The 76th edition of the Coke County Junior Livestock Show was held this past weekend at the Sterling Lindsey Memorial Exhibition Building in Robert Lee. This year's show featured animals in the Market Lamb, Market Goat, Market Swine and Market Steer shows, but more importantly, many young exhibitors from around the county. In addition to increased entries, this year's show offered a class for Dorper Lambs.

The show began Friday with the Market Lamb Show. Garrett Knight showed the Grand Champion Lamb and Reserve Grand Champion Lamb honors went to Katlyn Reeves.

In Friday evening's Market Goat Show, Saige Busby took home the award for Grand Champion Goat with Katlyn Reeves stepping into the winners circle again for the Reserve Champion Goat.

On Saturday morning, Braylee Hood exhibited the Grand Champion Hog in this year's Market Swine Show. The

Reserve Grand Champion Hog was shown by Katlyn Reeves.

In the final division of competition, the Market Steer Show, 9 year old Brody Pitcock exhibited the Grand Champion Steer. The Reserve Grand Champion Steer was exhibited by James Roberts.

A delicious barbecue lunch was held at 12 noon, followed by the awards presentation and the Premium Sale.

Winning the Lamb Showmanship award was Garrett Knight. Saige Busby took home the Goat Showmanship award, with Moriah Royall earning the Swine Showmanship award.

Katlyn Reeves earned the Ralph Walker Memorial Top Hand Award and the Frank Percifull Overall Showmanship award.

Blaine Yanez was honored with the Clay Antilley Memorial Steer Showmanship award. Moriah Royall was named the McCutchen Ranch Top Hand. This award (formerly the Alderman-Cave Top Hand) is



presented to a Junior or Senior exhibitor, alternating between Bronte and Robert Lee students, who have assisted with the show and exhibited an exceptional work ethic. The winner is chosen by the two ag teachers.

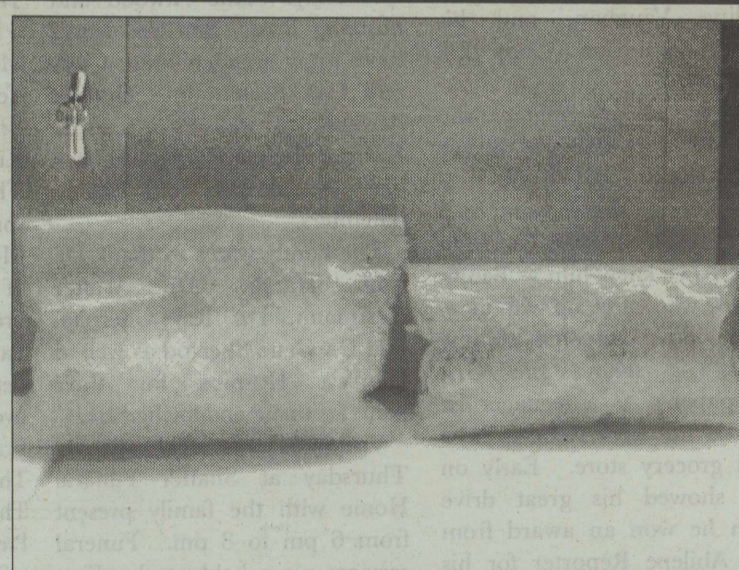
Traffic Stop leads to confiscation of drugs and weapons

Following the policy of increased traffic patrols on US Highway 277 north of Bronte, Coke County Deputy Sheriff Russell Johnson stopped a vehicle last Tuesday afternoon to issue a speeding violation. In the course of his interaction with the driver, Johnson requested to search the

vehicle. Deputy Terry Crenshaw arrived to assist with the search.

The search produced 44 grams of methamphetamine, marijuana, pills, scales, numerous weapons, and cash. The driver, a Coke County resident, and his passenger were taken into custody.

Chief Deputy Brandon Neal, along with TPWD wardens, recovered this ATV near Tennyson last week. The ATV was stolen from a hunting camp near the Coke/Sterling county line and reported to the Sterling County Sheriff's Office.

