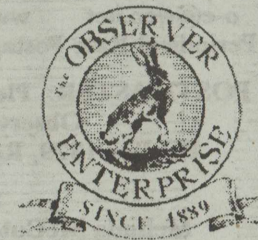

Early voting for general election begins Monday

Early Voting begins Monday, October 20, 2014, for the November 4th General Election. Early voting will run through Friday, October 31, 2014.

There will be no branch polling locations set up in Bronte for this election. The only place to vote early will be the County Clerk's office at the Coke County Courthouse. Their hours are 8 am to 5 pm Monday through Thursday and 8 am to 1 pm on Fridays.

On Tuesday, November 4, polling locations will be open from 7 am to 7 pm at the following locations:

- Precinct 1 - Robert Lee Rec Hall
- Precinct 2 - Bronte Senior Citizens Building
- Precinct 3 - Coke County Courthouse in Robert Lee
- Precinct 4 - Bronte City Hall

There are no opposed races at the local county government level. Local incumbents on the ballot are County Judge Roy Blair, District/County Clerk Mary Grim, Treasurer Hal Spain, and Precinct 1 Justice of the Peace Jackie Walker. Paul Williams is on the ballot for Precinct 2 Commissioner. He is joined by Joe Sefcik for Precinct 4 Commissioner.

State and national offices to be decided include races for US Senator, currently held by John Cornyn; US Representative District 11, currently held by Mike Conaway; Governor; Lt. Governor; Attorney General; Comptroller; Land Commissioner; Ag Commissioner; Railroad Commissioner; State Representative District 72,

currently held by Drew Darby; and several judge's races.

Commissioners vote to list prison

The Coke County Commissioners Court voted Tuesday, October 14, 2014, to list the Coke County Detention Facility with Pitcock Properties. According to Judge Blair, the Court has not yet voted on the price to be set.

This was on the agenda several months ago, but put on hold when Texas Rangers stepped in to investigate the Court's actions with this facility. The final report has finally come back and show that no laws were broken by the Coke County Commissioners Court.

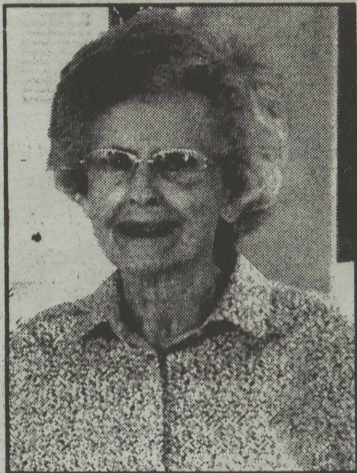

Mrs. Marie Jameson long-time resident of Silver, Texas, passed away October 8, 2014, in a Southlake skilled rehab center.

Mrs. Jameson actively supported school and scouting activities in the Silver community during the days of the Sun Oil Company residential camps in the 1950's and 1960's. 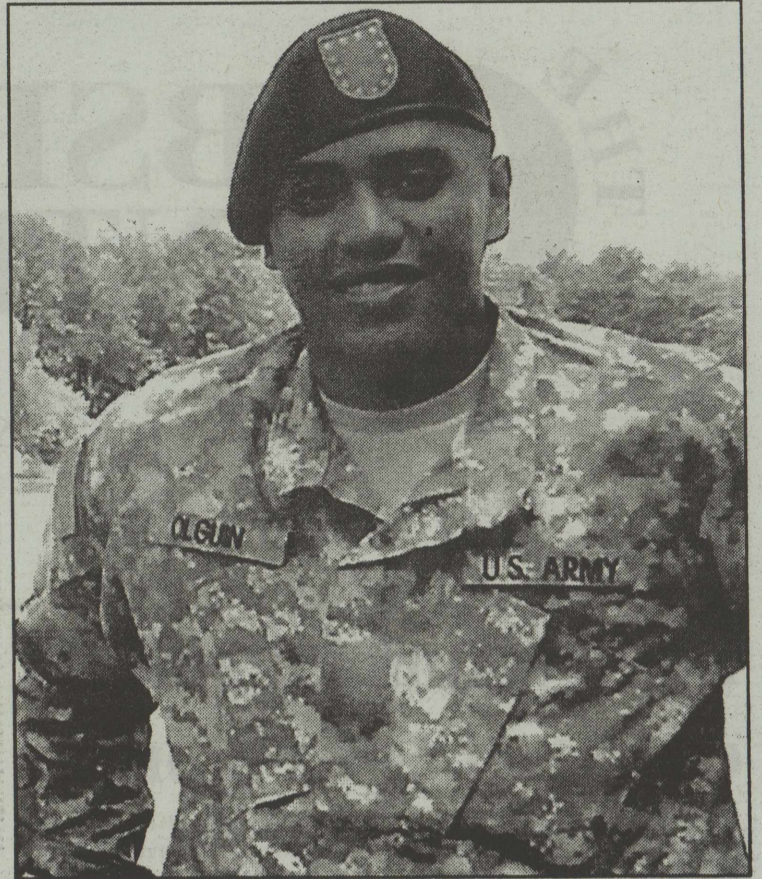
New location announced for annual Potato Bake Luncheon

