Resolution approved by Commissioners

requesting changes on US Highway 277 Resolution Commissioners requesting changes on Hwy 277

voted Tuesday, February 24, 2015, on a resolution to lower the speed limit on US Highway (both north toward Abilene and south toward San Angelo). The resolution also addresses the safety signage, or lack thereof, on the curves on this section of roadway.

Coke County Commissioners, along with the City of Bronte, have no power to make any changes along this federal roadway. However, they may send this resolution as a request to Texas Department of Transportation. The process begins with the TxDOT District Engineer in San Angelo and will make its way to TxDOT's governing board in Austin. It will be this board's decision to make any changes to safety features or speed limits.

Several East Coke County


approved by citizens were in attendance for the Commissioners meeting due to this resolution. In their Coke County Commissioners discussion with the Court, it was noted that an increased law enforcement presence was needed in this area. They 277 for the three mile stretch agreed that the Sheriff's Office from Bronte in each direction and the Precinct 2 Constable were very active, but noted the absence of a Texas Department of Public Safety Trooper for extended periods. Coke County Judge Roy Blair explained that Coke County only had a Trooper for a couple of weeks each month and that soon she will be transferring. Sheriff Wayne McCutchen reported that there has not been a time set for a replacement Trooper to be stationed in Coke County.



Texas Brigades taught me numerous life lessons and helped me develop remarkable public speaking and excellent problem solving skills."

This will be the 23rd year of the Brigades. The Texas Brigades program is seeking 170 first-class youth leaders. The application deadline is March 16, 2015 and may be found at http://www.texasbrigades.org/ Applications/applications.html.

Participants are selected through competitive application process. Helen Holdsworth, Executive Director, says they are looking for youth ages 13-17 years of age. 