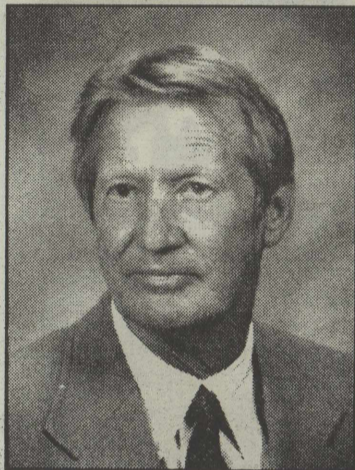

Bessent

Ben Bessent was born December 22, 1936, in San Angelo, Texas, to parents Charlie W. Bessent and Lou Ella Bilbo Bessent. He died on January 13, 2015.

His family lived in Robert Lee, Texas, and upon graduation from Robert Lee High School in 1955, Ben attended San Angelo College and Odessa College.

He was married to Mary Angeline Vaughan on July 8, 1956.

He was preceded in death by his parents, two brothers, Bobby Joe and Charles Bessent, his parents-in-law Robert and Pauline Vaughan, and his beloved grandson, Cody Bill Bessent.

Ben was an entrepreneur who began his work career at the age of six, washing dishes at a local café where he had to stand on a box to reach the sink. People in Robert Lee knew him as Benny, the boy who came up with ideas like selling snow cones, shining shoes, or selling the Grit newspaper. As a teenager he worked for Earl Roberts in a local grocery store. Early on Ben showed his great drive when he won an award from The Abilene Reporter for his high percentage of paper sales. Ben was definitely a people person and a salesman. He began working for Vaughan Chevrolet in 1954, and Robert Vaughan became his mentor and later his father-in-law. They developed a close and lasting bond until Robert's death in 1998.

After Ben and Mary married, they moved to Odessa where he worked for Bronco Chevrolet and attended Odessa Jr. College. In 1958, he went to work for Mobil Oil Co. on a seismograph crew and lived in

McAllister, Oklahoma, and Liberal, Kansas, during that time. He returned to the car business in 1959, taking a job with Mustang Chevrolet in San Angelo. In 1968, Ben and Mary returned to Robert Lee, became partners in Vaughan Chevrolet, and when Robert retired, Ben became the sole owner of the dealership.

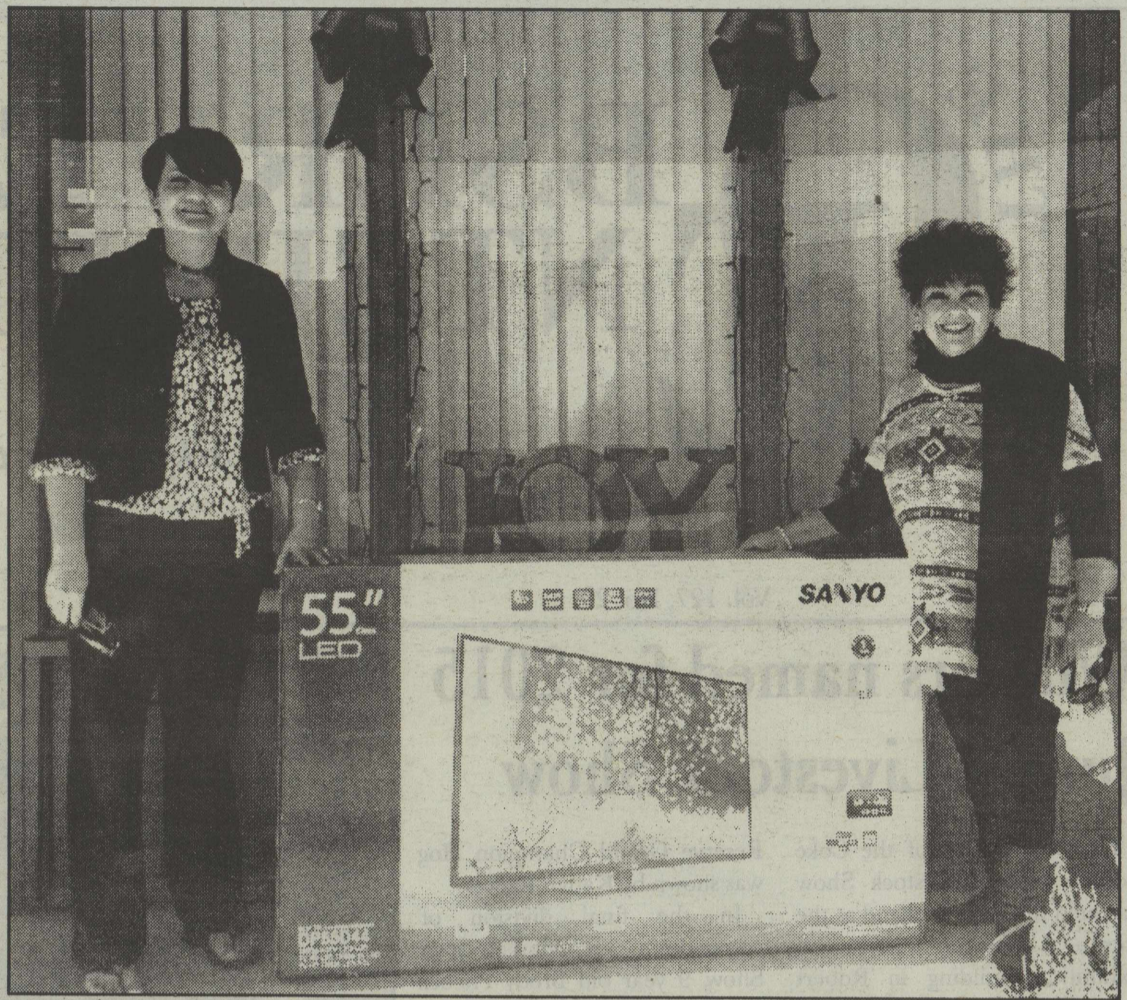
In 2004, Ben Bessent Chevrolet was sold, and Ben retired. After three weeks of retirement, Ben said, "No, retirement is not for me." So Ben's good friend, Mike Mitchell of Mitchell Buick/GMC gave Ben the opportunity to continue the career he loved where he could sell cars, see old friends, make new friends, and have a great time.