Bronte City Council minutes posted

The Bronte City Council met on September 11, 2014, in the Council room of the City Hall. Present were Mayor Gerald Sandusky, Council Members Paul Gohman, Jimmie Guthrie, Paula McWright, Misti Bedford, and Wade Stautzenberger. City Secretary Tammy Thorn, Deputy City Secretary Leah Akins, and Public Works Director Ricky Royall were also present. Visitors included Lee Womack and Janet Womack.

The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance and a prayer by Mr. Gohman.

The Consent Agenda was considered. Mr. Gohman moved the Consent Agenda be approved. Mrs. Bedford seconded the motion. The motion carried. The Consent Agenda is as follows:

- A. Approve August 14, August 18 Council Minutes
- B. Approve List of Bills
- C. Review Monthly Report
- D. Review Budget Comparison
- E. Remove Delinquent Water Bills and Declare Them Bad Debts

Mrs. McWright moved to approve the 2015 tax rate ordinance with the new tax rate of \$0.385729 on each \$100.00. Mr. Gohman seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The 2014-2015 budget was discussed and will be amended if changes need to be made. Mr. Guthrie made a motion to amend the budget if needed. Mr. Stautzenberger seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Mr. Stautzenberger moved to approve the 2014-2015 Fiscal Year Budget. Mr. Gohman seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Mr. Stautzenberger made a motion to approve Republic Services rate adjustment. Mrs.

Bedford seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Mr. Gohman made a motion to approve the Coke County Appraisal District Budget. Mrs. McWright seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The Council discussed water meters at residence city ordinance along with T.C.E.Q. Mrs. Thorn will rewrite section 3 of city ordinance to include wording from T.C.E.Q.

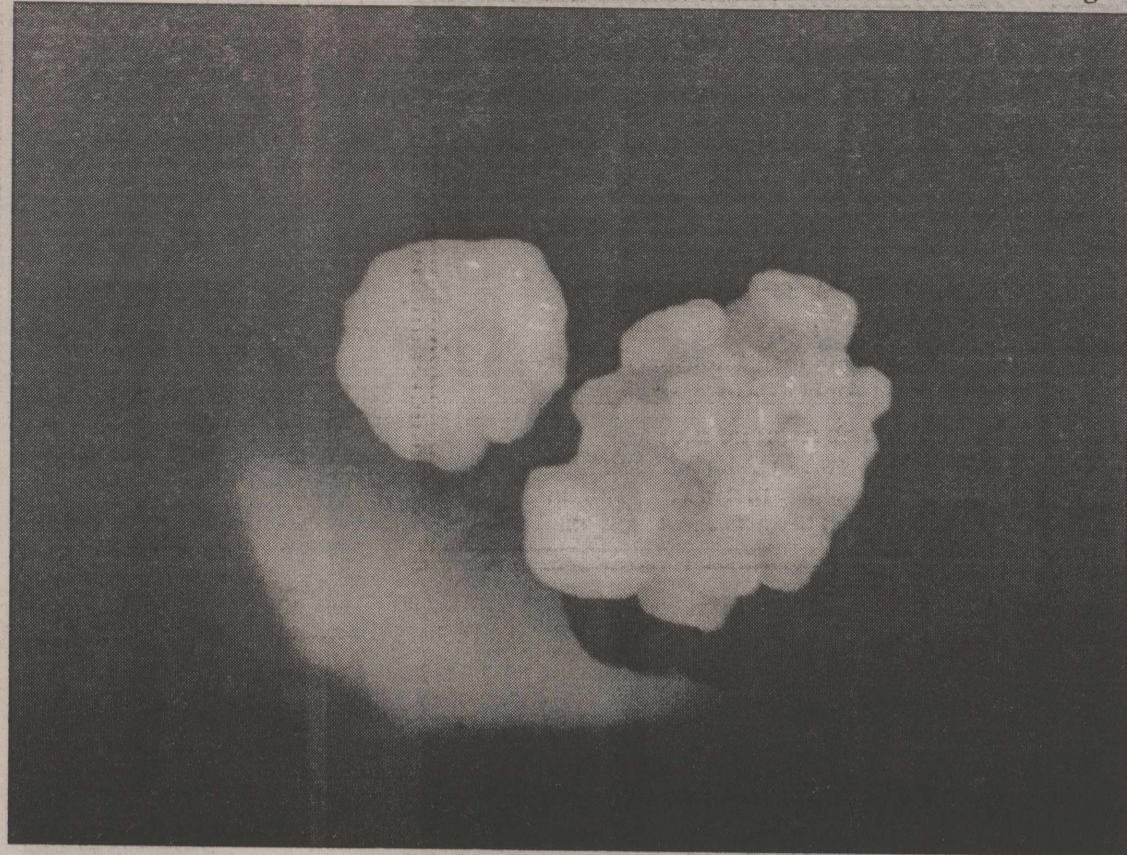
The Council discussed depot use and liability. Mrs. Thorn will look into event insurance and cost of the event insurance.

