Accident takes life of local woman

Julia Kennedy, 60, lost her life in yet another fatality accident north of Bronte on US Highway 277. This horrible tragedy occurred Saturday evening, December 27, 2014, and is the fourth fatality on this 3 mile stretch of Highway 277 in just the last few months. Alcohol was not listed as a contributing factor in any of these accidents.

Once the 2014 records are available, a future issue of The Observer/Enterprise will focus more closely at the accident statistics within the Coke County borders.

In conversation with law enforcement and city and county officials, increased traffic and speed limits are contributing factors. All officials urge Coke County residents and travellers to use caution.

In addition to being a full-time mother, Jamie had a lifelong career as an educator. She taught for over 30 years at schools around the West Texas area including Hermleigh, Snyder, and Robert Lee. Her interest in journalism later inspired her to pioneer the Living Textbook, a program using newspapers as a classroom teaching tool. 
Texas Lions Camp offers campers a chance to try new activities and create long lasting friendships while developing greater self-esteem, independence, and most of all, they get to have FUN!





There is one big thing that sticks out about the God is Awesome Racing Team -- it's that family is a major part.

Nearly all of the drivers on the team, which features off-road "Trophy" Trucks, are members of the Beal family. Patriarch and the team's main financier Carty Beal leads a team that features his son, daughter, daughter-inlaw and granddaughters, along with close friends from Midland and other cities across Texas.

Heck, even the two guys that work on the machines are an uncle and nephew.

"It's absolutely heaven, for me," Carty said. "It's a true blessing to be able to do that. feature high suspensions and That's why we advertise on the large tires. The team added truck, 'God is Awesome' because another truck in 2011.

But it was in 2008 that they had a trophy truck in California and brought it back to Midland to get it ready to race.

"I had never seen it until six years ago," said Randy Wells, the team's crew chief who has worked for the Beals since 1992. "A guy in California had it, and oil prices went to nothing and they told me to bring the truck here and to finish it. I then went back to Arizona and got schooled on trophy trucks."

Wells, who has been working for Carty for 22 years, said the first few years the team ran races in Texas, in a regional series in different parts of the state and New Mexico.


Wells admitted the first few years were interesting as he got used to working on the highpowered off-road trucks that

"It's a big deal out there, there is all the (Bureau of Land Management) land, and there are races out there every week somewhere," Carl said. "There are lot of race teams, a lot of race trucks out there. We are going out there to race and everyone has trucks, and it's virtually equivalent to what we have."

And the draw for the racers is that they can race in long stretches of anywhere between 80 to more than 100 miles, and it offers plenty of excitement. The racers race against the clock and not other races during an event.

"When you can run 100 to 120 miles an hour across the desert, it's so cool," Carl said. "And you jump 30-40 feet high. It's so neat."

The team has three trucks, and is based out of a shop in West Midland, a few blocks off Wall Street. Wells, along with his nephew Greg, do much of the maintenance and work on the trucks in between races. And all of it is financed by Carty Beal. The team has no sponsors, three trucks competing prior to although Carl joked with the

recent dip in oil prices, they might be looking for some.

But even without sponsors, the team doesn't lack for anything. Wells said they have access to the same type of equipment larger teams have in the series, even without the same type of manpower.

Wells said, "they've got 10 guys on one truck, and we've got two, and I really think that's too much for those big teams. They just get in the way."

He said they have between four to six weeks between races, and after each race the trucks are torn down to the frame and rebuilt. It can be a time consuming process, but they've gotten used to it and Carty and Carl both said that Randy Wells, and Greg, are the linchpins to the whole operation.

He said Randy's meticulous preparation allowed them to finish races and be as competitive as they were this past season.

"Without them we wouldn't be there," Carty said. "You have to have a good machine when you start off that starting line or you will not finish. My motto is, if I'm going ot spend all the money to go all the way out there to Nevada, I want to finish the races."

Two trucks completed the full 2014 season in the 1400 or "Trick Truck Unlimited" class in the Best of Desert Series. The class has few rules for engines, chassis and tires, but does have stringent safety requirements.