Ben lived his life with intensity, giving 150% of his energy to everything he loved, which included his family, his friends, his work, and barbeques at the pool. In fact, he always said, "I want everybody to know that I had more fun than anyone! And I played Pebble Beach!"

Ben is survived by his wife of 58 years, Mary, his children Craig and Lisa Gilstrap Bessent, Randy and Cindy Ash Bessent, and Lisa Myers. Ben also leaves three grandchildren, B.J. Bessent and wife Rachel, Katie Bessent, and Shaye Anne Atwood and husband Ross. Ben also leaves three great-grandchildren, Cody and Cali Bessent and Hudson Atwood, as well as a cousin, Katrina Hallmark, who has been like one of Ben and Mary's daughters.

The Current and Future state of EMS in Coke County

Coke County has had No expense for EMS services, unlike most or all other Counties in TEXAS.

Most Counties in the Concho Valley, are responsible for providing EMS services and have at least a Paid administrator. Some Counties pay their volunteers by the ambulance run. Other Counties contract with surrounding counties, cities, or private firms to provide EMS service in all or parts of the county. The County has access to compensation funds (unpaid services) that are not available to 501 C 3, non profits.

Coke County currently has two 501 c3, Volunteer services, West Coke County EMS (WCCEMS) and East Coke County Ambulance Service (ECCAS) at no cost to the county. Blackwell is supposed to cover from the 70/277 split, but does not and only is available occasionally from 6 pm to 6 am.

Both are funded by insurance or Medicare/Medicaid and some

monies that flow through DSHS to the Regional Trauma Council, then to EMS (generally less that \$6,000 to \$7,000 to be shared by the Coke County services).

The value of the ECCAS ambulance (2003 model) and equipment is approximately \$150,000, not including depreciation. The volunteer hours exceed 1000 per year (worth in Excess of \$100,000). We have 14 certified people on the service, of which four work extended periods out of state, one works for the Abilene Fire Department, and one who lives and works out of town. So we typically get 3-4 volunteers carrying the workload.... The state requires 2 for any ambulance run. All but three volunteers are over the age of 60, some have been on the service for more than 30 years. All are tired and would like to retire. At some point, they will.