Mrs. Bedford made a motion to approve increasing the per diem to \$46 a day. Mr. Stautzenberger seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The Council discussed the Baker water wells. There is nothing to report at this time.

The Council discussed water well information from Gid Ware. The well tested is the deepest well and the other wells are not as deep. The City may need to drill a test well.

No grant reports. Mr. Royall informed the council of the need to purchase 2 loads of coal mix at approximately \$3,300 per load. The City has to replace 1.5 loads to Coke County and .5 a load belongs to the city. Mr. Royall

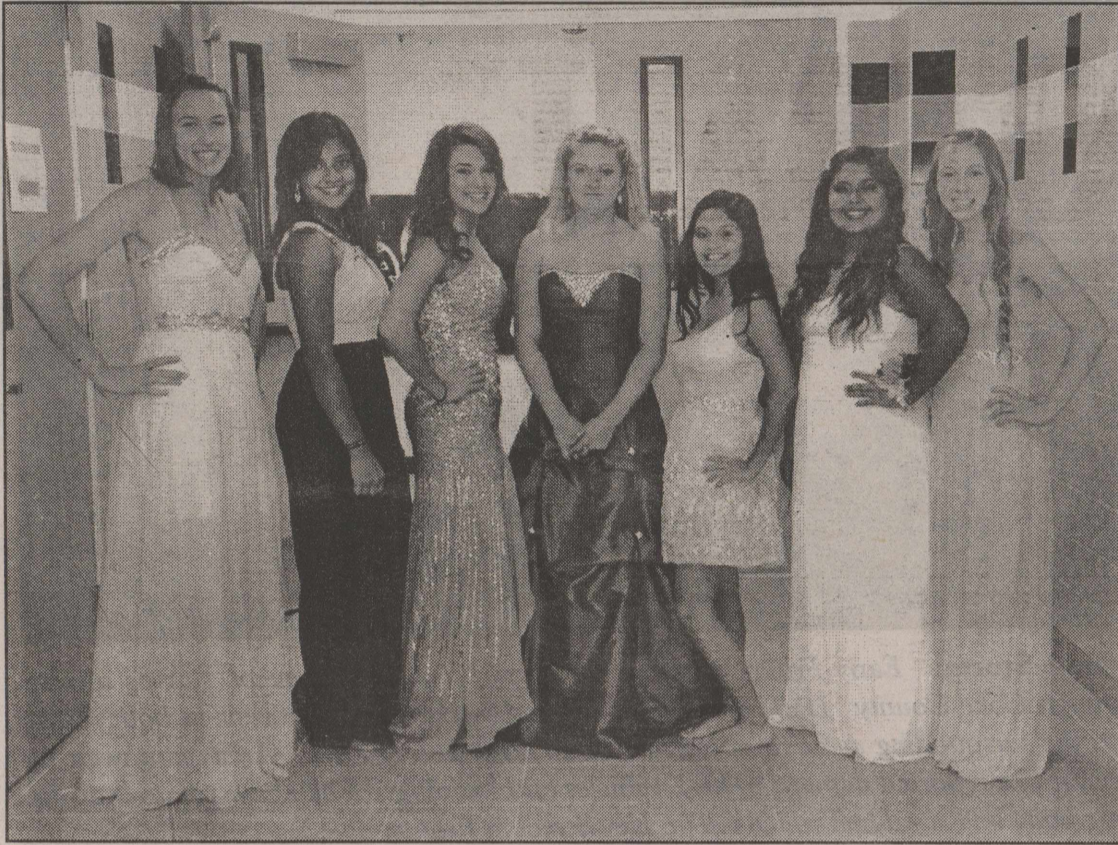

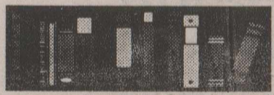

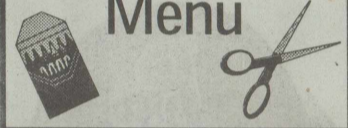
Evans Scholarship Application Available

Texas Beef Checkoff begins

Beef has a strong history in the Lone Star State and Texas cattle producers recently voted to further invest in their business.

That investment—the Texas Beef Checkoff - began October 1.

