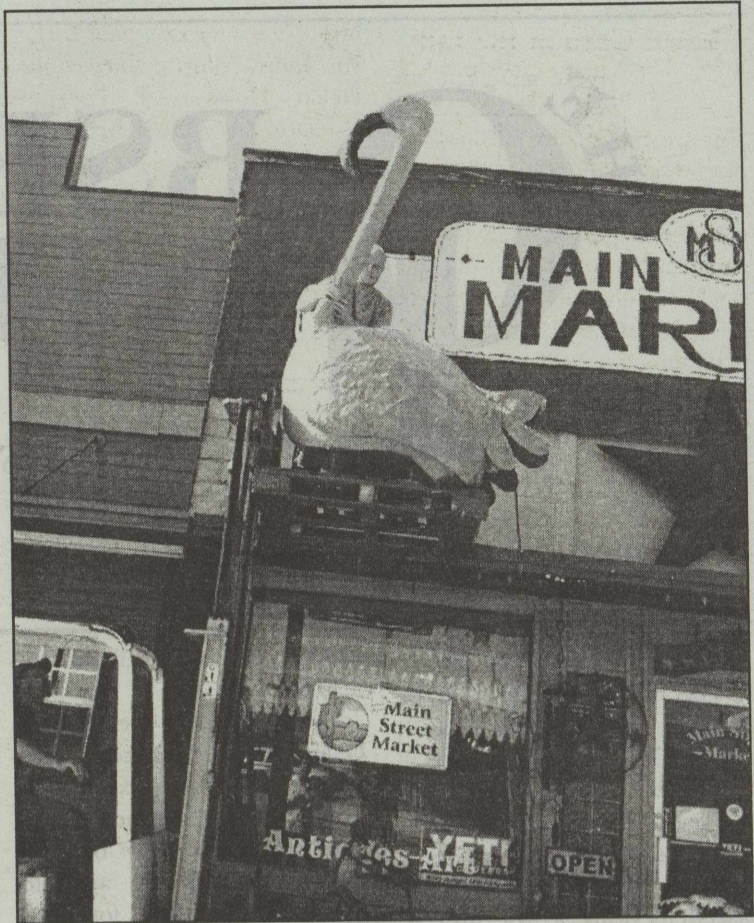

Lawn Care in the fall

As we move into fall and we have had some rain this year that has allowed us to have somewhat of a lawn this summer. I would like to use this week's column to discuss some points that are beneficial in maintaining your lawn through the fall and will help in preparation for the coming spring.

To begin with for those who have a St. Augustine lawn and have a means of watering it should continue to water their lawn at least once a month. Lawns that consist of Bermuda grass and buffalo grass have the ability to go dormant through the fall and winter, however; St. Augustine does not have the ability to go dormant, which requires it to need moisture throughout the year.

If you have a lawn that is thin with lots of bare ground in between grass plants you are opening yourself up for an invasion of weeds in the event of a fall or a spring rain. This can be prevented by applying a pre-emergent herbicide that will prevent the infestation of annual weeds. The best time to apply a pre-emergent is around September 1, prior to the weeds taking over the lawn.

As we continue into the fall around the beginning of October it is recommended that you fertilize the lawn. Fertilizer at this time of year does little to help the top grow, but instead aides the roots and the crown of the plant and will be beneficial in the green up for the coming spring. The recommended fertilizers for this time of year are 15-5-10 and 18-6-12 are two of common fertilizers that are beneficial in the fall.

The Steers will be traveling to Garden City to take on the Bearkats so please load up your Steer fans and have a safe trip to cheer on your home team.

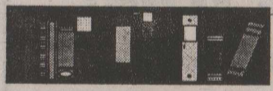

We do two contests each year- B.E.S.T. and TCEA Lego's. To do this we need both mentors and sponsors to help the kids go to contests.

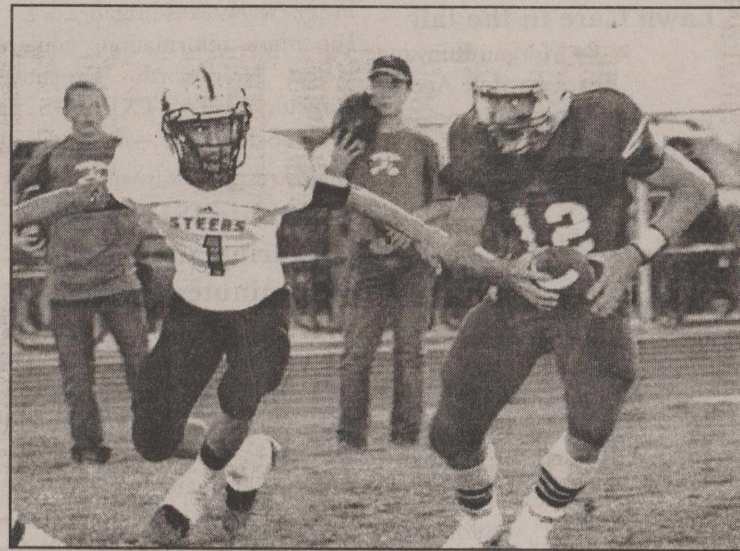

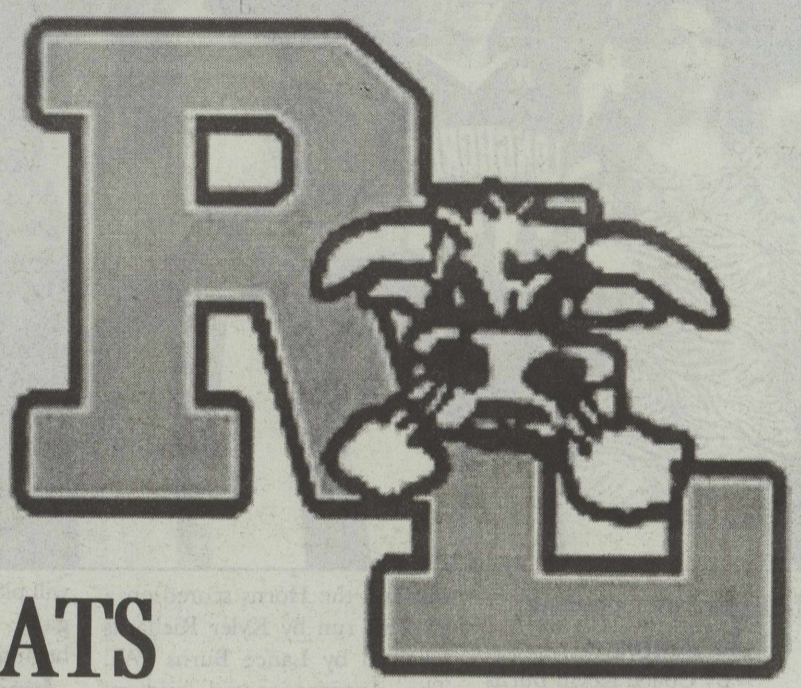