In the past 12 years, Bronte has hosted four training classes. Robert Lee, none. We have trained a few for Robert Lee, but only two have ever made the

service. Robert Lee now has two certified individuals to staff the WCCEMS ambulance. ECCAS is putting on a class for Robert Lee beginning next month. Both Nursing Homes, funded

in part by Hospital District taxes, are required to have an EMS service to be able to transport some patients to a hospital...No EMS, there may be no nursing homes.

It has always been the opinion of the County that they can't afford EMS. They may not be able to, and the current situation may not last many more years.

'Last chance' CEU training set for Feb. 3

Submitted by Morgan Runyan Texas AgriLife Extension Agent The Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service office in Tom Green County will offer their annual "Last Chance" Continuing Education Unit Course from 12:30 - 6:15 pm February 3 at the Texas A&M AgriLife Research and Extension Center. The center is north of San Angelo on U.S. Highway 87.

Five Texas Department of Agriculture credits will be available: one in the integrated pest management category, two general, one in laws and regulations, and one in drift minimization.

"The training is called the last chance course because it's the last time our office will offer Texas Department of Agriculture continuing education units before

the Feb. 28 deadline," said Josh Blank, AgriLife Extension agent in Tom Green County. "All private applicator license holders must earn 15 continuing education units in specific categories over the five-year period their license is valid. Older licenses renew on Feb. 28, though more recently issued licenses renew on the anniversary of the date they were originally issued."

Blank said attendees are reminded to bring their pesticide license or pesticide number with them to the training to ensure proper continuing education credit as a driver's license number alone will no longer suffice.

"This course is not meant to simply earn the participants their needed CEUs, it's also meant to provide area and regional-specific educational information useful not only to agricultural

producers, but to homeowners as well."

Topics and presenters will include:

- Pest Control Around the Home and Barn, Dr. Charles Allen, AgriLife Extension entomologist, San Angelo.

- Herbicide Modes of Action, James Jackson, AgriLife Extension program specialist, Stephenville.

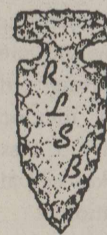
- Pesticide Laws and Regulations, Cory Pence, Texas Department of Agriculture, San Angelo.

- Drift Minimization and Equipment Calibration, Dr. Billy Warrick, AgriLife Extension agronomist, retired, San Angelo.