"Amid the consecutive years of severe drought, the U.S. cow herd dropped to the lowest it's been since the 1950s," said Coke County Farm Bureau President John Ross Copeland. "As cow numbers fell, so did the annual funds collected to support the beef industry."

That triggered cattle industry organizations to ask the Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA) for a referendum, creating a state beef checkoff administered by the Beef Promotion and Research Council of Texas.

The dollar-per-head ranchers will pay into the state checkoff program will allow Texas producers to conduct beef promotion, marketing, research and education programs for consumers in Texas and around the globe.

"Lack of rainfall, extreme

temperatures and the need for ample forages are risks Texas cattle producers face every day," said. "But the state checkoff will help alleviate those risks by driving the demand for beef and bringing profitability back to the cattlemen."

The state-level checkoff program is financed through a refundable assessment at each point cattle are sold in Texas. The state dollar will supplement the national checkoff program, which producers approved in 1988.

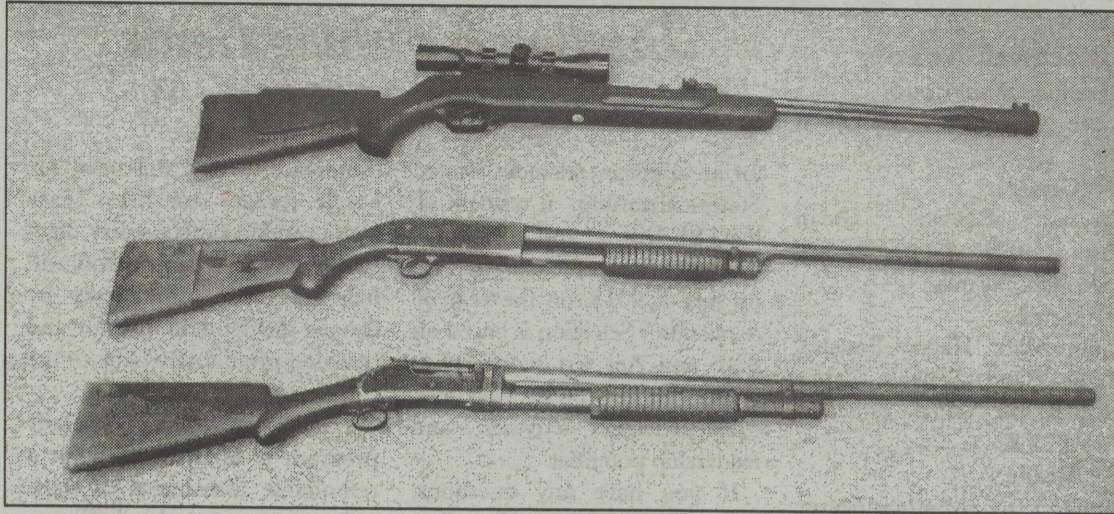