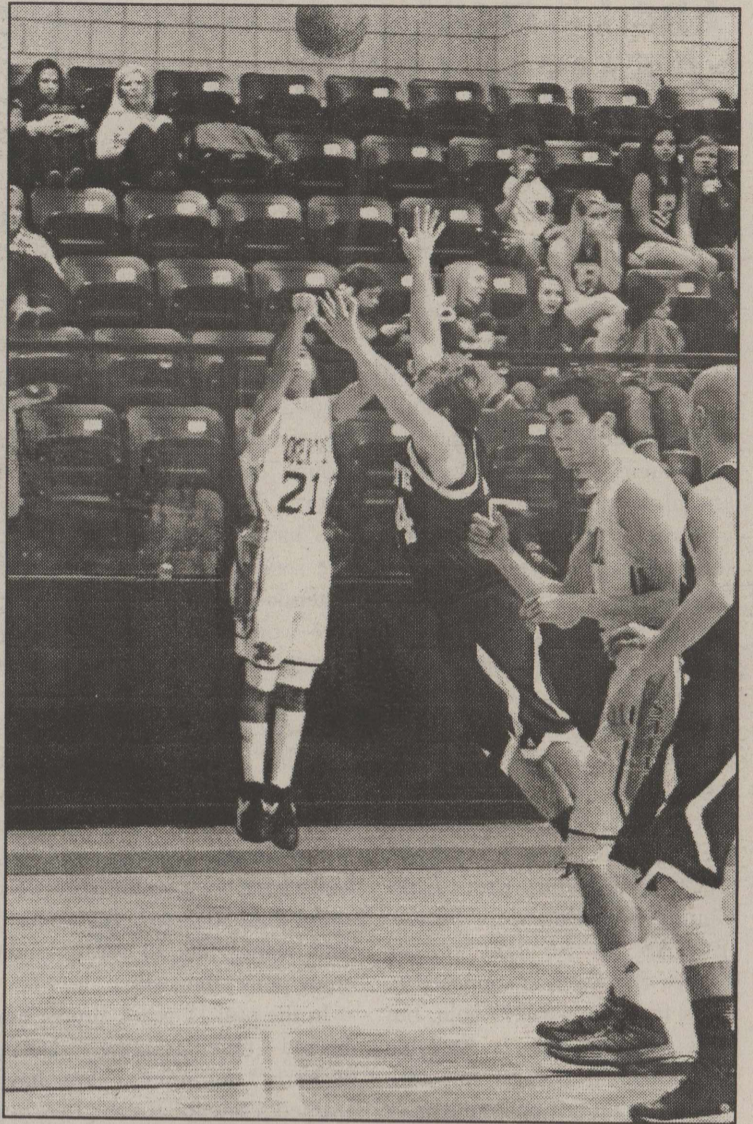

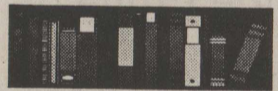

Bronte ISD Board minutes posted

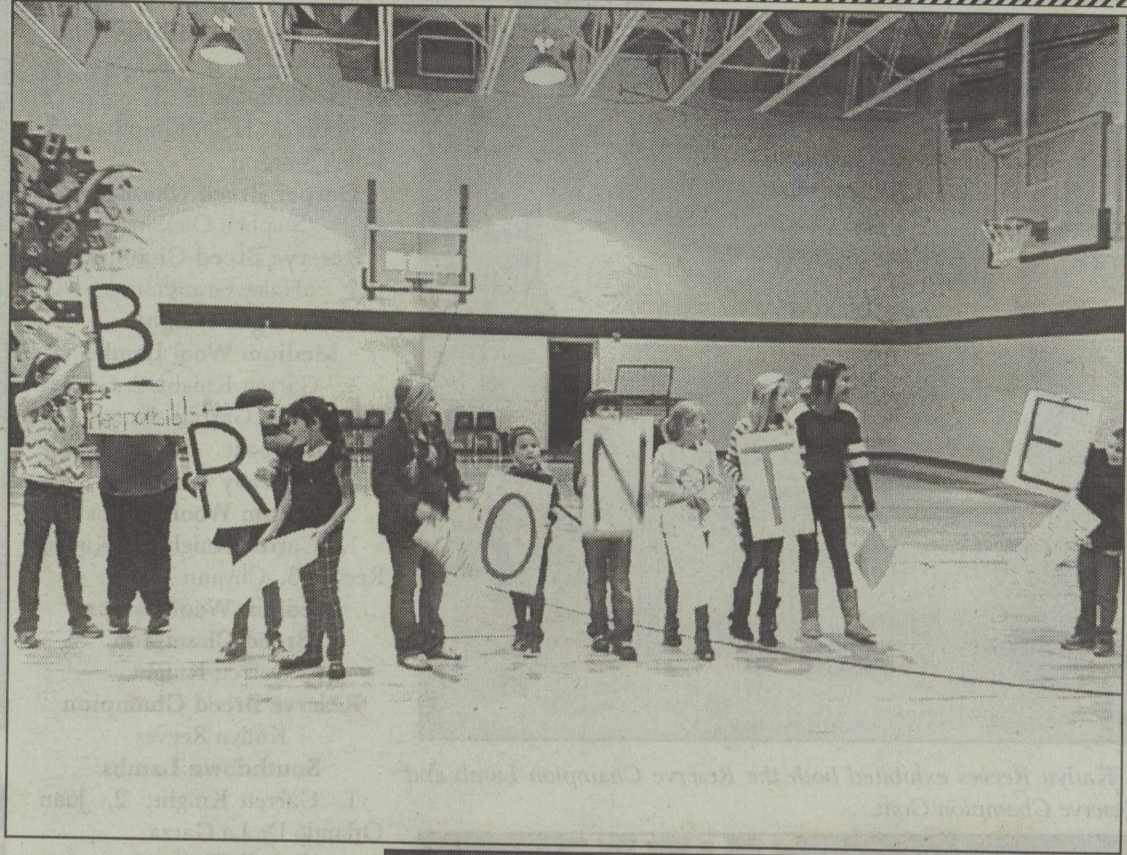
